Banner and Athletic Trophy Policy

Policy Statement All team banners and trophy displays for athletic teams shall meet all of the following criteria:

- 1. Banners: Every sport offered at Sayre School shall have a post-season achievement banner hanging from the rafters or wall in the school's gymnasium. All banners are to be displayed together on the same rafter (or wall) until a lack of space requires an additional area of the gym to be used. District and Regional championships and runner-up will be recognized by title and year under the sports heading. Individual sports will list regional winners, runner-up, and state qualifiers. Boy's and girl's teams that qualify for the state basketball sweet sixteen will have a separate banner. A team that wins a state championship will receive a larger banner in the shape of Kentucky with the championship year listed of all players, managers, and coaches. Individual state championships will be recognized with separate banner from the team banner and list their name, event, and year of the championship (i.e. track and field). In addition, basketball will have a separate banner for boy's and girl's 1,000 point club. Both banners will be equitable in size and design and placed on each side of the wall behind team benches.
- 2. Awards and Trophies: All trophy cases in the gym lobby shall display all female and male KHSAA district, regional, and state winners and runner-up for all sports. Trophy and cases located inside the school building will display all other trophies of all sports.

Banquet/Recognition Events Policy

Policy Statement

All banquets and Recognition events shall adhere to the following Criteria:

- 1. Every team shall sponsor or be part of an awards ceremony for the student athletes at the end of each season.
- 2. Award ceremonies shall take place within 4 weeks of the end of the final game/match of the season.
- 3. It is recommended that invitations be sent out to the Director of Athletics, Head of School and Upper School Administration, Communications Director, Players, Families and any other people who were part of that season, such as Cheerleaders, scorekeepers and announcers.
- 4. An effort should be made to make these events meaningful along with the presentation of awards.
- 5. Parents must pay all expenses for a meal or facility rental. The cost should not be prohibitive for parents and families.
- 6. The suggested time limit for a team sports banquet and ceremony should not exceed two (2) hours.
- 7. The School provides space for all female and male athletic teams to use the schools dinning hall to conduct banquets each season. All banquets must be approved by the Director of Athletics.

RULES OF PROCEDURE FOR THE SAYRE SCHOOL ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME

PURPOSE: The Sayre School Athletic Hall of Fame is sponsored by the Alumni Affairs Office and under the direction of a Hall of Fame committee as described below. The purpose of the Hall of Fame is to honor/recognize individual athletes, teams, or coaches that have made a significant contribution to the school by their participation in the school's athletic program.

A

COMMITTEE: The members of the Hall of Fame committee include the Alumni Affairs Office, the Athletic Director, the Assistant Director of Athletics, and an active member of the Sayre faculty/staff.

CLAUSE: If this group does not constitute a total of five members, i.e. the Alumni Affairs office has one coordinator instead of two, another current faculty member will join the committee.

NOMINATION CRITERIA:

Nominations may include any individual, graduate or non-graduate, who distinguished Sayre School, Sayre athletics, and themselves through their athletic achievements is eligible for nomination in to the Athletic Hall of Fame. Individuals must have attended Sayre for at least two years.

Nominees have reflected the values of the school during their tenure at Sayre. The Hall of Fame will also recognize coaches and/or staff members who served the school and its students.

Individuals or teams may be nominated 4 years after graduation from high school. Up to 3 members will be inducted each year.

A team is considered one nomination.

TIMING FOR THE NOMINATIONS:

Selection committee meets in March.

Email notification will be sent to all alumni in April for nominations.

Nominations will be accepted until May 31 of that year.

Two committee meetings will follow during the summer.

Voting will take place in August.

September 1st is the deadline for the decision on the inductees.

A notification email to all alumni will follow in November/December that includes information for the induction ceremony.

INDUCTION CEREMONY:

The Induction ceremony will take place at Homecoming.

Ceremony will be at halftime of the first game, either the $1^{\rm st}$ or $2^{\rm nd}$ Friday in January, depending on the calendar.

Athletic Hall of Fame presenter will be the Athletic Director.

A reception will follow in Old Sayre.

Rich then gave of summary of summer activities and what had taken place in terms of athletics at Sayre during the summer months. Sayre's athletic program is growing and moving forward in all areas and at all times.

Fall Sports Review - Sayre had 4 Boys teams (Boys XC, Boys golf, Boys Soccer JV/V)

Sayre Girls had a total of 6 teams (Girls XC, Girls golf, Girls Soccer JV/V, Girls Volleyball JV/V)

Total number of participants - Sayre had 50 Male athletes and 74 female athletes. Females do have 2 more teams than their male counterparts and this accounts for the difference in the numbers.

Coaches and Salaries – Each team, with the exception of Girls soccer and golf had both one head coach and one assistant coach. Girls soccer had 2 assistants and one head while golf (whose coaches coach both boys and girls had 2 assistants as well)

Overall total salaries for Female coaches is slightly higher than males due to more teams.

Expenses showed that Female sports spent slightly higher than Males primarily due to the cost of new volleyball uniforms.

Travel expenses were slightly higher for girls as well because of the extra sport and the Girls soccer team travelled a bit more than the boys this year.

Rich mentioned that the Winter Sports had already started and numbers looked to have increased in Winter sports as well.

The winter conditioning program open to all athletes was in progress as well.

Rich announce the addition of Lexie Blackburn, current 8th grader, to the committee and replace Kate Christensen who is graduating. The committee welcomes Lexie and looks forward to working with her and wishes Kate good luck as she moves to a new chapter in her life at Vanderbilt.

Rich went over the report of Spring Sports -

Increase in total number of teams as we have added a JV boys tennis this year. There are 6 Spring Boys teams -2 of which are JV (Baseball and Tennis) There are 4 Girls teams -1 of which is JV (Tennis).

There has been an increase in the number of boys overall from 57-84 but the majority of these are middle schoolers. It is still good to show an increase. There was a slight decrease in numbers for girls from 49-43 but that could be that many 7^{th} and 8^{th} grade girls played varsity lacrosse last year and are playing only on the Middle School Level this year. Next year we should see these numbers rise again.

The number of coaches has increase by 2 but both are unpaid positions.

Baseball has 5 coaches this year – 1 as a volunteer.

Lacrosse (boys) dropped from 3-2 coaches this year and seems to be working very well for them.

Tennis has one new volunteer coach who works with both the boys and girls programs.

All other programs retain the same number of coaches.

There has been an increase in salaries for some of the new coaches based on the commitment to bring in top notch coaches for all sports. The Lacrosse coaches (boys and girls) and the baseball coach are some of the best in their field in their respective sports and it is great to have them at Sayre.

The travel portion of the report is still being tabulated as season are not over and with the weather we have had this spring we did not want to jump the run. Final numbers will be available in the end of the year report.

Rich mentioned again the Manager Program and would it be worthwhile to offer this to the student body. The types of opportunities available are varied and Rich will present the program to the Student body on May 2nd and again in the fall. Students will have

the opportunity to intern with any program or the athletic department in general.

Rich also mentioned the projects that have been ongoing -

- New lockers at the SAC one boy one girl (Locker rooms facing the baseball field) with open lockers and hanging options for equipment and uniforms.
- Weight Room renovation for more practical space use
- New art work on walls in weight room
- New Padding on walls in gym with new Spartan head logo
- Purchase of a multi-use trailer
- Completion of new fields by fall
- Moving of current main field scoreboard and placement of new scoreboard for main field
- Addition of football program and the benefits of it for athletics in general

Rich asked if there was anything we could do better?

Banquets were discussed and Rich agreed we would be have a Season Banquet for all teams in a particular season. Sayre Parents Association would be helping with that

It was noted that creating more visibility with signage in Upper School and gymnasium will help increase awareness and community spirit

Transportation Criteria

The criteria for transportation is as follows:

We have 2 on campus modes of transportation and the option for one off campus that are available to all teams.

Sayre has 2 Sprinters - Sprinters can hold 11 individuals PLUS the driver for a total of 12 people. Teams of 11 or less or 22 or less (both Sprinters) will be sent in sprinters with Drivers who are on the approved drivers list. It is the hope that all coaches will be on the approved drivers list, but if they are not approved by our insurance company, they will not be added to the list.

Buses – Sayre has 2 buses which will take groups larger than 22 players and will be driven to away contests. A sprinter may follow the bus to allow the bus driver to return to school and the sprinter would bring home anyone needing a ride back to Sayre after a contest. This is always approved by the coach if the option is chosen.

Transportation is provided by Sayre for all AWAY contests OUTSIDE Fayette Co.

Meal per diem – Sayre does not provide any per diem for any sports at any time. If a team stops for meals it is the player's responsibility to pay for their own meal.

OR

Lodging per diem — In the same vein, Sayre does not provide a per diem for lodging for trips that are overnight. Any accommodations are the responsibility of the player and their family and are paid in advance of the trip.
