The Eagle Club pays for all bars, letters, pins, and certificates that are awarded to the athletes. The athletic Director orders thes awards based on an inventory check of what is on hand. Each coach presents a list of awards to the athletic director who then orders them through the athletic department.

The Eagle Club provides \$10/shirt for each member on the postseason roster for district winning teams, \$50/jacket for each member on the postseason roster for region winning teams, and \$100/ring for state championship winning teams. These awards are team awards or individual sports such as track or wrestling.

Awards are presented to the teams at the end of the year recognition such as a banquet, dinner, or get together of the team by the members and parents.

Awards banners stating the year won shall be paid for by the athletic department and hung in the gym. This includes, conference, district, and regional championships. Conference championship teams have pictures in the gym hall provided by the NKAC. Any individual banners (regional champs, state runner-ups, or state champions are the responsibility of the team.

Mr. and Miss Eagle is an award for a senior athlete. The athlete must have played two sports for three years. He or she must be in the top half of the class rank. A coach will nominate any deserving, eligible senior in their sport's season. The athletes of that season will vote for the winner of the fall, winter, and spring season. Those six students, three girls and three boys will receive a plaque at senior brunch. Those six individuals will then be voted on by the the head coaches to see who is the Mr. Miss Eagle for the year. The male and female with the highest vote totals will be placed on the banner in the gym.

Coach of Year awards will be placed on the banner in the gym for any coach that is voted coach of the year by the NKAC or region, the local sports association, the state association, or a media outlet.

The Hall of Fame will induct six male and six female athletes every two years. In order to me inducted the athlete must have graduated from Scott, be nominated by someone other than themself, and be elected in the top five by the previous Hall of Fame members and current or previous head coaches at Scott. There will be one male and female member that is elected solely by coaches. That member will have had to have been out of school for 20 years or longer. The current and past athletic director will also elect coaches or founders, non athletic personnel that have had an impact on Scott High School. There will be no more that one of each elected every two years. All members of the Hall of Fame will be put on a plaque in the hall by the gym and listed on the Scott High School Alumni Association website.

Travel and Per Diem

All teams, except golf, tennis, and bowling are transported by Kenton County buses or approved charter bus transportation. Charter bus transportation is for postseason events where teams play more than 125 miles away and they play the same day. Golf, tennis, and bowling are not able to be transported by Kenton County buses because their matches start early and buses are not back from their after school runs. These sports transport their teams through a group of parents after signing a waiver from the Kenton County School District. Athletes are not permitted to drive themselves to athletic contests. All overnight trips must be approved by the Kenton County Board of Education. Costs of the trips (housing and meals) are the responsibility of the teams themselves through fundraising efforts. If meals are purchased by the teams cost should be kept under \$7 a person for breakfast,, \$10 for lunch, and \$15 for dinner. Hotel rooms need to be kept under \$130 per room. Hotels should also have enclosed hallways for safety. If possible hotels should have complimentary breakfasts.
