Scores were tallied by the coaches to determine who would be on the squad. A cut off score was determined according to the point spread of all the scores. Those scoring above the breakpoint made the squad.

Squad attends all home and away football games. Squad attends all home games for girls and boys basketball, and 90% of all away games for boys and girls basketball.

Varsity Cheer Squad

The mascot is a team by team decision and is available to all teams. The dance team holds tryouts to determine who is on the team. They perform at boy's basketball home games, which is approximately 5 times a year. They don't perform at football games due to the band performing at half time.
