Before tryouts a two to three day clinic is conducted in which the candidates are taught a floor cheer and dance. The tryouts are judged by outside judges and the coaches. The candidates are scored on the cheer, dance, jumps and tumbling. Also added to their score is the score they receive from teacher recommendations. The highest scoring individuals make the team.

4. How is each cheerleading squad assigned to home and away athletic contests? Include football as well as boys' and girls' basketball (and any other sport) at the varsity and junior varsity levels. Include any rotation plans or alternating game assignments that your squads follow.

The team cheers at all home games and most away games. During basketball season they travel to all away double headers. If there are more than two games a week the team is divided in half and each half cheers two games. The team when divided is not divided in ability, but in stunt groups.

5. Name any squad(s) that takes part in competitive cheerleading events.
