			Sign ups for girls' volleyball were held in January. 52 high school students in grades 9-11 signed up indicating they are interested in playing high school volleyball. In March, a meeting was held with girls interested in participating in volleyball. 17 girls showed up for this meeting.
			The athletic director has also contacted companies about the cost of equipment and uniforms, has run an analysis on transportation cost and has had a cost estimate for preparing the gym for volleyball completed. In February the AD presented information to the board of education providing statistics on interest and costs for implementing the program.
			The AD also contacted 15 schools to determine if they could add Webster County to their 05-06 schedule. Only 7 schools responded; however, only 3 of those can schedule an 05-06 match. The high school SBDM has decided not to offer the program in 05/06, but has agreed to revisit in the fall.

Soccer practices were moved to the high school campus for the Fall 2004 season; however, matches continued to be played at the Sebree field. In December 2004, the board of education approved the construction of a soccer field at the school's Clark Complex located adjacent to the high school. In January 2005 dirt work began with the hope that the field will be ready for the 2005 season **Board minutes reflecting the approval of this project are attached with this report. Although the facility will have no lights the first season, it is hoped that by the 2007 season, lights will be in place.
