Bowling teams were added for the 2010-11 school year. Student surveys show a slight interest in Bass Fishing and Archery. Bourbon County should continue to assess interests in these KHSAA sport offerings.
Equipment and Supplies	Х		The quality and quantity of uniforms for practice and games appears to be comparable for both male and female teams. A written policy is followed for review and purchase of new uniforms which shows equitable rotation.
			Information submitted on the 2010-2011 and 2011-2012 Annual Report forms T-35 and T-36, showed a difference in spending for male and female athletes in Equipment and Supplies. Expenditures for equipment and supplies are outside the commonly accepted parameters for parity.

The boys' basketball teams have two separate locker rooms that have been renovated and updated recently with a large screen television. The girls' locker room consists of a
		single room with older carpet and a much smaller television.
		The renovations of the out door complex have been completed. The football field has new turf and lights. Both baseball and softball appear to have comparable facilities with fencing, lights, scoreboards, and dugouts.
		Soccer facilities are located approximately two
		miles from the Bourbon County High School at a local elementary school. It appears to be an excellent facility that is equitable for both males and females.

Medical and Training Facilities and Services	X	Bourbon County has one athletic trainer provided by the Lexington Clinic. The trainer is at the school every afternoon and available to all athletes. The training room located behind the school near the band room is accessible to all athletes. The weight room is located in the field house and well equipped with free weights and machines for both male and females. There was not written evidence of a schedule for use of the weight room or batting facility by male and female athletes.

Publicity		A community-sponsored poster for all fall sports schedules was printed. A comparable poster will

	X		be provided for winter and spring sport seasons. Bourbon County High School has one cheerleading squad that will cheer for both male and female basketball games.
Support Services		X	The Athletic Director and Administration indicated there were two Athletic Booster Clubs at Bourbon County High School for football and boys' soccer. Neither booster club had a signed agreement on file at the school or in the Title IX file. The football has a separate banking account outside the school. There was no written evidence that they must have administrative approval for purchases or expenditures. Upon further review, the total athletic spending appears to be outside the acceptable parameters for the provision of parity when the percentage of expenditures is compared with the percentage of participation. Notification of this was documented on the T-65 form in 2010-11 and again 2011-12. Administrative monitoring and an Improvement Plan need to be implemented to ensure equitable provision of benefits. 6. Observed Deficiencies in Overall Girls and Boys Athletics Programs

There was an observed deficiency in the area of Support Services at Bourbon County High School this Title IX visit. Overall spending for at least the last two years has fallen outside the acceptable parameters for parity.

7. KHSAA Recommended Action in relation to new deficiencies

School administration, the Athletic Director and the Gender Equity Review Committee should evaluate the spending practices of all athletic teams and determine the areas where there is a disparity with other sports teams. Information found on the T-35 and T-36 form submitted for 2011-12 to the KHSAA in the benefit areas of equipment/supplies and travel should be examined.

Although there were no deficiencies observed in some areas, the following recommendations should be addressed by the athletic director, school administrators, and Gender Equity Review Committee to insure overall equivalency.:

- a. Upon receipt of this report, schedules for <u>ALL</u> shared facilities should be developed that insures equitable access to all teams involved. Those schedules should be posted at each facility site. Copies of the schedules should be submitted to KHSAA by <u>January</u> 15, 2013.
- b. The GEC should review travel and per diem policies covered in the Field Trip Handbook, Coaches Handbook, and other Board of Education written guidelines. All information directly pertaining to athletics should be incorporated into one document establishing parameters for spending on travel and per diem and placed into the Title IX permanent file. A copy of this policy should be submitted to KHSAA by <u>January 15, 2013</u>.
- c. Upon receipt of this report, post a schedule for the sharing of the gymnasium facilities. Locker room assignments should be made that gives access to all sponsored teams.
- d. Upon receipt of this report, post the athletic trainer's schedule and practice location at the training room. Contact information (phone number and/or e-mail address) should be posted.
- e. Upon receipt of this report, school administrators and the Gender Equity Review Committee should develop guidelines regarding fund raising activities relative to Booster Clubs with outside bank accounts. This document should be presented to all Booster Clubs acting under the name of Bourbon County High School. This document should also take into consideration the financial guidelines as set forth by the Redbook. Signed copies should be submitted to KHSAA by January 15, 2013.
