It was suggested that the school adopt a rotation policy for the replacement and purchase of new uniforms.

5. Brief Summary/Analysis of The Corrective Action Plan (T-60)

The school has an aggressive Corrective Action Plan. Some of the objectives have already been accomplished and some will need to go to the school board for their approval and support. The school has increased student participation and added coaches for junior and freshman programs. The school personnel are presently dealing with the shortage of storage and locker space. The development of a new field house has been proposed but will need board approval and support. The field house would increase locker and storage space.

6. Observed Deficiencies in Overall Girls and Boys Athletics Programs

There is a shortage of locker and storage space. There is also a lack of a certified trainer for sports where injury may be more prevalent. The absence of a certified trainer is not an equity issue however it may be an issue of liability.

The school has nice outdoor facilities, none of which belong to the school district except the football stadium. With the school not having their own facilities it greatly reduces the ability to control practice sessions or collect gate admission.

7. Facility Recommendations or Concerns

Some adjustments must be made to add storage and locker accommodations for a growing athletic program.
