Accommodation of Interests and Abilities	X		The school did not pass any of the 3 opportunities tests in 1999-2000 or 2000-2001. However, this satisfactory evaluation is because they did pass Test 3 by adding volleyball in 2001-2002. The school was instructed to monitor the three prong test closely each year, and to survey the students properly.  Forms T-2 and T-4 are incomplete.		
Equipment and Supplies	X		The school's equipment and supplies appear to be adequate. Some uniforms were counted by sets rather than an actual per-piece-of-apparel count as the report requested. School personnel were urged to develop a written policy for the replacement of uniforms.  Form T-6 needs necessary corrections made in red ink.  The summary and team charts do not appear to be accurate.		
Scheduling of Games and Practice Time	X		Practice and game schedules have been adjusted where coaches indicated there was a problem. While the school has not reached 50% of "prime time" games for girls' basketball, they have shown improvement each year from 18% to 28%. School personnel should continue to develop increased "prime time" opportunities for girls' basketball.  The summary and team charts are inaccurate.  Some team reports were not identified.		
Travel and Per Diem Allowances	X		Transportation is not provided for either boys' or girls' programs to off-campus practice sites.  Team report and summary report are consistent.		
Coaching	X		There appears to be a salary discrepancy in a coaching position dealing with girls' and boys' basketball. Any changes in the salary schedule should be documented. The way it is listed on the report reflects an inequity. The report indicates that all of the softball coaches work		

		off-campus, as well as all of the baseball coaches.					
Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities	X	Take a look at the dressing room for soccer. There are some inconsistencies. Privacy need to be provided in locker room restrooms where doors are missing. It is recommend that a temporary fence be purchased for the softbal field to assure that girls experience hitting more home runs.  Some forms in this area were incomplete.					
Medical and Training Facilities and Services	X	Some forms in this area were incomplete.  The KHSAA Audit Staff suggests that school personnel post a schedule in the weight root and that the school purchase weights are development that is user-friendly for the fema athletes.					
Publicity	X	The school has two squads that cheer at boys' and girls' games on an equal basis.  All the questions on Form T-33 were not answered. Form T-33 is incomplete.  Forms T-32 and T-33 are not consistent.

Varsity basketball and soccer schedules are being changed to assure "prime time" play. School personnel are addressing the problems in the opportunities section of the report.

#### 6. Observed Deficiencies in Overall Girls and Boys Athletics Programs

School personnel do not provide transportation to its off-campus facilities for its athletes. This is not an equity issue, but could be a liability issue.
