Comments: DuPont Manuel High School is offering all of the KHSAA sanctioned sports as well as Field Hockey, and Lacrosse, with plans for a future Ice Hockey team. The school also offers seven junior varsity teams and four freshmen teams for males and females. The return rate for the 2007-2008 Student Interest Survey was 94% which is well above the KHSAA requested return rate of 80%.

Accommodation of Interests and Abilities	X		<p>According to the information supplied by the school, DuPont Manuel High School has met the standard established for Test 3 during the 2007-2008 school year. The possibility of meeting the standards for all the tests each year was discussed during the Gender Equity Committee Meeting. The need to meet the standard for one test each year was also addressed at the meeting. The 2007-2008 Student Interest Survey showed student interest in additional levels of teams for tennis and golf plus a new ice hockey team. Since there will not be a survey conducted in 2008-2009, the school should use the current 2007-2008 survey for assessing student athletic interest. This assessment should be included on the T-3 and T-60 forms for the 2008-2009 Annual Report due April 15, 2009.</p> <p>The school's Permanent Title IX File was in good shape. The major item missing was Gender Equity Committee Meeting minutes. Minutes should be taken for every meeting and kept in the Permanent Title IX File. The first on site visit by the KHSAA occurred in 2000. Since that time, the KHSAA has requested schools produce a number of guidelines/policies for Title IX equity and school documentation. The school was prepared with most of these items. After discussion with the Athletic Director and the Gender Equity Committee, the KHSAA Audit Team requested the school address needed guidelines and revisit some of their policies with intent to expand them so they would be more inclusive.</p>
Equipment and Supplies	X		<p>Review of the uniforms during the Revisit showed equivalence for the male and female team uniforms. The school does not have a written uniform replacement policy/guideline. The students interviewed were satisfied with their current uniforms. The Athletic Director and Gender Equity Committee should work with the booster clubs to produce a uniform replacement guideline/policy that will</p>

<p>Equipment and Supplies Cont'd</p>		<p>insure equity for all teams. The school should take into account the various reasons some teams need more than one uniform while others do not. This document should reflect what is necessary for gender equity at this time.</p> <p>According to the information on the 2007-2008 Annual Report the school spent approximately \$208 per female and \$330 per male in this benefit area. On the T-41 Checklist for 2007-2008 the school gave an advantage to the boys' program in this area. This was addressed on the T-60 Corrective Action Plan. This benefit can quickly become inequitable and therefore it is recommended the Gender Equity Committee monitor spending for equipment and supplies each year.</p> <p>The need for more storage areas for female sports was mentioned after the first on site visit. At this time the storage was adequate with a storage assignment list available. The storage space assignment sheet should be updated to include field hockey and lacrosse.</p>
<p>Scheduling of Games and Practice Time</p>	<p>X</p>	<p>DuPont Manuel High School met the required Prime Dates and Prime Times for the 2007-2008 school year. As of November 24, 2008 the school was meeting the requirements for 2008-2009. The basketball schedule will be checked again after the final game of the regular season to determine compliance in this benefit area for 2008-2009.</p> <p>The school had schedules for both practice and games at all facilities except outdoor practice areas. The current schedules should be expanded to include a usage schedule for outdoor practice facilities.</p> <p>The first on site visit showed a problem with field hockey practice times on University of Louisville's campus. That has been eliminated with the completion of the field hockey facility at the high school. The Revisit forms showed the baseball team had eight more games than softball. The Athletic Director should monitor the schedules and determine the cause for differences then work with the coaches to eliminate differences when appropriate.</p>

<p>Travel and Per Diem Allowances</p>	<p>X</p>		<p>The school administration and Gender Equity Committee should review the travel and per diem policy which should include all methods of transportation used by athletic teams, and meals provided to athletic teams pre and post competitions during the entire season. Any changes should be approved by the appropriate school or district personnel. When this document is completed, a copy should be given to each head coach, booster club president, and one kept in the Permanent Title IX File.</p>
<p>Coaching</p>	<p>X</p>		<p>An explanation of pay scales for the various coaching positions is kept in the Permanent Title IX File. Pay is comparable for both male and female sports. During the first on site visit in 2000 it was noted that a large number of coaches for both male and female teams were off campus. That has not significantly changed. Having coaches available to athletes is important. When hiring new coaches, consideration should be given to those who would be on campus.</p>
<p>Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities</p>	<p>X</p>		<p>The school was given one deficiency at the first on site visit in 2000 in this benefit area. Reasons cited for the deficiency were a shower and locker shortage for the girls' sports, and facility improvement needed for field hockey. The school constructed a field that is fenced with bleachers for field hockey. There is a storage building beside the field, and a restroom/locker room was built in the basement of the adjacent school building. The restroom/locker room is also for spectator use. The stadium where football, soccer, and lacrosse teams play games is off campus. The baseball field is also located behind the stadium bleachers. There is one large building at the stadium that has a locker room and a training room. This is used by all sports competing at the stadium, male and female. It is carpeted, has open wooden lockers painted in school colors. The training room is located in the same building and has one toilet. The baseball field is not regulation size and the school rents another field for home games. It needed field maintenance. Located behind the school building were a large practice field and</p>

<p>Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Cont'd</p>			<p>softball field. The softball field was maintained and was an improvement over the baseball field. The dugouts were brick with shingle roofs. The outfield fence is portable with ground sleeves. The outfield is used for football practice which can burden the softball team with extra outfield maintenance. There are two gymnasiums, one larger than the other in the main building. The locker rooms in the main building appeared equitable. The locker room assignment sheets should be updated to include field hockey and lacrosse.</p>
<p>Medical and Training Facilities and Services</p>	<p>X</p>		<p>The student athletes pay a one time fee of \$40. This is divided into \$20 for athletic insurance and \$20 for trainer salary. The trainer is employed by Jewish Hospital. The trainer is on site by 2:30 p.m. daily, and stays until the last event is completed. The trainer attends all competitions that involve contact sports and others with high incidents of injury. The trainer can be contacted by coaches via cell phones. There is one training room in the school that appears adequately supplied. Another training room is located in the locker room at the school stadium.</p> <p>Physicals are available for all athletes for a nominal fee.</p> <p>The weight room is located in the main school building and has approximately 30 stations. The amount of lighter weight bars, plates, and dumbbells was scarce. Weight room facilities were discussed during the interview session with coaches. One coach assured the Audit Team that lighter weight equipment was available and stored in a closet. This equipment was not viewed by the Audit Team. The Athletic Director should inspect all the equipment available for athletes and recommend purchase of equipment more suited for female athletes if the visual inspection warrants such action. Expansion of the weight room options, such as utilizing the area under the bleachers would enhance the weight program. The weight room schedule was posted on a bulletin board inside the weight room.</p>

<p>Publicity</p>	<p>X</p>	<p>The cheerleaders, dance team, band, and mascot are equitably assigned to male and female teams. On the T-41 form for the 2007-2008 Annual Report an advantage was given to the boys' program in this area. This advantage was properly addressed on the T-60 form. The Gender Equity Committee should monitor this benefit for continued equity.</p> <p>The school has guidelines for lettering and signing recognition. The Gender Equity Committee and other school personnel should review these and expand the awards/recognition guidelines to include but not be limited to pictures, banners, retired jerseys, trophies, plaques, rings, jackets, t-shirts, banquets, etc. The school has a rich tradition of athletic excellence that is readily seen though out the school and athletic facilities. The use of school colors, graphics, and mascot is obvious as soon as you enter the building.</p> <p>Announcements, pep rallies, and use of the school's web sites really promote the total athletic program for both male and female athletes.</p>
<p>Support Services</p>	<p>X</p>	<p>There are booster groups for all but one team at DuPont Manuel High School. Seemingly, most of the organizations are very active and are committed to providing substantial resources for the teams they support. At the beginning of each school year the Athletic Director has a meeting for all booster clubs where he discusses county and school rules, requirements for monthly financial reports, and other pertinent information. All booster clubs have a signed agreement on file in the Title IX Permanent File. The school's Principal also addresses the booster groups. There are set procedures for coaches to follow when requesting payment for equipment from the school. The booster clubs' accounts are all off campus. There is no prior approval by school administration for booster club spending. The school must be vigilant when monitoring spending with this arrangement. Equity issues can occur quickly and be significant. It is the school's responsibility to insure equity.</p>

Support Services Cont'd			At the time of the Revisit there were six offices for coaches' use. One for football, boys' basketball, girls' basketball, softball, volleyball, and athletic director. The softball and volleyball offices had nothing but desks and chairs. These should be equipped with outside communication capabilities. More office space would be positive support for all coaches.

5. Brief Summary/Analysis of the Corrective Action Plan (Form T-60)

The most current Corrective Action Plan included; continue closing spending gap between boys' and girls' sports, continue renovation of Manual Stadium to benefit all sports that use it, add j-v girls golf and tennis teams, improve facilities for girls' teams, continue closing spending gap on girls' and boys' publications, and gap between boys' and girls' booster club spending. The Revisit Summary Chart accurately lists plans from 2002-2003 through 2007-2008. During the Gender Equity Committee Meeting of the school Revisit, Corrective Action Plans were discussed. Corrective Action Plans are vital for documentation of opportunities and benefits offered to the school's student athletes.

ATHLETIC POLICY FOR PER DIEM

All athletic teams qualifying for the state tournament will be eligible to receive a per diem from the athletic department. The school bookkeeper will write a check directly to the head coach and attach a per diem log for the coach to use as he/she distributes funds to the student-athletes. Student-athletes and members of the coaching staff are eligible to receive \$5 per meal or \$15 per day maximum. Individuals receiving per diem funds must sign the per diem log upon receipt. The completed per diem form, along with any remaining funds, must be returned to the bookkeeper within one week of return from the event.

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ATHLETIC POLICY FOR AWARDS

The athletic department will provide designated awards for each team to present at the conclusion of the season. The head coach of each team is responsible for creating the criteria for receiving a varsity letter. First-time varsity letter winners from a sport will receive a letter with pin. Previous letter winners from the same sport will receive a chevron for each additional year lettered (one distributed per year). Freshmen will be given a number signifying their graduated class year. Junior Varsity awards are not provided and are the responsibility of the booster club.

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ATHLETIC POLICY FOR SENIOR SIGNING RECOGNITION

The athletic department will recognize senior student-athletes that will be continuing to participate in sports at the collegiate level. The press, family members, and teammates will be invited to attend the event.

Recognition ceremonies will be planned for the following:

- Student-athletes signing national letters of intent during assigned periods.
- End of the school year to recognize remaining senior student-athletes participating at the collegiate level.
