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ESTILL COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL CHEERLEADER SELECTION PROCESS

Estill County High School has one Varsity Cheerleading squad and one Junior Varsity Cheerleading squad. The Varsity squad cheers for all Varsity football games, all home Varsity boys' basketball games, and all home Varsity girls' basketball games. The Varsity squad also cheers for all playoff games, district and regional games, and away games with 40th District rivals. The number of away games is kept the same for boys' and girls' basketball. The Varsity squad also competes in the KAPOS District and Regional competitions. The Junior Varsity squad cheers for home JV football games and home boys' and girls' basketball games.

All girls try out for the Varsity squad, with 16 to 24 girls being named to the squad depending on the number with good scores from the KAPOS judges and the number who meet the minimal requirements. The minimal gymnastics requirement is a back-hand-spring. If there is a sufficient number of participants, the remainder of the girls is placed on the JV.
