5. **Brief Summary/Analysis of the Corrective Action Plan (Form T-60)**

The school has two locker rooms that are being renovated, but are not yet completed. The plans for this project are on-going as funds become available. The school plans to submit an update of this project in the April 15, 2005 Annual Report.

6. **Observed Deficiencies in Overall Girls and Boys Athletics Programs**

The lack of a cleaning schedule for certain locker rooms may discourage some students and coaches from wanting to make use of the space.

7. **KHSAA Recommended Action in relation to new deficiencies:**

The Auditor did not observe any new deficiencies.

8. **KHSAA Recommended Action in relation to re-occurring deficiencies:**

1. School personnel were encouraged to get more female coaches involved in the girls' program when vacancies occur. This was noted on the 2002 audit report.
2. School personnel are to submit to the KHSAA by **February 1, 2005**, a written policy regarding the systematic replacement of uniforms for each athletic program the school sponsors. This uniform rotation replacement policy is to also be kept in the school's permanent Title IX file. OK

3. School personnel are to submit to the KHSAA, by **February 1, 2005**, a written policy regarding a posted schedule of use for the male and female athletes in the school's weight room. OK

4. School personnel are to submit to the KHSAA, by **February 1, 2005**, a written outline detailing the steps to develop a relationship and management oversight policy with booster clubs. OK
