5. Brief Summary/Analysis of the Corrective Action Plan (Form T-60)

The next Corrective Action Plan shall provide definite plans for installation of lights on the softball field. The plan should include documentation from person or persons who are responsible in seeing this project is planned and completed by the date provided later in this report.

6. Observed Deficiencies in Overall Girls and Boys Athletics Programs

The auditor did not observe any major deficiencies that impact the overall girls' and boys' athletic programs. The Athletic Department could use more storage space; however, that is not feasible and school personnel have made good use of the storage that is available to both programs.

School personnel were urged to schedule the Gender Equity Review Committee meetings so that students can attend and be active participants in the process and at the meetings.

8. KHSAA Recommended Action in relation to reoccurring deficiencies

The deficiency that remains on the Corrective Action Plan has not been addressed since the initial visit to the school in 2002-2003. The project to install lights on the girls' softball field has been on-going since 2002-2003; however, there is no paper trail of documentation submitted by school personnel to the KHSAA regarding actual concrete plans to purchase lighting for the softball facilities.

The auditor strongly recommends that the KHSAA begin whatever procedures that the Association deems appropriate against Fort Campbell High School regarding the lack of installation of lights at the softball facility. For approximately three years, school personnel have proposed to install lights at the softball facility. The proposal has been on the school's Corrective Action Plan for four years, including the school's most recent 2005-2006 Corrective Action Plan. The school based personnel have constantly repeated that there are no funds provided for this project.

The girls are clearly at a disadvantage in this area; there is never an opportunity for girls to play night games or to play double-headers. The school shall submit written plans for installation of lights on the softball field with starting dates, company name responsible for installation and a completion date. These plans are due to the KHSAA on or before March 1, 2006.
