Comments: According to the reports submitted, the most recent Student Interest Survey was conducted during the 2009-2010 school year. Students in grades 8-11 were surveyed with a return rate of 92%.

Accommodation of Interests and Abilities	X		According to the data submitted on the most recent Student Interest Survey, students in grades 8-11 were surveyed with a 92% rate of return. There are currently 16 sport opportunities for females and 17 sport opportunities for males.	
Equipment and Supplies	X		Uniforms reviewed appeared to be of high quality and are provided equitably for all sports. There was no written evidence of a uniform review and/or purchase replacement plan in place. (see KHSAA recommendation) The 2010-2011 Annual Report indicates that the school spent approximately \$160.00 per female athlete and \$184.00 per male athlete.	
Scheduling of Games and Practice Time	X		There appeared to be parity in schedules of like sports for equivalent opportunities and number of competitive events. There was minimal written evidence of usage schedules for the shared facilities of soccer fields, gymnasium, and weight room. Interviews indicated equitable usage, but there was no written evidence or posting of usage schedules. (see KHSAA recommendation) The school meets the requirement of prime date play.	

Travel and Per Diem Allowances	X	There was written evidence of a per diem (food) guideline as established through board policy. The board policy also indicated reimbursement procedure regarding transportation and housing but there was no written evidence regarding mode of transportation and housing guidelines. (see KHSAA recommendation) The 2010-2011 Annual report indicates that the school spent approximately \$131.00 per female athlete and \$155.00 per male athlete.
Coaching	x	There was written evidence of an extra service pay schedule for coaches and positions that showed equivalence and parity for all sports. The school is to be commended for its high number of on-campus coaches as this allows for more convenient accessibility for student-athletes. The ratio of coach to student access is 11:1 for females and 12:1 for males.
Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities	X	All available locker rooms were well maintained and appeared to be equivalent and with similar amenities. Each coach had submitted information as to locker room and storage use, but there was no written evidence of a comprehensive list of locker room and storage availability for all teams as developed by the Gender Equity Committee. (see KHSAA recommendation) Practice and competitive facilities are excellent. Since the original audit in 2002, there has been much in facility improvement with a main focus on softball. Improvements have included lights, concession/storage building, outdoor hitting facility, indoor hitting facility, and fence covering, and bleachers.

Medical and Training Facilities and Services	X	There is one weight room with equitable accessibility for all sports. There was evidence of a weight room schedule which showed minimal use by a few teams. Interview indicated that teams could sign up with the Athletic Director for weight room use. (see KHSAA recommendation) The school does have an Athletic Trainer with training room accessibility for all athlete Auditors recommend that a visible trainer schedule be posted at the site to include time of availability and contact. The trainer provided through a contract with the local hospital. Athletic physicals are provided by the school Nurse Practitioner and local physicial for a minimal cost per student.
Publicity	X	Interviews with athletes and coaches indicate that athletes are recognized through a awards night/banquet type program. The was evidence of an awards guideline findividual awards but not inclusive of bann display and recognition. (see KHSAA recommendation) The scheduling of cheerleading and oth support groups appear to be equitable and a monitored by the Athletic Director for parit The 2010-2011 Annual Report indicated the school spent approximately \$48.00 p female athlete and \$44.00 per male athlete.

Support Services	X	There are established booster groups for soccer, volleyball, football, basketball, baseball, and softball. There are no signed booster agreements or written evidence of a guideline for school administrative oversight and approval in the areas of fundraising and expenditures. (see KHSAA recommendation) Coaches interviewed were well aware of the school process for approval and purchase of items. Support groups, including cheerleaders, appear to be assigned equitably with administrative oversight.

- Submit to the KHSAA, no later than April 15, 2012, a written guideline for uniform review and/or purchase that will insure equity for all sports.
- Submit to the KHSAA, no later than April 15, 2012, a written guideline for the usage of shared facilities that insures equity for all sports.
- Submit to the KHSAA, no later than April 15, 2012, a written guideline of travel and per diem (housing) that would insure equity for all sports.
- Upon receipt of this report, a comprehensive list of locker room and storage area assignment designation for all sponsored teams shall be placed in the Title IX file.
- Upon receipt of this report, the school shall have posted a weight room usage schedule that insures equity and shows gender accessibility.
- Submit to the KHSAA, no later than April 15, 2012, an awards guideline that includes criteria for banner display and recognition.
- Submit to the KHSAA, no later than April 15, 2012, an established guideline that
 provides for administrative oversight and approval in the areas of booster
 fundraising activities and expenditures as outlined in Redbook Accounting
 Procedures.
