Comments: Based on data submitted and interviews with students as well as school officials, the student survey was appropriately administered. According to Title IX records, the school received a 94% return rate on its most recent survey.

Accommodation of Interests and Abilities	X		According to the school's calculations, it has met the standard established in Test #1 for provision of athletic opportunities during two of the past three school years (2004-2005 and 2005-2006). Primarily due to the addition of a volleyball program at the freshman, junior varsity, and varsity levels, the school appears to have met the standard established in Test #2 during two of the past three years (2003-2004 and 2004-2005). The school also appears to be meeting the standard established in Test #3. All sanctioned KHSAA sports for girls are offered at the varsity level, and the same number of junior varsity and freshman teams are offered for boys and girls. School officials are to be commended for offering a broad spectrum of opportunities in athletics for all students. KHSAA officials reviewed the school's Title IX file. The file contained a student travel policy, an athletic recognition policy, a mission statement, game schedules, agendas for GERC meetings, minutes for most GERC meetings, a facility usage schedule, coaching salary schedules, a written designation of locker and athletic storage space, board policies relating to Title IX, booster club agreements, a student athletic handbook, and an athletic trainer agreement. The file was in excellent condition and covered most issues relating to Title IX and athletics. School officials were commended for the development and maintenance of the Title IX file.
Equipment and Supplies	X		The November 3, 1999 school visit report showed parity in this area. The athletic uniforms seen by KHSAA officials during the most recent visit appeared to be of high quality and equitable. According to school administrators, they are in the process of implementing a uniform review and/or replacement plan. (See KHSAA Recommended

		Action.) According to the school's 2005-2006 annual report submitted to KHSAA, it is currently spending approximately \$44 per female athlete compared to \$73 per male athlete for equipment and supplies. This is a significant difference and should be monitored by school administrators in the future. School officials have done an excellent job of increasing storage space for athletic equipment.
Scheduling of Games and Practice Time	X	Prime time playing opportunities for girls were discussed. A review of the school's 2005-2006 basketball schedules revealed that the girls basketball team played 33% (4/12) of their home games on prime time dates. They were given credit for meeting the KHSAA mandate because the boys team also played only 33% of their games on prime dates. A review of the school's 2006-2007 schedules indicate that 63% (5/8) of their girls home games are to be played on prime dates, and all of the prime date games are scheduled during the prime time slot. School officials were encouraged to schedule a consistent 40% of their home girls games on prime dates and to follow KHSAA requirement for "prime time."
Travel and Per Diem Allowances	X	The school does have a written policy related to student athletic travel. The school's re-visit form indicates that it is currently spending \$38 per female athlete as compared to \$67 per male athlete for travel and per diem. Spending in this area should be closely monitored by school administrators as well as the GERC.
Coaching	X	Coaching salaries for "like" sports appeared to be equitable. The failure of the school to submit the extended days pay for coaches on its submittals to KHSAA made it difficult to totally evaluate this area. (See Support Services and KHSAA Recommended Action.)  According to the school's re-visit form, 55% (5/9) of the girls coaches are off-campus employees compared to 40% (4/10) of the boys coaches.

Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities	X	The November 3, 1999 school report requested that the school officials find added storage space for girls basketball. That request has been met by adding large amounts of storage space for girls basketball and also several other sports. All shared facilities (playing and practice fields, and locker rooms) appear to be shared equitably. All athletic playing areas appeared to be very well maintained.

Medical and Training Facilities and Services	X	The school provides an athletic trainer to all athletes at the school through an agreement with the University of Kentucky. An area of concern was the use of the school's weight room facility. Although the school had a written and posted weight room usage schedule, interviews with student athletes and school administrators indicated that there was very little actual usage of the facility by female athletes. The facility did have female friendly equipment. The weight room is currently housed in the football dressing room and this appeared to be what discouraged female usage. The school does have a plan to construct a new weight room as part of a larger construction project. The new room would have a different location and would not be part of the football dressing room. (See KHSAA Recommended Action.)
Publicity	X	According to interviews and discussions during the school visit, the information submitted by the school on the T-73 form is incorrect. (See KHSAA Recommended Action.) The school currently has one cheerleading squad which cheers at all home games for football, girls basketball, and boys basketball, and at a selected number of away games within a certain radius of the school. School officials were reminded that the "certain" number of games should be equal for boys and girls. The squad also cheers at all playoff, district, regional, and state tournament games.
Support Services	X	The school currently has an active booster club for each sport. The school has a written agreement with all booster clubs. There are currently three coaches who do not have the benefit of a coaching office. Two of those are coaches of girls teams. School officials were alerted to the fact that when space became available, the next office should go to a coach of a girls team. In the area of total athletic support, the school's spending appears to show

		parity (\$466 per male athlete compared to \$433 per female athlete). This area was difficult to fully evaluate because of the school's failure to submit expenditures for extended days on coaches' salaries. (See KHSAA Recommended Action.) The Corrective Action Plan does not identify the "facility improvements" related to girls sports for which large amounts of funds were spent. During the school re-visit, administrators were not sure what the figures represented. (See KHSAA Recommended Action.)

### 5. Brief Summary/Analysis of the Corrective Action Plan (Form T-60)

The school's most recent Corrective Action Plan called for new sod and brick dust on the girls softball field, a new watering system to be installed at the girls softball field, and the scheduling of more prime time playing opportunities for the girls basketball team.

### 6. Observed Deficiencies in Overall Girls and Boys Athletics Programs

No observed deficiencies were designated as a result of the most recent school visit.

There is a need for the school to address the situation at the school's weight room as it relates to equity. (See KHSAA Recommended Action.

There is a need for the school to address the provision of equitable office space for coaches.

There is a need for the school to submit accurate data to KHSAA regarding spending for athletic benefits and publicity. (See KHSAA Recommended Action.)

There is a need for the school to complete the implementation of their uniform review and/or replacement plan. (See KHSAA Recommended Action.)

### 7. KHSAA Recommended Action in relation to new deficiencies

No new deficiencies were designated by the most recent school visit. There were a few areas of concern listed in the body of this report. These areas are to be addressed by submitting the following to KHSAA.

**EQUIPMENT** and **SUPPLIES**—On or before **February 20, 2007**, the school is to submit a copy of the **approved** uniform review and/or replacement plan.

MEDICAL and TRAINING FACILITIES and SERVICES—On or before February 20, 2007, the school is to submit their written plan for the construction of a new school weight training room. This plan should include a projected completion date and the location of the new facility.

**PUBLICITY**—On or before **February 20, 2007**, the school is to submit a T-73 form describing its current situation as it relates to selection and assignment of cheerleaders.

**SUPPORT SERVICES**—On or before February 20, 2007, the school is to submit completed T-35 and T-36 forms for the 2005-2006 school year which gives the total expenditures for coaches' salaries including extended days and accurate figures relating to facilities improvements.

### 8. KHSAA Recommended Action

In relation to re-occurring deficiencies, the KHSAA recommends the following actions:
