Comments: The administration of the survey was in order. However, the interpretation of the results were flawed. Interest in girls' soccer was pursued on the expressed interest of only four female students. However, it was reported that, subsequent to the survey, considerable parental interest in adding a girls' soccer team was expressed. School personnel reported at the time of the on-site visit that they have acknowledged parental interest and will see if female students on the new survey to be conducted this school year mirror that interest.

Accommodation of Interests and Abilities		X	Miscalculated data prevented a supportable evaluation of whether or not the school met the standard for compliance for any of the three tests. School administration was instructed on the proper means of tabulating participation and interpreting results. It is anticipated that the school will meet the standard for either Test 1 or Test 3 in future reports.
Equipment and Supplies	X		There was no difference in the quality of the uniforms displayed. A document outlining a rotation plan for new uniform purchase among teams was not available for review. According to school personnel, some teams are provided replacement uniforms rather than new uniforms on a scheduled basis. There did not appear to be any gender bias in this regard. A general review of equipment seen during the on-site visit did not reveal inequities.
Scheduling of Games and Practice Time	X		The school has met the KHSAA requirement for girls' basketball HOME games in 2009-2010 No written schedule for use of overlapping facilities was found However, interviews with coaches and players indicated that cooperation among coaches on rotation of use was the norm and there had been no conflict. It was noted that over a five-year period, the number of games scheduled in the comparable sports of softball and baseball was not the same, even though those sports are permitted the same maximum number of games in a season by the Association. Baseball scheduled an average of twenty-five games during the regular season; softball, nineteen. It was unclear as to whether or not this differential was due to budget limitations for softball. It was noted also that over the same five-year period, baseball had taken an out-of-state trip but softball had not. However, girls' basketball had taken two extended trips and boys' basketball, one. It was recommended that school personnel make it a policy to bring seasonal schedules to the attention of the Gender Equity Review Committee during the process of approval.

Travel and Per Diem Allowances	X	There is a need for written policy on the provision of per diem for teams traveling across typical meal times. No written policy was found for provision of transportation, although the district provides for this benefit. Mode of transportation is a function of team size, according to administrators. No guideline was available for the provision of lodging of teams on overnight trips.
Coaching	X	The ratio of coaches to athletes was calculated to be virtually the same for male and female athletes. The number of head coaches not employed on campus was the same for boys and girls. School personnel were advised that means of communication between those coaches and athletes should be made explicit and assured. Supplemental salaries for coaches were reported to be based on time commitment, mostly length of season, and indirectly on seniority (percentage of teaching salary). School administrators were advised to review the criteria to determine if time commitment during vacation periods is factored into the salary schedule for both boys' and girls' sports. In addition, a review should be made of the supplements provided outside of the regular school calendar, i.e., during summer months, for time commitments for out-of-season activities (camps, etc.) to evaluate whether or not inequities exist between boys' and girls' sports programs in terms of employment opportunities for coaches and, inevitably, physical training and skill development of student-athletes
Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities	X	The exact assignment of teams to locker rooms was not clear. No assignment chart for dressing or storage areas was available. There is no press box at the softball field. Provision of one should be given priority before any further structural improvements are made to the baseball field. There is more accommodation for spectator seating at the baseball field than at the softball field. A review should be made to determine if this is a deterrent to attendance.

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Medical and Training Facilities and Services		X	No female athletes use the weight room. The equipment is not readily suitable for females. The environment should be made more appealing for use by girls' teams. Of particular concern is the fact that the only access to the weight room is through male locker rooms.
Publicity	X		There was no policy in the file outlining an awards system for recognition of athletic accomplishments. A combined girls' and boys' basketball program guide is published annually. The school provides composite schedule cards for all three sports seasons and includes all sports except golf. Cheerleader selection and assignments appeared equitable.
Support Services		X	There was a lack of documented institutional control over booster club spending and fundraising activity. Booster clubs exist for males in baseball, basketball, football, and soccer. For girls' teams there are clubs for basketball and softball. (If a girls' soccer team evolves, the boys' club will include benefits for that team.) There was no discernible policy for providing benefits to athletes on teams that have no booster club. One such sport is volleyball, which has three teams. Budgetary data rather than expenditure data has been reported on required Association forms, which presented a serious evaluation problem. Office space is provided for coaches of three male sports: baseball, basketball, and football. Only the girls' basketball coach has an office
Athletic Scholarships	X		Some financial stipends were reported to have been given by some booster clubs for girls' sports to graduating seniors in that sport, presumably for college expenses. Clarification is needed. The use of booster funds for a benefit of this nature is a violation of KHSAA Bylaws.

Housing and Dining Facilities and Services	X	Written policy on the provision of meal service for HOME contests was not found on file. Time did not permit a discussion of the availability of this benefit to athletes.

5. Brief Summary/Analysis of the Corrective Action Plan (Form T-74)

Focus has been on increasing female participation, employing female coaches, improving booster club spending relationships with school personnel, updating outdoor facilities, adding capital equipment, and reviewing coaches' salaries.

6. Observed Deficiencies in Overall Girls and Boys Athletics Programs

Data reported on Form T-70, Participation Opportunities—Summary Chart, were miscalculated, making an accurate analysis implausible. Moreover, school personnel advised that financial data reported on Forms T-71 and T-72, Benefits—Summary Chart(s), as well as that on some annual Title IX reports in the past, had recorded estimated figures rather than actual expenditure numbers. Coupled with a lack of written policies for the athletics program, evaluation of the practices in operation at the school regarding gender equity was limited to perception and open discussion. There is critical need for documentation of oversight.

7. KHSAA Recommended Action in Relation to New Deficiencies:

A. By June 30, 2010, school personnel will submit a cohesive, comprehensive set of policies guiding the operation of the athletics program. The focus of the policies should be to provide explicit means for monitoring gender equity. Minimum topics to be covered:

- 1. The awards and recognition system for individual athletes and teams, to include, where applicable, (a) lettering/annual awards; (b) team awards; (c) senior awards; (d) awards ceremonies; (e) banners; (f) team photographs; (g) placement of trophies; (h) relocation of outdated or obsolete trophies/plaques, etc.; (i) retirement of jerseys; (j) Hall of Fame designation, if applicable; and/or (k) other forms of athletics commendations given by the school or outside groups
 - The selection and assignment of cheerleaders; assignment of pep band.
 - 3. The provision of outlets for promotion of attendance at HOME contests, i.e., distribution of schedules; school public address announcements: newspaper, radio, and internet notices, etc.
 - 4. Travel: (a) transportation; (b) per diem; (c) overnight trips, to include extended trips
 - 5. Meal service at HOME contests
 - 6. Provision of equipment and supplies:

 (a) basic items to be provided all teams; (b) special items for certain teams (due to safety requirements, etc.) if indicated; (c) procedure for administrative oversight and approval for all additional items or services to be purchased or accepted
 - Generation and approval of practice and competition schedules
 - 8. Employment and retention of coaches, to include priorities given positions; evaluation process
 - 9. Use of athletic facilities; priorities listed
 - 10. Generation and approval of budgets; accountability for expenditures

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B. As an attachment to the annual Title IX report, due April 15, 2010, school personnel will submit a copy of the internal accounts at the school with itemized expenditures for each sport to date, as a sample of the procedure that has been established for tracking benefits afforded athletes at the school.

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C. As an attachment to the annual Title IX report, due April 15, 2010, school personnel are requested to submit: (a) a chart showing the assignment of all teams to a locker room or established dressing area, as well as (b) a chart indicating storage areas for each sport. In addition, (c) a chart is requested outlining office or comparable space for each head coach. Attach as well (d) a chart depicting the rotation plan for purchase of new uniforms, and a statement regarding the practice of providing uniform replacements. Lastly, submit (e) a schedule for use of shared facilities for practice and competition, and (f) a schedule of use for the weight room in the 2010-2011 school year;

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Include on the report's Corrective Action Plan (Form T-60) the steps that have been or will be taken during the 2009-2010 school year to shore up administrative procedures that document fair practices in the athletics program at the school. Also, include any long-range plans for improvements to the softball field; and, to providing female athletes more appropriate accessibility to the weight room and more suitable equipment and surroundings.

8. KHSAA Recommended Action in Relation to reoccurring issues

The school is commended for providing for the attendance of athletics administration at a KHSAA Title IX Seminar in the 2009-2010 school year.

Through observation and the reports of operating procedures discussed with school officials and personnel during the visit, it appeared the athletics program was equitable in its treatment of male and female student-athletes. However, final evaluation should be reserved until actual fiscal accounting data and program guidelines are reviewed.



POLICY AND PROCEDURES FOR KHSAA TITLE IX COMPLIANCE

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Philosophy on Athletics

Athletics plays an important part in the life of Hart County High School. Young people learn a great deal from participation in athletics. Lessons in sportsmanship, teamwork, competition and how to win and lose gracefully are important parts of our athletic program. Athletic participation also plays an important part in helping students develop a healthy self-concept as well as a healthy body. Athletic competition improves school spirit and helps students develop pride in their school.

The major objective of the program is to provide wholesome opportunities for students to develop positive leadership habits and attitudes of social and group interaction. Coaching leadership should be of the highest quality and should proved athletes with examples of exemplary behavior. Measurements of leadership success should not be measured in terms of the tangible evidence of the victories and defeats. Instead character, courage, and integrity should be major objectives of the athletic program.

Requirements for Participation

1. Physical Examination

A yearly physical examination is required. The physical form must be completed by the physician and given to the coach prior to the first practice. The physical will cover all sports for the entire school year. A copy of the form will be kept on file in the athletic director's office.

2. Emergency Medical Authorization

Each athlete's parent and or guardian shall complete an Emergency Medical Authorization Paper giving permission for treatment by a physician or hospital when the parents(s) are not available

3. Insurance

A student shall be covered by medical insurance with coverage limits up to the deductible of the KHSAA Catastrophic Insurance program and that insurance must remain in force throughout the school year.

4. Scholastic Eligibility

Athletes have to be on grade level to graduate and must meet minimum grade requirements in order to participate as required by the KHSAA. Grades will be checked Thursday of each week to determine eligibility of each athlete.

5. Attendance

Student athletes shall attend school on game day.

6. Sportsmanship

All athletes are expected to follow and exhibit good sportsmanship traits before, during, and after a contest. Should an athlete be ejected from a game, he or she will sit out a minimum of one game plus complete the Star Sportsmanship online program sponsored by the KHSAA.

7. Medical Release

If an athlete sustains an injury which causes him/her to be unable to participate, a doctor's release will be needed in order to resume participation and/or games.

Equipment and Supplies

Policy

The Hart County High School Athletic Department shall adopt an equitable policy to provide guidelines and procedures for inventory equipment, supplies, and uniforms.

Policy Statement

All equipment items and supplies purchased for athletics shall adhere to the following criteria:

1. All athletic equipment, supplies and uniforms shall be inventoried on the district's athletic inventory sheet and submitted to the athletic director approximately four weeks at the conclusion of each sports season.

Coaches will maintain an accurate record of equipment/supplies purchases by booster clubs and include the items in the annual inventory report.

3. Athletic uniforms for each sport will be purchased by The Athletic Department. Each team will be on a five year rotation for the purchase of new uniforms. Monies allotted for each sport's uniforms will be determined on cost and the individual need of each sport.

4. Replacement of uniforms prior to the team's turns in the five year rotation will be based on need. The entire set(s) of uniforms will not be replaced unless lost dues to fire, water damage, or stolen.

5. The quality and quantity of uniforms purchases for Hart County High School athletic teams will be the same.

6. All uniform and equipment purchases must be approved by the athletic director and the principal. Purchases orders will be approved by the athletic director and given to High School bookkeeper. The athletic director and individual coach will order all uniforms and major equipment purchases with approval of principal.

7. Equipment purchases for like sports (as listed above in #3) shall be on equal basis. In the event equipment is shared, the monies shall be divided equally between the two sports. Each sport will have the same equal access to all equipment purchases for the use of both male and female sports

8. The rotation plan for buying new uniforms for each sport offered at Hart County High School is as followed:

2008-2009 School Year: Boys Soccer and Girls Softball

2009-2010 School Year: Boys Basketball (Home & Away Uniforms) and Girls Soccer

2010-2011 School Year: Volleyball, Girls Basketball (Home & Away Uniforms)

and Football (Away Uniforms)

2011-2012 School Year: Baseball, Boys and Girls Cross-Country

and Football (Home Uniforms)

2012-2013 School Year: Boys & Girls Track and Boy and Girls Golf.

9. The rotation starts all over again back to the 2008-2009 school year.

- 10. Each Coach collects their uniforms at the end of the season. They give the Athletic Director a uniform inventory with in one month.
- 11. HCHS Athletic Department will provide home and away uniforms for all of our Athletic Programs.
- 12. Special equipment needed for sports will be provided by the Athletic Department.

Scheduling of Games and Practice Times

Policy

The Hart County High School Athletic Department shall adopt an equitable policy to proved guidelines and procedures for scheduling of games and practice times.

Policy Statement

All games and practice times for athletics shall adhere to the following criteria:

- 1. Athletic Director and Head Coaches will be responsible for scheduling all games, scrimmages, practice times, and weight lifting.
- 2. All scheduling of games and scrimmages, plus practice times and use of the weight room must be approved by the athletic director.
- 3. Facilities practice times and weight lifting schedules will be scheduled with the athletic director. Weight room coordinator will be the contact person for scheduling the weight room.
- 4. Male and female identical or similar sports that share facilities on an equitable basis will rotate in scheduling practice sessions week to week. If the girl's basketball practices early one week the next week the boy's teams will practice early.
- 5. In the event of the cancellation of school to weather (snow, flood) or other reasons, teams will rotate equitably on a day-to-day basis as to who practices when and where. This will be predetermined prior to the start of the athletic season by the head coaches. They follow the same plan as number 4.
- 6. Basketball head coaches and the athletic director shall insure that 40% of the girl's basketball games are during prime dates (Friday, Saturday, and Sunday.)
- 7. In the event of a girl/boy varsity team double header basketball game, the girl's varsity team will play the second game of the night according to KHSAA guidelines scheduled contests.
- 8. All volleyball, football, basketball, baseball, and softball games shall be secured via KHSAA contract forms with KHSAA competitors so there is a balance in number of home and away games each season.
- 9. All athletic facilities usage schedules (practices, scrimmages, and games), including the gymnasium, courts, and athletic fields shall be posted in the Principal's office and the Athletic Director's office.

Travel and Per Diem

Policy

The Hart County High School Athletic Department shall adopt an equitable policy to provide guidelines and procedures for the travel and per diem of student athletes.

Policy Statement

All athletic travel and per diem of student athletes shall be governed by the following criteria:

- 1. The athletic department will not provide funds for the purchase of meals during the regular season.
- 2. In the event that a team or individual makes the state tournament in their sport, the athletic department will purchase meals during the teams or individuals stay at the state contest. Meal money allocated for any team will be the same as allowed by the KHSAA.
- 3. The athletic department will provide equitably all transportation for athletic events for male and female sports. All buses will be comparable for both male and female teams.
- 4. Out-of-state trips must have the same equitable location for each team and/or program. For example, if the boys' baseball team wants to play in Florida, the girls' softball team must be given the same opportunity to play in Florida as well.
- 5. The head coach shall submit travel requests for bus transportation to the Athletics Director prior to the start of the competition season. Any additional request must be made one week in advance before transportation is required.
- 6. Student athletes shall ride the transportation to any scheduled event if provided. Students may not drive themselves or other athletes to athletic events.
- 7. All student athletes traveling by bus to school sponsored activities **MUST** return to the school on the same bus unless the parent or legal guardian personally addresses the coach or other supervising school authority and takes custody of their child and signs them out with the coach.
- 8. Student athletes may not be released to ride with any person other than their own parent or legal guardian. (NO EXCEPTIONS) Student athletes with extenuating circumstances may request approval for another means of transportation, by the principal.

Policy

The Hart County High School Athletic Department shall adopt an equitable policy to provide guidelines and procedures for the hiring procedures, equal staffing, and education opportunities of the coaches of student athletes.

Policy Statement

All athletic coaches of student athletes shall be governed by the following criteria:

1. The school district's board of education shall maintain an equitable pay scale for all coaches of male and female teams. A copy of the pay scales shall be placed in the permanent Title IX File.

- 2. The athletic department shall seek qualified adult women for coaching positions as they become available. The athletic director shall seek out former female student athletes that are now educators and encourage them to apply for coaching positions in the school system.
- 3. The number of assistant coaches shall be equal for like teams if the number of participants is parallel for both male team and female team.
- 4. The athletic department shall make every endeavor to hire coaches with similar levels of competence and experience for male and female teams.
- 5. Coaches of female and male teams shall have the same equitable opportunities to attend various clinics, in-services, conferences, and seminars.
- 6. The Principal, SBDM, and Athletic director shall maintain, when possible, a balance of on-campus/off-campus coaches for teams of both genders.

Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities

Policy

The Hart County High School Athletic Department shall adopt an equitable policy to provide guidelines and procedures for the assignment of locker rooms, practice and competitive facilities for teams of student athletes.

Policy Statement

All locker rooms, practice and competitive facilities of student athletes shall be governed by the following criteria:

- 1. Banners: Every sport offered at Hart County High School shall have an achievement banner hanging in the High School gymnasium. Individual state champions will be recognized with a separate banner from the team banner and list their name, event, and year of the championship (i.e. track and field, golf, cross-country, and tennis).
- 2. Awards and Trophies: All trophy cases in the gym and main hall shall display all female and male KHSAA district, regional, and state winners and runners-up for all sports.
- 3. All locker rooms shall be assigned by the Athletic Director. All locker rooms will be provided with the same amenities (rest rooms, showers, lockable lockers.)

Medical/Training Facilities and Services

Policy

The Hart County High School Athletic Department shall adopt an equitable policy to provide guidelines and procedures for medical/training facilities and services for student athletes.

Policy statement

All medical/training facilities and services shall be governed by the following criteria:

- 1. All female and male student athletes have equitable access to the school's nurse. Coaches shall be responsible for taping student athletes when a certified trainer is not available.
- The weight room shall contain appropriate instructional weight lifting demonstration posters for both female and male athletes and decorated in a manner suitable for both sexes.
- 3. Scheduled use of the weight room shall take place though the weight room coordinator. Female sports will be given equitable scheduled times to use the facility.

Publicity

Policy

The Hart County High School Athletic Department shall adopt an equitable policy to provide guidelines and procedures publicity for all student athletes.

Policy statement

All publicity for all athletic programs shall be governed by the following criteria:

- 1. The HCHS cheerleading squad shall be assigned to perform at all home boys and girls basketball games and all home football games. All cheerleaders' will cheer at all district away games. Cheerleaders will cheer at ALL girls' and boys' post season contest for basketball and football.
- 2. The band will play at boys' basketball and gîrls' basketball doubleheader games and all home football games.
- 3. Local media (radio and newspaper) will be contacted and given schedules of all athletic teams and encouraged to give equitable coverage to both male and female sports.
- 4. All pep rallies will support teams of both genders.
- 5. Student awards: Trophies and awards shall be provided to the team members by the athletic department.
 - A) HCHS doesn't give our letters/jackets.
 - B) Every senior receives an award.
- 6. On senior night, every senior player for that season will be recognized with their parents.
- 7. The Athletic Department sponsors every team with an end of the season banquet.
- 8. Hart County High School gives so much money per athlete for food.
- 9. HCHS pays the same amount for plaque given to all varsity team awards. Every team is different in the number of awards they give. Some teams have more players than other teams. We spend the same amount per trophy.
- 10. Academic Awards Certificated for all male and female sports are provided by the KHSAA.
- 11. Only athletes who finish the season or who would have finished the season except for illness or injury shall be eligible for athletic awards.
- 12. Athletic Director shall make the community and school district aware of the athletic department's efforts and accomplishments to achieve the intent and spirit of Title IX through reports to the SBDM, Board of Education, and local media.

Support Services

Policy statement

All publicity for all athletic programs shall be governed by the following criteria:

- 1. All coaches shall be assigned an office with office space for various records and assignments including the HCHS Title IX Manual.
- 2. The HCHS principal and athletic director shall maintain written agreements with all booster clubs that clearly define the role of the booster's club and its relationship to the school and the school's administration.
 - To improve Booster accountability the Hart County High School SBDM has A) decided to have all booster monthly statements mailed to the HCHS Bookkeeper. This will help keep record of booster spending.
 - B) In May of every school year, the athletic director at HCHS turns in a working athletic budget to the building principal. This will be the money allocated to the sports programs for the next school year. Exceptions to this would only be in emergency cases.
- 3. Inform booster club's that their efforts and expenditures can cause the school to be non-Title IX compliant.
- 4. The principal and the athletic director shall calculate and monitor the amount of money spent by booster clubs per male athlete as compared with the amount of money spent per female athlete.
- 5. The HCHS principal and or the athletic director shall meet with the boosters clubs at the beginning of each school year to establish accounting, fund raising, expenditure procedures and guidelines and Title IX rules. The athletic director shall meet with boosters clubs as needed with concerns or to assist the club in determining their future course.
- 6. HCHS shall establish and maintain one booster club per sport as needed. The following booster clubs are established at HCHS:
 - HCHS Volleyball
- HCHS Football
- HCHS Girls & Boys Soccer
- HCHS Baseball
 - **HCHS Softball**
- **HCHS** Boys Basketball
 - HCHS Girls Basketball
 - **HCHS Girls & Boys Tennis**

TRACK GOLF

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Tutoring

Policy

The Hart County High School Athletic Department shall adopt an equitable policy to provide guidelines and procedures for tutoring services for all student athletes.

Policy statement

All tutoring services shall be governed by the following criteria:

- 1. All members of the athletic department shall encourage an attitude amongst student athletes that academics come first.
- 2. All student athletes, male and female, shall be given an opportunity to attend tutoring when offered by the high school.

Gender Equity Review Committee

Policy

The Hart County High School Athletic Department shall adopt an equitable policy to provide a gender equity review committee to address services for all student athletes

Policy statement

All gender equity review committee shall be governed by the following criteria:

- 1. The gender equity review committee shall meet at least three times a year (one for fall sports, once for winter sports, and once for spring sports prior to March.)
- 2. The gender equity review committee shall consist of students, teachers, coaches, parents, principals, athletic director, and any BOE members.
- 3. All gender equity review committee minutes shall be recorded and kept in the Title IX master file.






