Brief Summary/Analysis of The Corrective Action Plan (T-60) 5.

The school is behind in their target dates for the change of the location of the weight room, improvements to the softball field and locker rooms. Some prime time scheduling has been changed for the 2001-2002 season. Budget accountability is a work in progress, and the school has to further improve this process to ensure equity in the boys and girls programs.

Observed Deficiencies in Overall Girls and Boys Athletics Programs 6.

While not a Title IX deficiency, the absence of a certified trainer on campus could be considered an overall deficiency for the athletic program.

Facility Recommendations or Concerns 7.

The school needs to adequately address the softball facility and upgrades that are necessary. School personnel are requested to submit an update on the progress of the softball facility by April 15, 2002.
