Comment:

It appears that the school performed the calculation correctly and the result suggests that the History and Continuing Practice of Program expansion is an area of compliance. The total number of female participants added in the past five years is 64. This number, 64, as a percentage of the total number of female participants, 160, is 40%. Forty percent is above the 25% target for compliance.

Comment:

It appears that opportunities in areas of students' interests are being provided for students at Henry County High School. Currently, there are a total of eleven teams being offered for female participants and a total of twelve teams offered for male participants. During the past five years, a total of four teams (2 varsity, 1 junior varsity, and 1 freshman) have been added to accommodate the interest of female students.

Comment:

Students at Henry County High School were surveyed to ascertain their interest in athletic activities. Students in grades 9, 10 and 11 were surveyed. Additionally, students in the middle school responded to assess potential areas of interest for upcoming years. Based on comments put forth by members of the gender equity committee, it appears that consideration will also be given to survey results in the future to meet student interests and abilities.

5. Brief Summary/Analysis of The Corrective Action Plan (T-60)

The Corrective Action Plan for Henry County High School included three items: (1) construction of a softball facility, (2) scheduling more prime time games for girls basketball and (3) increasing female participation in current and potential sports as identified in the annual student interest survey. The softball facility will be ready for play during the 2001 season. However, work will not be complete and must continue until it is comparable with the baseball facility. Currently efforts are underway to establish more prime time games for girls' basketball to be played in the 2001-02 schedule. The rate of female participation has increased over the past five years as a result of adding four teams. It is suggested that school personnel continue their endeavors to expand athletic opportunities and benefits for female students.

It is recommended that the addition of a press box, lights and batting/pitching cage be added to the softball facility. The school indicates that adequate seating is moved to the field once the season starts.

School shall submit the following additional information:

(Selection of Cheerleaders) On or before April 15, 2001, the school is requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the manner in which cheerleaders are selected for boys' and girls' teams. If cheerleaders are selected in such a way as to result in arguably better (i.e. "A" team vs. "B" team) cheerleaders performing at boys' events, the school shall also submit a plan under which cheerleaders of equal ability shall perform at an equal number of boys' and girls' games in comparable sport (i.e., boys' varsity and girls' varsity basketball game).

(Prime Time Contest/Girls' Basketball) On or before April 15, 2001, the school is requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the number of "prime time" games scheduled (games to be played on Friday and/or Saturday nights) for its girls' varsity basketball team during the 2000/2001 season. To the extent that a fewer percentage of girls' games are played during prime times (when compared with the percentage of boys' games scheduled for prime times), the school shall advise the KHSAA of action it intends to take to immediately correct the difference.
