ACCOMMODATIONS OF INTEREST AND ABILITIES NOTES: According to the information and data submitted, it appears Leslie County High School has meet the standard for Test 3 for the provision of athletic opportunities. The Student Interest Survey administered this year will enable the school to assess students' interest and indicated interests addressed on the T-3 form on the annual report. The school currently offers 9 sport levels for males and 11 sport levels for females. The permanent Title IX file viewed was well organized and complete.

BENEFITS REVIEW- EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES: A written uniform review/replacement guideline indicated a four-year rotation for all sports. The athletic director and coaches evaluate the uniforms on an annual basis for condition. The uniforms viewed appeared to be of high quality and comparable in quantity for like sports. All other equipment viewed appeared to be well-maintained and suitable for their individual sport. Overall spending slightly favors the male athletes.

BENEFITS REVIEW- COACHING: The extra service pay scale viewed appears to be equitable in monies and number of coaching positions. There are 4 out 5 male coaches on campus and 3 out of 5 female head coaches on campus. Interviews with the athletes indicated this was not an issue. The current access ratio of coach to athlete is $1: 13$ for males and 1:10 for females.

The Athletic Director is responsible for evaluation of coaches and has a written instrument that is not currently used.

BENEFITS REVIEW- LOCKER ROOMS, PRACTICE AND COMPETITIVE FACILITIES: Competition and practice venues appeared to be well maintained with comparable amenities for like sports. The practice and competition venue for golf is located in Pineville approximately 40 miles from campus.
There was written evidence of locker room and storage assignments for all teams. It is recommended the assignment of locker room in the Nixon Center be evaluated for use by all girls' teams. Slight improvements in the "guest" locker rooms would make them more aesthetically pleasing for use by other girls' teams. Use of a public restroom for dressing (by Softball) is unacceptable.

BENEFITS REVIEW- MEDICAL AND TRAINING FACILITIES AND SERVICES: There are two weight rooms at the school that are accessible to all athletes. A schedule in the Title IX file appears to show equitable usage and access for all teams and is posted at each site. Weight equipment viewed appears to be appropriate for use by female athletes. The school currently does not have to services of an athletic trainer. Free physical exams are available to all athletes in the fall at a local clinic. Emergency plans for all athletic venues were in the Title IX file.

The school has one cheerleading squad that performs at all home and away football and girls' and boys' basketball games. The pep band also performs at all home games. The athletic director monitors scheduling of support groups to ensure equity.
A local radio station transmits all football, girls' and boys' basketball games both home and away. The radio station hosts a Coaches' show each Wednesday night and supports all sports teams.

All fund raising must be approved by the Site Base Council and expenditures are monitored by the administration to ensure equity and parity. Overall spending falls within acceptable parameters on both a percentage and per athlete basis.
