The condition of the volleyball uniforms was poor. The summary report was not consistent with the team report in this area.

Practice Time			The girls' basketball coach expressed interest in playing on different days. See note regarding prime time games for girls' basketball.
Travel and Per Diem			There were only three team reports recorded in this area. (football, boys basketball, and golf)

Coaching			The school is requested to re-submit Forms T-18 thru T-25 due to incomplete information by April 15, 2001.
Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities		X	The boys program has an advantage with the number of lockers provided for them. The girls' basketball locker room is small with no lockers or storage. The girls' have toilets with no partitions for privacy. There are urinals in the girls' locker room. An upgrade of the softball field is mandatory; there are no lights, no electric scoreboard, no press box and no safety guard on the fencing.

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Medical and Training Facilities and Services		X	It appears from the reports that a certified trainer is available for football and girls' basketball. The evaluators did not observe a training room. The weight room appeared to be used by boys only. It was recommended that a schedule be established and posted in the weight room to assure equal access. The summary of this report was incomplete.

5. Brief Summary/Analysis of The Corrective Action Plan (T-60)

The corrective Action Plan addressed the addition of volleyball to the girls' program and a projected timetable for implementation.

6. Observed Deficiencies in Overall Girls and Boys Athletics Programs

The lack of a certified trainer for sports where injuries are most likely to occur is recommended.

7. Facility Recommendations or Concerns

The urinals in the girls' locker rooms need to be removed and the addition of partitions in the restroom area would provide privacy. The softball facility needs upgrading and ground maintenance. The bleachers in the boys' gym are in better condition than the bleachers in the girls' gym.

(Selection of Cheerleaders) On or before April 15, 2001, the school is requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the manner in which cheerleaders are selected for boys' and girls' teams. If cheerleaders are selected in such a way as to result in arguably better (i.e. "A" team vs. "B" team) cheerleaders performing at boys' events, the school shall also submit a plan under which cheerleaders of equal ability shall perform at an equal number of boys' and girls' games in comparable sport (i.e., boys' varsity and girls' varsity basketball game).

(Prime Time Contest/Girls' Basketball) On or before April 15, 2001, the school is requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the number of "prime time" games scheduled (games to be played on Friday and/or Saturday nights) for its girls' varsity basketball team during the 2000/2001 season. To the extent that a fewer percentage of girls' games are played during prime times (when compared with the percentage of boys' games scheduled for prime times), the school shall advise the KHSAA of action it intends to take to immediately correct the difference.
