Accommodation of Interests and Abilities	X		Proper method of calculation for all opportunities tests was discussed with school officials. According to the school's most recent submittal to KHSAA, the standards established in Test #1 appear to have been met. The proper consistency and follow-up in the development of a corrective action plan was explained to school officials.
Equipment and Supplies	X		The school was alerted to the fact that in the area of equipment and supplies, the self audit document is not filled out correctly, and the summary sheet does not reflect the information shown on the team sheets. The school is to correct this information and make sure all documents are labeled and signed. The school currently has a uniform rotation plan in place. The plan has not been approved by the site based council.
Scheduling of Games and Practice Time	X		Again, the school was reminded that the summary sheets in the Title IX file should be consistent with the information shown on team sheets in the file. The school played 23% of its girls' basketball games in prime time during the 2001-2002 school year. They have 58% of their games scheduled in prime time this year. They are to be commended for their progress in this area.
Travel and Per Diem Allowances	X		Although the school visit appeared to show parity in this area, the school report indicates disparity in the meal allotment for student athletes. The equity committee was encouraged to develop a school policy to address this issue

Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities	X		The Title IX file has no competitive facility sheet for the gym which is the major indoor facility. The form should be completed and placed in the file as soon as possible. The visit showed that the school has developed a good

			plan for sharing facilities in an equitable manner.
<b>Medical and Training Facilities and Services</b>	<b>X</b>		Although there appears to be no basic inequity in this area, there is a general need for improvement of services provided to all students. (See observed deficiencies in overall boys and girls programs.)
<b>Publicity</b>	<b>X</b>		Cheerleading was discussed. The plan presented by the school indicated general equity of support in this area. The summary sheet for publicity in the Title IX file is filled out incorrectly. It should be corrected and placed in the file as soon as possible. It was suggested that the school develop a policy for posting banners and other forms of recognition in the school's gymnasium.
<b>Support Services</b>	<b>X</b>		The T-35 and T-36 forms appear to be correct in the school's most recent submittal. The 2000-2001 and 1999-2000 forms appear to be incorrect. These forms in the file should be corrected as soon as possible. Booster clubs and their management were discussed with school officials.

**5. Brief Summary/Analysis of the Corrective Action Plan (T-60)**

The school's most recent corrective action plan calls for:

- (1) added space for basketball practice (2) the addition of intramural volleyball, (3) continued progress in scheduling prime time games for girls,

(4) improvement in golf facility, (5) increasing publicity for girls' sports, and (6) attempting to start a girls' freshmen basketball program.

6. **Observed Deficiencies in Overall Girls and Boys Athletics Programs**

The school visit indicated the following needs in the overall athletics program:

(1) increased storage space for all sports, (2) a Title IX report and file that is accurate and reflects the total benefits provided by the school, and (3) a weight room facility which is safe and meets the athletic needs of students.

7. **Facility Recommendations or Concerns**

(1) All athletic programs at the school need storage space within the confines of the school plant.

(2) The school needs to provide a weight room which meets the conditioning and rehabilitation demands of today's athletes.
