SUGGESTED CHANGE	The GEC directed the Athletic Director to continue to work with both coaches to close the gap between the Girls' and Boys' program. In addition to following the same strategies used in the past, this may require that both teams will have to play on the same night at different locations.
ITEM FOR CORRECTION	#1 The Gender Equity Committee recognizes that the percentage of Girls' basketball games on the "prime time" nights of Friday and Saturday is not as high as that of the Boys' program (24% compared to 44%). SELECTION OF CHEERLEADERS

REPORT TO KHSAA

4/15/01

Meade County High School and its Gender equity Committee recognize that the two cheerleading squads (Green and White) do differ in terms of their ability and experience. The Green squad is the better squad and competes in state-wide and national competitions. However, <u>both</u> squads compete equally at boys' and girls' basketball games. The schedule is made out cooperatively by the AD and the Cheerleading Coach at the beginning of the seasons to ensure that each team is supported in 50/50 manner.

Attached is the information given out when the cheerleaders try out in the Spring. Also attached is the schedule followed by the two squads during the 2000-2001 basketball season.

This is the same procedure which will be followed for the 2001-2002 seasons.

Before try-outs we have a sign-up sheet posted at the high school so that those who are interested in trying out can sign up.

We also have a sign-up sheet over at the middle school so that in-coming freshmen are able to sign up.

We usually try to leave the sign-up sheet up for two weeks.

Those who sign-up are required to get a Parent Permission form to be signed before try-outs. Also they must pick up teacher evaluation forms. These must be given to all of their teachers.

We use the teacher evaluation forms to see if anyone who is trying out is having trouble with their grades. Also the teacher comments on the students behavior.

Last year the students that were trying out were taught one cheer and one dance. The student then had to make up their on Two bids cheer.

We have a closed try-out procedure. Parents and friends are not allowed to watch.

The Coaches judge the try-outs. And just like basketball, baseball, ect., we coaches select the ones who make the squad.

Meade County High School and its Gender Equity Committee recognize the need to provide "prime time" exposure for the Girls' Basketball Program to the same degree as the Boys' Basketball Program. With that in mind, we have striven to accomplish this by increasing the number of Friday and Saturday nights that our girls play. During the 2000-2001 season, our Ladywaves had 24% of their games scheduled on these two nights. The boys played 44% of their games at these times.

For the upcoming 2001-2002 season the GEC has made it a priority to reduce this difference. The Athletic Director will work with the coaches to schedule a greater number of girls' games during "prime time". This will continue for future seasons until the gap no longer exists.
