| Equipment and Supplies | X | | Uniforms viewed were all of mid to high quality. There appeared to be good overall balance and an equivalent quantity for all sports. There was written evidence of uniform purchase but with a very limited rotation plan. The current plan should be reviewed by the Gender Equity Committee and expanded to include long range plans for specific uniform rotation and/or replacement. In review of the expenditures in this area for the past three years, it appears that the provision in reference to the overall spending, percent of gender spending, and per athlete spending has been met. |
| Scheduling of Games and Practice Time | X | | Equitable, written plans were presented regarding scheduling of games and practice times for overall and like sports. The school currently meets the requirement of prime date play for girl's basketball. |

Interviews also indicated some provision for food by the school and/or by boosters. There was no written evidence of a travel and per diem (food/housing) guideline. (see KHSAA recommendation) |

The number of coaches (on and off campus) appears to insure the level of accessibility between student and coach that insures equity. Students interviewed were very positive about the coaches at Metcalfe County High School. |

There was also written evidence of locker room assignment and storage for each sport. Competitive facilities of football, tennis, track, and baseball are located at the City Park, less than 1 mile from the high school. A new softball facility is located on the high school campus. It appears that the amenities viewed for all competitive and practice facilities are equitable. All facilities appear to be clean and well maintained. |

| Publicity | × | Interviews with students and coaches indicate that athletes are recognized through an awards night/banquet program. Each sport organizes their awards banquet. It appears that there is a fair and equitable plan for awards and recognition. There was written evidence for awards recognition, however, the audit team recommends an expansion to include the specifics of banner display and clarification of expenditures allotted for each sport. The scheduling of cheerleaders, dance team, and pep band appears to be fair and equitable to both genders. |

| Support Services | X | There are established outside booster accounts for football, baseball, girls and boys basketball, softball, and volleyball. There was evidence of signed and notarized booster agreements for each sport. Coaches interviewed were well aware of the process and approval for school purchase requests and orders. It appears that approval for booster spending is not monitored. Auditors recommend that the Gender Equity Committee establish guideline(s) for administrative oversight and approval of booster spending in order to insure equity in areas of spending. (see KHSAA recommendation) There was office space assigned for all girls and boys sports. |

- Submit to the KHSAA, no later than April 15, a written guideline of travel and per diem (food/housing) that insures equity for all sports.
- Submit to the KHSAA, no later than April 15, a written schedule for weight room
 use that insures equity for all sports.
- Review the Redbook Guidelines as it pertains to booster spending and administrative oversight in order to insure equity in the overall sports program.
- Review and expand the current uniform purchase plan to include multiple year(s) and cycle of rotation for uniform purchase and/or replacement.
- Review and expand the current awards recognition guideline to include banner recognition and display and clarification of award expenditures in order to insure equity in the overall sports program.
