## Comment:

For the 2000-2001 Report, the result of the calculation suggested that substantial proportionality is an area of compliance. 269 females were enrolled, representing $48 \%$ of the total enrollment of 560 students. 151 of the 335 interscholastic participants were female, $45 \%$ of all athletes. The percent of total female participation, $45 \%$, compared with the percent of total female enrollment, $48 \%$, is within three percentage points.

A total of twelve teams, including the sports of basketball, cross-country, golf, softball, tennis, track, and volleyball are offered for a female enrollment of 269 students. However, information provided through the survey should serve as the basis to identify potential team |
|  |  |  | additions. For example, in the 2000-2001 survey, 53 girls indicated an interest in soccer. School personnel should engage in follow up activities to determine if program expansion would be appropriate. Documentation of these efforts is to be maintained in the Title IX documents. |
| Equipment and Supplies | X |  | An inspection of the uniforms during the Audit Team's visit suggests that the quality of uniforms is comparable for both female and male participants. It is strongly recommended that a written policy for the rotation of uniform purchases be developed and kept in the permanent Title IX File at the school. |
| Scheduling of Games and Practice Time | X |  | Double headers for boys and girls basketball are included in the schedule. The boys' and girls' basketball teams follow an early/late rotation for practice in the gymnasium. Schedules for teams' use of the weight room should be posted to help maintain equitable access. |
| Travel and Per Diem Allowances | X |  | Money from the school's athletic fund covers the cost for bus travel. For trips requiring an overnight stay, all athletes are given $\$ 5.00$ per meal. |
| Coaching | X |  | An explanation of pay scales for the various coaching positions should be kept in the Title IX File at the school. Pay is comparable for both male and female sports and pay increments are included for years of experience. |

Team locker rooms are comparable and <br> visiting teams use the physical education locker <br> rooms. The gymnasium is well maintained. The softball facility, which is <br> located on campus, is well appointed but it is <br> recommended that a protective covering be <br> installed on the fence surrounding the field.
