According to the data provided, the school currently does not meet the standards established in any of the three opportunities tests. (See Comments section). It was suggested that the school place some students on the Gender Equity Review Committee. School personnel were alerted to the fact that the Gender Equity Review Committee should schedule meetings in the fall, winter, and spring in order to review benefits provided during those seasons.
Equipment and Supplies	X		The school visit showed that Ohio County provides excellent uniforms and high quality equipment for all sports offered. It was suggested that school personnel look into the feasibility of developing a rotation plan for the replacement of uniforms.
Scheduling of Games and Practice Time	Х		The school visit showed that facilities are shared in an equitable manner. Prime time scheduling was discussed. The girls' basketball team had only one prime time game in the 2000-2001 school year and no games in the 2001-2002 school year. (See Comments section.)
Travel and Per Diem Allowances	X		School personnel were alerted to the fact that team forms relating to per diem allowances in the Title IX File should correspond with the summary forms. Also, proper monitoring of meal allowances was discussed.

Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities	X		During the audit visit it was apparent that school personnel were working very hard to achieve high quality and ensure equity in this area.
Medical and Training Facilities and Services	X		It is suggested that the school develop a training schedule for all sports using the weight facilities and post it in all weight rooms, and that these schedules be monitored by the athletic director.

Publicity	X	Cheerleading was discussed. The school has one squad, which cheers at all boys' and girls' basketball games both home and away. It is suggested that the school consider developing a policy for the display of banners, pictures, and other forms of recognition in the gymnasium.
Support Services	X	Booster clubs were discussed. The school principal seems to be doing an excellent job of monitoring booster spending in relation to equity and the benefits students receive. Proper completion of Forms T-35 and T-36 was discussed with school personnel.

5. Brief Summary/Analysis of The Corrective Action Plan (T-60)

The school's most recent Corrective Action Plan calls for increasing female participation by the addition of varsity and junior varsity volleyball. It appears that the school has met this goal.

The major observed deficiency was the failure of the school to meet any of the standards established in the opportunities tests.

The school visit indicated that Ohio County provides high quality and well maintained facilities for its student athletes. Both the school administration and coaches are to be commended for the provision of these benefits.
