School personnel have secured a sponsor for the 2009-2010 school year on a trial basis to allow a limited number of experienced competitive swimmers to participate. Interest in the sport should continue to be monitored.

## 0. Comments:

The original on-site visit was held February 26, 2001. At that time, deficiencies were reported in ACCOMMODATION OF INTERESTS AND ABILITIES, and in the benefits of COACHING, and MEDICAL AND TRAINING FACILITIES AND SERVICES. In the interval between visits, Accommodation of Interests and Abilities has been satisfied. In benefits provided, in the medical/training area, no deficiency was found during the re-visit., However, no schedule of use of the weight room had been recorded, making full evaluation difficult.
Concerning the Coaching benefit, problems persist in that area. Despite strong measures taken by school personnel to rectify the on-campus employment issue, little progress has been made. Progress has occurred in paid compensation for coaches. The quality of coaching does not appear to be an issue, based on the competition results in the sports available on the KHSAA web site. A deficiency has not been marked on the report because of the progress that has been made in compensation and quality of coaching.
The school's permanent Title [X file was reviewed and was found to be in order. Policies have been developed for more explicit operation of the athletics program. The Gender Equity Review Committee appears to be fully involved in its role of advisement to school administrators. There appears to be excellent rapport among school administration, the Superintendent, and the Board of Education in providing for interscholastic sports.

The public meeting did not materialize.

## ATHLETIC TRANSPORTATION

## In State Trips

All athletic trips in-state require the advanced approval of RCHS administration and the district director of transportation. All athletic trips must utilize district transportation, unless advance approval to use any other method of travel is granted by the school board or superintendent. Each RCHS athletic team is given an allotment of mileage and funding for bus driver's fees is allocated within the team allotted amount approved by the school's SBDM. Any overages will become the responsibility of the team's booster club.

## Out of State Trips

Athletic trips taken out the state of Kentucky require advanced approval by the Rockcastle County Board of Education prior to the date of the trip. Rockcastle County Board of Education does require athletic teams to use its transportation. Any other form of transportation must receive advanced approval from the school board or superintendent.

## Overnight Trips

Athletic trips that will last more than one day and require athletes to stay overnight require approval by the Rockcastle County Board of Education. Rockcastle County Board of Education does require athletic teams to use its transportation. If any other form of transportation is to be used, advanced approval must be given by the local board of education or superintendent.

## ATHLETIC MEAL POLICY

## Pre-Game Meals

Meals before games will be provided by a sport's booster club upon the coach's discretion, or for any home or away game in which the wait time for a post-game meal is more than three hours, and students will not have an opportunity to get their own meal before the game.

## Post-Game Meals

Meals will be provided by that sport's booster club for athletes after a competition if the travel time after the game exceeds one hour. Coaches have the discretion to provide an after game meal if travel time is within one county away from Rockcastle County (i.e. county that borders Rockcastle County)

## Overnight Trips

During a trip where a team will be staying overnight, breakfast, lunch, and đinner will be provided by that sport's booster club for every day/night the team stays.

Allowances per diem for all sports (after any game or overnight trip—breakfast: $\$ 5.00$, lunch: $\$ 8.00$, dinner: $\$ 12.00$ )
