Scheduling of Games and Practice Time	X		The girls' basketball schedule for the 2001-2002 season included three prime games and the schedule for the upcoming season has eight prime time games. Progress is being made in this area. An early/late rotation is in effect for the basketball teams' use of the gymnasium floor and the soccer teams' use of their field.
Travel and Per Diem Allowances	X		The school board pays for transportation costs. It appears that coaches have discretion in providing meals for their teams. Perhaps, consideration should be given to determining if equity is being maintained for this benefit.

Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities	X		Overall, "the locker rooms and competitive facilities at Russell County High School are in excellent condition. A soccer field was opened for play this past Fall. The complex includes an electronic scoreboard and bleachers. Lights will be installed this Spring. A seven-lane track surrounds the practice football field. Russell County does not host meets. The baseball complex is well appointed. One building houses a
			dressing area, press box, coach's office and storage. An indoor hitting facility was completed two years ago. The weight room is well equipped and located in the former Agriculture Building. It is available for all teams; however, it is

			recommended that a written schedule of training times should be posted. The softball complex, located at a former elementary school, is approximately a mile and half from campus. Bus transportation is available for team members who do not drive or have parents who can provide transportation. The school board maintains the two softball fields, which is also used by a community youth league. The complex includes lighting, concrete dugouts, concession stand, restrooms and storage. Additionally, this Spring, a locker room and an indoor hitting facility were finished. The gymnasium and related areas, including storage, locker rooms, and coaches' offices are comparable for male and female athletes. The athletic handbook will include a written policy regarding the display of banners and honors.

10. Comments

It is apparent that the Gender Equity Review Committee at Russell County High School has made efforts to promote the athletic program is a positive and equitable manner for both male and female participants. Based on comments made during the Audit Team's visit, there is a high level of commitment to fulfilling the intent of Title IX and the committee is to be commended for their work. However, the work of the committee would be enhanced with the addition of student representatives.

Overall, the interscholastic athletic program at Russell County High School appears to be comparable for both males and females and an advantage would not be assigned to either program in terms of opportunities or benefits. There is clearly a high level of involvement in the athletic program on the part of females at the school. It is noted that program offerings are being expanded for next year to include varsity soccer and volleyball. Also, the softball complex, that includes a new locker room and an indoor facility, is a very positive addition for team members. The members of the Gender Equity Review Committee are encouraged to continue their efforts to develop a comprehensive athletic handbook. This endeavor will enable school personnel and parents to make clear expectations for students and adults involved in the athletic program. Also, this activity will result in policies that insure appropriate administrative oversight of any expenditures by the various booster clubs.
