Comments: South Oldham High School is offering all of the KHSAA sanctioned sports for boys and girls with the addition of Field Hockey. The Student Interest Survey conducted in 2007-2008 had a return rate of 100%. The survey showed the students were interested in archery, bowling, and rifle which are non-sanctioned sports at this time. Any and all feasibility research or monitoring of interest should be documented on the T-3 form and T-60 form of the school's annual report.

Accommodation of Interests and Abilities	X		According to the information supplied by the school, South Oldham High School has met the standards established for Test 3 for the 2007-2008 school year. The possibility of meeting the standards for all the tests each year was discussed in the Gender Equity Committee Meeting. The need to meet the standard for one test each year was also addressed at the meeting. The Student Interest Survey was conducted with a return rate of 100% and reflects the students' athletic interests. The school's Permanent Title IX file was well organized and thorough. It included all annual reports, student surveys, meeting minutes, school policies and guidelines, and handbooks for coaches and athletes. The first on site visit by the KHSAA occurred in 2000. Since that time, the KHSAA has requested schools produce a number of guidelines/polices for Title IX equity and school documentation. The school needs to update some of those they have and produce a few that they do not have.
Equipment and Supplies	X		Review of the uniforms during the Revisit showed equivalence for the male and female team uniforms. There was a slight difference in the girls and boys soccer uniforms which should be addressed by next season. The school did not have a uniform purchase/replacement policy/guideline. School Administration with input by coaches and help from the Gender Equity Committee should produce the needed policy/guideline. Each head coach should be given a copy, and a copy kept in the Permanent Title IX File. A copy should also be sent to the KHSAA. The need for administrative over site for this benefit was discussed during the Revisit.

Scheduling of Games and Practice Time	X .	The school was in compliance for Prime Dates for girls' basketball during the 2007-2008 school year (50%). The 2008-2009 schedule will be checked at the end of the season for current compliance. The school has a written schedule for all games and practices for all sports in/on all facilities. A copy of this schedule is in the Permanent Title IX File.
Travel and Per Diem Allowances	X	The school has a written travel and per diem policy. It is recommended that the Gender Equity Committee review this policy with attention to the wording for equity assurance. At this time there is no deficiency in this benefit category but there is a large difference in spending between boys and girls sports. For 2007-2008 school year 16% of the spending in this area was spent for girls and 84% was spent on boys. This difference was discussed during the Revisit. The school administration and Gender Equity Committee should monitor the spending and travel requests in this area so that future disparity can be avoided.
Coaching	X	Salaries are comparable for male and female sports. A copy of the district salary schedule is kept in the Permanent Title IX File. The school should add an explanation on how the salary of para-professionals is calculated. The school should make every effort to employ female coaches for female teams when vacancies occur.
Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities	X	The school has six locker rooms for student athletes' use. Two are located at the stadium. One is used by freshmen football, and wrestling. The other was for the varsity football team. The other four are in the main gymnasium. One is shared by boys' basketball and baseball. One is shared by girls' volleyball, girls' basketball, and softball. The other two, one for boys and one for girls, are shared with all other sports.

	plates, no light weight dumbbells, and only one small weight belt. There was some female suitable equipment in the room for wrestling but was pushed to one end and not incorporated in the room with the other stations. The girls' basketball coach has his own equipment and this may be an indication that for various reasons the fitness center may not be used as much for the female athletes as the males. The school administration and Gender Equity Committee should survey the female sports coaches to see who uses the center and what, if anything could be done to maximize the use of the center by female athletes.
	A weight room/fitness center usage schedule was posted.
Publicity X	The school has one cheerleading squad that performs at all home varsity games, district, and playoff games for football and boys and girls basketball. The pep band and dance team are also equitably assigned to male and female teams. There were schedule cards for all sports and media guides for all three sports seasons. The school announcements include athletic accomplishments and events. There are at least two pep rallies during school each year and after school pep rallies to introduce athletes in all sports. The school has a large trophy case in the front hall of the school which is updated yearly. The school mascot is impressive.
	The school has written guidelines for recognition that pertain to letters and bars. The school administration and Gender Equity Committee should review this guideline and expand it to include but not be limited to;

Publicity Cont'd.		letters and bars, trophy displays, banners, retired numbers/jerseys, pictures, banquets, rings, etc. A copy should be given to each head coach, a copy kept in the Permanent Title IX File, and a copy sent to the KHSAA.
Support Services	X	South Oldham High School has one booster club that maintains an off campus account. The process for utilizing booster club funds is handled by the Athletic Director. Gate receipts are part of the general athletic fund. Sports may fundraise and have individual accounts at the school. The Athletic Director oversees all spending. According to the 2007-2008 Annual Report, forms T-35 and T-36, approximately \$594 was spent per male athlete, and \$398 was spent per female athlete. This was a difference of \$196. According to the 2006-2007 Annual Report forms show a difference of \$80. This is a large increase in one year. The school administration and Gender Equity Committee should closely monitor all spending to ensure continued equity. The areas of most concern were travel, and equipment and supplies. This was discussed during the interview sessions and the Gender Equity Committee meeting. Annual Reports should reflect equity on forms T-35 and T-36. The school has four offices assigned to coaches. One at the stadium for football coaches. Three in the main building adjacent to the main gymnasium. One for boys basketball, one for girls basketball, and one that is shared by volleyball and softball. All coaches should have an area for administrative needs. Future plans should include areas for all coaches.
