For the 2001-2002 school year, the results of the calculations suggest that the History and Continuing Practice of Program Expansions is an area of compliance. The total number of female participants added in the past five years is 58. This number of 58, as a percentage of the total number of female participants, is approximately 41%. Forty-one percent is above the 25% target for compliance.

Equipment and Supplies	X		The quality and quantity of athletic uniforms are comparable for both males and females in all sports. It is noted that Taylor County High School has adopted a uniform replacement policy. It is suggested that the Gender Equity Committee develop a policy to inspect and upgrade and/or replace all of the athletic equipment and uniforms used by all the male and female athletes at Taylor County High.
Scheduling of Games and Practice Time	X		It is noted that Taylor County High School started addressing the "prime time" scheduling issue in 2000-2001. At that time, the school played nine girl/boy double-headers, with five of these games being scheduled on Friday night, and the boys playing first on one of these nights. In 2001-2002 the school played nine double-headers, with four of these played on Friday night, and the boys playing first twice. In 2002-2003 the school will again play nine double headers with five of these being played
			on Friday night. At no time are the boys playing first this year. In addition, the girls have scheduled one other contest on Friday night and two on Saturday night, along with a girls' weekend basketball tournament.
			Although they are making very good progress in this particular area, the vast majority of the girls' games are starting at 6:00. It is suggested that the Gender Equity Committee look at the possibility of rotating more of these games and/or adjusting the starting time for the first varsity game to 6:30 or 7:00 so that more family members can attend the early games.

It appears that most of the offices have also become storage areas, which further indicates the need for additional storage areas for Taylor County Athletics. It was noted that some coaches were allowed computer access in their
			respective office while others were not. Booster Clubs appear to be very aggressive in some selected areas. It is recommended that the Gender Equity Committee begin immediately to establish a school policy to show that Taylor County High School governs all athletic programs, which includes the Athletic Booster Clubs.

Dear Commissioner DeVries:

This is in response to the letter dated June 6 concerning Title IX issues with our High School Cross-Country Coach and Track Coach.

Enclosed you will find copies of Extra Service Salary Schedules for 2000-2001 and 2001-2002. You will also find enclosed a copy of area schools pay for extra service. We have certainly not intended to discriminate against this lady and don't feel that we have done so. Our coaches' salaries are in line with local area schools, and we certainly have done everything possible to make sure that everyone is getting his/her fair share.

Our Superintendent has our Finance Officer contact local area schools asking for salary schedules for extra service pay. A list is compiled, and our salary schedules are proposed according to what other area schools are paying. Our proposal for extra service salaries is based on recommendation from the Finance Officer and the Superintendent. This proposal is sent to the Board of Education for final approval.

We might mention that this young lady left our coaching staff in 1999-2000 to become Cross-Country Coach at Campbellsville University. She was not happy and returned to our staff in 2000-2001. She approached our Superintendent and negotiated her own salary that year, which the Superintendent agreed to. The following year the Board of Education gave an across the board raise.

Our position is that the salary is in line with area schools and in line with golf and tennis which are other non-revenue sports. Neither of those sports have assistant coaches.

We would entertain the possibility of hiring as assistant if this is the direction we need to go in order to solve this problem.

Be assured that we will do whatever it takes to eliminate this dilemma.

Thank you in advance for your time in dealing with this situation.

There are some questionable practices going on at Taylor County High School, regarding Title IX that I feel needs to be looked into. It deals with coaches' salaries. All coaches at the high school received substantial pay raises last year, except for the Cross Country and Track Coach. She is the Head Coach for both teams and from my understanding received substantially less than coaches that are coaching one sport. She is not given funding to hire an assistant coach, but other teams at the high school are allowed to have paid assistants. Looking around at area high schools within the district, most have paid assistants for cross-country and track & field. From my understanding this has been brought to the attention of the principle, assistant principle, athletic director and superintendent of schools for Taylor County, and nothing has been done. I am outside of the loop, but do not feel that she is getting the same treatment as her male counterparts in regards to pay.

The community would appreciate you looking into this situation.
