The low level of participation was discussed with school administrators. It was recommended that specific goals be established in future Corrective Action Plans to attempt to increase participation. It was recommended that the school include students on future Gender Equity Review Committees. The school personnel were alerted to the fact that all future team reports should be signed, dated, and identified. Also, all information on team reports should be reflected in summary reports. It was suggested to school officials that the Gender Equity Review Committee be more involved in goal setting for improvements in school facilities. The importance of the development, accuracy, and updating of a permanent Title IX file was emphasized to school officials.
Equipment and Supplies	X		It was suggested that the Gender Equity Review Committee look at the feasibility of developing a rotation plan for uniform replacements.
Scheduling of Games and Practice Time	X		School personnel are requested to submit information to the KHSAA by May 30, 2001. (See comment section)
Travel and Per Diem Allowances	X		The need for team forms and summary forms to show the same information in relation to this area was discussed with school officials.
Coaching	X		School officials discussed their concern about the degree to which the current coaching staff was encouraging participation in athletics at the school. Both the athletic director and principal seem to have made the employment of quality coaches a priority.

Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities		X	There seems to be at least two major deficiencies in this area. One area is the girls' softball field, which is deficient in several aspects, including but not limited to the following: The general layout of the field is lacking. There are no dugouts or scoreboard, and seating is inadequate with no permanent fence. The second area is the availability of locker space for girls' sports. The girls' basketball, volleyball, and softball teams are all assigned to share the same locker room space while most other locker areas are used exclusively by one sports team. (See comment section)

#### 5. Brief Summary/Analysis of The Corrective Action Plan (T-60)

Both the 1999-2000 and the 2000-2001 Corrective Action Plans called for attempts to increase female participation in athletics. Several suggestions were made to the school personnel to help develop more specific steps to meet this goal. These included improvement to facilities, selective hiring of coaches, involvement of the Gender Equity

Review Committee, and more wide spread publicity.

#### 6. Observed Deficiencies in Overall Girls and Boys Athletics Programs

These major areas need to be addressed: the low and decreasing level of female participation: the condition of the softball field, and the allotment of locker room space for girls.

#### 7. Facility Recommendations or Concerns

Although there appears to be a need for the upgrading of nearly all athletic facilities, it is suggested that the softball and baseball fields be addressed first.

(Selection of Cheerleaders) On or before June 1, 2001, the school is requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the manner in which cheerleaders are selected for boys' and girls' teams. If cheerleaders are selected in such a way as to result in arguably better (i.e. "A" team vs. "B" team) cheerleaders performing at boys' events, the school shall also submit a plan under which cheerleaders of equal ability shall perform at an equal number of boys' and girls' games in comparable sport (i.e., boys' varsity and girls' varsity basketball game).

(Prime Time Contest/Girls' Basketball) On or before June 1, 2001, the school is requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the number of "prime time" games scheduled (games to be played on Friday and/or Saturday nights) for its girls' varsity basketball team during the 2000/2001 season. To the extent that a fewer percentage of girls' games are played during prime times (when compared with the percentage of boys' games scheduled for prime times), the school shall advise the KHSAA of action it intends to take to immediately correct the difference.

(Locker Rooms/Practice and Competitive Facilities) School personnel should present a plan for approval by the Gender Equity Review Committee, which would provide more equitable use of locker room space at the school. A copy of this proposal should be submitted to the KHSAA no later than June 1, 2001.

School personnel should develop a plan for improvement to the softball field. This plan should emphasize that this endeavor is a major priority for the school. Implementation of this plan should begin before improvements in other areas are started. A copy of this plan should be submitted to the KHSAA no later than **June 1, 2001**.

(Support Services/Budget) The school is requested to submit by June 1, 2001 Budget Forms T-35 and T-36 which include all expenditures made during the 1999-2000 school year for each sport.

Due to a lack of interest and participation, Western MST offers only one Varsity cheerleading squad. They cheer at all Varsity Football games, and all prime time Boys or Girls basketball games unless the teams are split and in that case, they cheer at the home contest.

Western has put in motion the paperwork to receive School Board assistance in funding the following improvements to the grounds. Detailing the softball field as our number one priority.

Softball field is to be improved by adding scorers area during the summer of 2001, purchasing a portable electronic scoreboard during the winter of 2001, Permanent Dugouts during the summer of 2002. The portable outfield fence will be put in place as needed, depending on the school's ability to field a team during the softball season. The area will continue to be utilized as a practice football field during the fall of the year. Portable aluminum bleachers will be put in place and the older, unsafe bleachers will be removed.

We have similarly asked for monies to be granted to resurface the track, resurface the tennis courts, and to add plumbing for restrooms and showers in outbuilding.
