			It should be noted that the head coach of softball has become the head coach of volleyball as well. Although the coach has considerable coaching experience, this assignment should be strengthened. No boys' team shares a head coach.

5. Brief Summary/Analysis of the Corrective Action Plan (Form T-74)

Prior corrective actions taken included equitable assignment of cheerleading, scheduling more girls' basketball games in prime time and prime dates, providing a certified trainer to serve all sports, and improving printed promotional materials for girls' sports.

6. Observed Deficiencies in Overall Girls and Boys Athletics Programs

The primary observation was a need for coherent, consistent oversight of booster club spending. In addition, some policies to guide program operations need to be expressed in writing.

- 7. KHSAA Recommended Action in relation to new deficiencies
 - a. **Due March 1, 2008 to the KHSAA,** school personnel shall provide a copy of written agreements and policies governing the operation of booster club(s) that assure administrative oversight of all spending.
 - b. **Due March 1, 2008,** school personnel will provide a copy of policies written to guide the following program operations:

- 1) awards and recognitions, to include individual and team awards; banquets; and banners
- 2) facility usage: fields, gyms; locker rooms, storage spaces, weight room, etc.
- 3) meal service
- 4) provision of printed materials for publicity and promotion
- 5) purchasing
- 6) provision of uniforms and equipment by the school, and a uniform purchase rotation schedule

10. Comments

The school has extraordinary facilities, experienced coaches, and good support from the school board and the community. Activity buses run after school to permit broad participation by students in extracurricular activities. Booster clubs appeared active and enthusiastic. The permanent Title IX file was in evidence and was reported to be in the offices of the district coordinator, the principal, and the athletic director. Salary schedules for the athletic director, the assistant athletic director and the assistant to the athletic director were not discernable in the file.

The public meeting did not materialize.

Dear Ms. Hodge:

Thank you for your submission of the actions taken to codify practices currently in place at Whitley County High School in the operation of its athletics program; and to generate additional policies covering benefits to student-athletes not addressed in handbooks. In addition, the inclusion of WCHS's Booster Club agreement was helpful in reviewing the manner in which oversight of booster activity is managed at the school.

The KHSAA has, we believe, the responsibility to advise schools when gaps appear in their procedures for approval of expenditures which can affect compliance with Title IX. By not requiring approval of expenditures <u>BEFORE</u> they are made is one of those gaps (See enclosure regarding KDE "Redbook" procedures). Prior approval is required for revenue production (fund raising) in your school's agreement, but not for expenditures from that revenue. Ensuring compliance with Title IX, which is the charge given schools by the Kentucky Department of Education, would be much easier if requests were approved beforehand by the Athletic Director and/or Principal. Our recommendation is that the agreement be amended to reflect a change in that procedure.

In reviewing the policies submitted on benefits to student-athletes, the following recommendations are made:

Imendations are made.

1. In regards to additional awards given by the coach to athletes, approval by the Athletic Director is suggested.

2.) No policy on the placement of banners, team photographs, trophies, awards, etc. was listed. Please submit by May 15, 2008. Included on T-GO, 2007-08

3) Under PRINTED MATERIALS, the provision of additional material by booster clubs should be approved by the Athletic Director as well in order to assist the school in ensuring balance in the publicizing of teams and events. Well addressed Live
