Accommodation of Interests and Abilities	X		The 2009-2010 Student Interest Survey was not tabulated or reported correctly and the school will need to re-survey the student body (grades 8-11) this year and re-submit the results of the survey (after it is reviewed by the Gender Equity Committee). It is to be sent to the KHSAA by May 16, 2011.	
Equipment and Supplies	X		All the uniforms are of high quality and of equal quantity for both boys and girls. At the present time the school does not have a uniform rotation plan therefore the <u>Gender Equity Committee needs to meet and develop a Uniform Rotation Policy</u> . A copy of the new policy should be placed in the schools permanent Title IX File and one sent to the KHSAA May 16, 2011.	
Scheduling of Games and Practice Time	х		At the present time the school is in compliance with the Prime Date Requirements.	
Travel and Per Diem Allowances	х		At the present time there is no documentation that shows that the school has any directives related to travel. The Gender Equity Committee needs to meet and develop a Travel and Per-Diem Policy that would cover all aspects of travel. A copy of the new policy should be placed in the schools permanent Title IX File and one sent to the KHSAA by May 16, 2011.	
Coaching	×		At this time it appears that the school is providing quality coaching for both boys and girls teams. The current pay scale is equitable in the like sports. This policy should be reviewed each year by the Gender Equity Review Committee.	
Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities	X		At the present time the school has three locker rooms that are assigned to athletes. Three dressing rooms are open year round while two other dressing rooms are not assigned to athletes at all. The Gender Equity Committee needs to tour the facilities and then make dressing room assignments for each of the sports that Williamsburg offers. This list of dressing room assignments should be placed

		in the schools permanent Title IX file and a copy sent to the KHSAA by May 16, 2011. A schedule of shared facilities should also be placed in the school's permanent Title IX file. There is a major discrepancy in the baseball and softball facilities. At the present time the baseball field is far superior. Corrective action has taken place, but needs to be documented. The Gender Equity Review Committee needs to meet and develop a corrective action plan to improve the softball facilities. A copy of the corrective action plan should be placed in the school's permanent Title IX file and a copy
		sent to the KHSAA by May 16, 2011.
Medical and Training Facilities and Services	X	It appears that the school is working with people in the community to provide athletic physicals for all athletes at a reduced rate. The school is providing a athletic trainer for all of the athletes and a training room is in place that is well stocked. A copy of the trainer's hours and contact information should be available at the times the trainer is at off campus practices and/or competitions. The school currently has two weight rooms. The one in the gymnasium is small and not well lit. Larger teams need to use the much bigger weight room located at the end of the football stadium. Although there is some universal equipment in both rooms the Gender Equity Committee needs to look at both rooms and make them more female friendly. This can be achieved by adding posters and others displays that represent both genders. More female friendly equipment is also necessary.
Publicity	х	At the present time the school provides pocket schedules for football and basketball. The Gender Equity Review Committee needs to look at providing schedules for all sports with a seasonal schedule (Fall-Winter-Spring).
		The school has a big display of its athletic history with pictures, etc, but nothing has been put together in policy form. The Gender Equity Review Committee needs to tour all the sports facilities in the school and make a listing of all of the areas that could be considered publicity for the sports programs. They should then put together an Awards and Banner Policy that would cover all the aspects involved (banners, team or individual pictures,

		hall of fame selection criteria, sports banquets, etc.). A copy of this Awards and Publicity Policy should then be placed in the school's permanent Title IX file and a copy sent to the KHSAA by May 16, 2011.
Support Services	X	It appears at this time that the cheerleaders give equal time to boys and girl's athletics. The school appears to have good control of the boosters but it is highly recommended that the school have signed Booster Club Agreements in place. The Gender Equity Review Committee needs to monitor the spending between boys and girls athletes. In the re-visit report several spending figures were left out and made the report void and the Gender Equity Committee must re-submit the re-visit report by May 16, 2011.
