Equipment and Supplies	X		It does not appear that there is a difference in the quality of equipment or supplies provided to the various teams. In addition, the school has a replacement schedule that it attempts to follow.
Scheduling of Games and Practice Time	X		The school is aware of the need to schedule more girls' games during prime times. However, current facilities (locker room space) limit boy/girl doubleheaders at the gym. The school was advised that this should be an area of emphasis when future scheduling occurs.

Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities	X		While facilities are limited, recent improvements (paint, tile floors) have been made to both boys' and girls' locker rooms. The school is planning to add a baseball and softball field on campus. This will be a great improvement to the current situation.
Medical and Training Facilities and Services	X		A weight training area is available for all athletes and is used by a number of boys' and girls' teams. While one team is not satisfied with scheduling, this dissatisfaction does not seem to rise to the level of a Title IX concern.

5. Brief Summary/Analysis of The Corrective Action Plan (T-60)

The school is planning to make changes to its current facilities (track & field) in order to add a softball and a baseball field. These changes are scheduled to be completed on or before the 2004/2005 school year. Because no Title IX deficiencies were noted regarding existing facilities, the timing of these planned changes does not create an issue for purposes of this audit.

6. Observed Deficiencies in Overall Girls and Boys Athletics Programs

The school presently uses the county-owned park for baseball and softball (the same field is used for both sports). The condition of the field presents more of a liability concern than a Title IX issue for the school.
