### **BRIEF WELCOME**

Congratulations on behalf of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association Board of Control and staff for advancing to the 2021 Leachman Buick • GMC • Cadillac/KHSAA State Golf Championships.

Refer to this manual and the important website links included at the end of the document to guide you through preparation for your participation.

### **COVID-19 GUIDANCE**

The KHSAA's complete "Healthy at Sports, Stage 4 - Perseverance, Guidance for Continued Practice and Competition During the Pandemic: Interscholastic Fall Sports" document can be found at the following link: https://bit.lv/3jvElu7

In addition to golf specific guidance, this document includes guidance for all sports, officials and media. The information in this document should be thoroughly reviewed by all managers, participants and spectators attending a state championship.

This information is based on the most current information at the time of this publication and is subject to change.

REMINDER - Anyone attending or participating in a KHSAA regular season or postseason event should review their symptoms before arriving. Those that are ill or displaying any symptoms of COVID-19 should stay home.

Guidance is broken into three areas:

- REQUIRED- These standards are required at all sanctioned contests.
- RECOMMENDED- These standards are best practices during all contests during the pandemic and are therefore recommended for all contests. In a few cases, these will be STRONGLY RECOMMENDED.
- CONSIDER- While these items are also best practices during this time, local site discretion should be exercised to determine if these items are practical and feasible for use at the contest.

All items in the document should be interpreted as "CONSIDER" meaning for local consideration unless otherwise noted.

These differences in the guidance are necessitated by the differences in sports, facilities and geographic areas, which are pronounced during normal years and magnified this school year.

Masks/face covering information and portions of the golf specific section of the document are included below:

### INDOOR FUNCTIONS

It is strongly recommended that no gatherings be held indoors, including pre-tournament meetings, meal gatherings, rules meetings or other functions.

Any part of the event held indoors will be considered a motivating factor for changes in any local masking requirement.

### **MASKS/FACE COVERINGS**

Masks/Face coverings for non-competitors and the requirements surrounding these items are a matter of local jurisdiction.

At minimum, any local or specific masking ordinance should also include a requirement for managers to post signage and make regular announcements.

### Competitors

- Due to safety concerns, competitors who are considered to be aerobically exercising should not be required to wear masks during competition.
- Bylaw 22 (contract forfeit) will not apply in situations where a school feels its students are placed in physical jeopardy due to a disagreement between the local jurisdictions regarding mask/face covering requirements, and cases of this type should be reported to the KHSAA to ensure accurate contest results.

### **Non-Competitors**

 Non-Competitors, in compliance with current KDPH and CDC guidelines are recommended to wear masks in all indoor settings unless otherwise exempted (e.g., cannot wear a mask due to disability), regardless of COVID-19 vaccination





status.

• In compliance with current KDPH K-12 education guidance, "In general, people do not need to wear masks when outdoors, though mask use may be considered in outdoor settings that involve sustained close contact with other people who are not fully vaccinated.'

### **PUBLIC HEALTH PROTOCOLS**

• Each member school is expected to adhere to public health standards regarding isolation and quarantine as well as the adopted Return to Play Protocol in the event of a positive test in a participant or team staff member.

### **ADMINISTRATIVE AND COURSE SETUP (RECOMMENDED UNLESS NOTED)**

### PRE-EVENT

All players must play by the current USGA Rules of Golf and KHSAA Conditions of Competition (Hard Card).

Player registration should not occur on-site and players are expected to be on the tee 10 minutes before the assigned starting time for the round.

Participants are not permitted to arrive at the host facility more than 45 minutes before their starting time. If a player arrives at the facility before 45 minutes of their starting time, they must remain in their vehicle.

### **EVENT SETUP**

To ensure social distancing:

- The starting area will be marked/roped off and posted with a sign restricting the area to the Starter and ONLY the players receiving instructions/teeing off. NOTE: the starting area is not a part of and is outside the starting area.
- A starter's box is viewed as a common area and players will not be allowed to access items normally located in a starter's box.

### GENERAL EVENT PROTOCOLS

Players should follow proper social distancing protocol where practical and feasible.

Practice areas should only be available to participants 45 minutes before their tee time.

All practice facilities will be closed the remainder of the day to tournament participants following the conclusion of their round.

### **SCORING**

Players will utilize mobile scoring such as the Golf Genius scoring application for posting hole by hole scores during each competition round.

All players should be assigned a paper scorecard (official scorecard) and their designated marker should populate the scorecard for each hole played.

One player should be designated to digitally post all players' scores in their pairing group.

### **POST EVENT**

Players should leave the facility upon completion of their round. Exception: if following the final round of the event, a player is in contention for an award, they are permitted to remain on the property.

### **OFFICIATING (GENERAL)**

Unless modified through the competition rules adopted by the Board of Control, contests in golf shall be governed by the rules of the United States Golf Association.

Interpretations to the playing rules shall be solely administered by the KHSAA in collaboration with the Golf House of Kentucky and the local host course.

### **QUALIFYING FOR PARTICIPATION IN CHAMPIONSHIPS**

Regional team champions and the top seven (7) individuals not on the winning team are eligible to enter the Leachman Buick • GMC • Cadillac/KHSAA Boys' and Girls' State Golf Championships.



## **COMPETITION DATES, LOCATION AND SCHEDULE**

### **DATES**

The Leachman Buick●GMC●Cadillac/KHSAA Girls' State Golf Championship will be held on Oct. 4-6.

The Leachman Buick GMC Cadillac/KHSAA Boys' State Golf Championship will be held on Oct. 7-9.

The first day of both championships is for the practice rounds only.

### TIMES

Tee times for the first round will begin at 7 a.m. CT and the second round will begin at 7:30 a.m. CT.

### **PRACTICE ROUNDS**

Official practice rounds are for state participants only (no coaches or parents may play) on Monday, Oct. 4 for the girls and Thursday, Oct. 7 for the boys. Practice will start at 7:30 a.m. CT on both days.

Coaches must accompany participants during the practice rounds.

Coaches can schedule their practice time by contacting the Bowling Green Country Club (270-842-4581) no sooner than 8 a.m. CT on Tuesday, Sept. 28 for the girls and Wednesday, Sept. 29 for the boys.

Provide the name of your school and participants when calling the country club.

Cart issuance during practice is at the discretion of golf course management.

### PRE-EVENT LOGISTICS

### **CONFERENCE CALL**

There will be a web conference for coaches and athletic directors prior to the event on Friday, Oct. 1.

Participating schools will be sent additional instructions regarding the call via email once the field is set.

Participants can set up from any location to join the conference and are encouraged to join by computer to view pertinent information, maps, etc.

 Please note there will not be any on-site meetings. Any course information, rules reviews or event information updates will be shared on the web conference.

### **TEAM PACKETS**

Team packets may be picked up at the course during the practice-round day from 1-6 p.m. CT.

Please maintain social distancing while retreiving your infomation by staying at least six feet away from others.

### **PARKING**

Parking is free at the country club in both the paved lot and overflow ground area.

Buses are advised to park in the overflow area.

### **LODGING**

Lodging is not assigned for the state golf championships.

Schools are responsible for all travel expenses, including lodging, for participation in the event.

Have your school's or Board of Education's Sales Tax Exempt Number with you at check-in to avoid sales tax from being added to the hotel bill.

KHSAA staff will be headquartered at the Hilton Garden Inn (1020 Wilkinson Trace, Bowling Green, Ky., 42103).





### **BYLAW 22 - REQUIREMENT TO ACCOMPANY**

You are reminded that KHSAA Bylaw 22 requires a principal, coach or another approved individual of the school to be present along with any student-athlete who is representing a member school.

### **TICKETS AND FAN ADMISSION**

### **TICKETS**

All state golf championship tickets will be sold online at khsaatickets.org via GoFan, the KHSAA's official digital ticket vendor.

Ticket prices are \$10 each per day, plus electronic transaction fees that are not received by the KHSAA.

Children five-and-under will be admitted free, but must still "purchase" the free ticket through GoFan.

Fans should purchase their tickets before they arrive to facilitate entry and minimize congregation of those waiting.

No coaches' cards or officials' ID cards will be honored at the gate.

GoFan's training page for buying and validating the tickets is included as a link at the end of these instructions.

There will be no paper tickets sold at the walk-up gate or cash/card sales.

Any on-site transactions will be digital using the personal devices of the customer.

No screenshots of tickets will be honored at any time.

### **FAN ADMISSION**

All spectators must have their tickets validated by KHSAA staff at the tents en route to holes #1 and #10.

### **ADMISSION INTO VENUE**

### **TEAM ENTRY**

Golfers will check in daily with the starters.

### **VENUE LOGISTICS**

### **DRESSING/LOCKER ROOMS**

Due to limited space, the locker rooms inside the Bowling Green Country Club will not be utilized.

Participants should arrive at the venue dressed and ready to compete.

### **TEAM AREAS**

There are no designated team areas at the country club.

### **WATER - COVID-19 GUIDANCE**

Participants are reminded to bring their own water bottles or use disposable single wax-lined cups.

Water bottles should not be shared.

### **BALLOONS/NOISEMAKERS**

Artificial noisemakers, portable sound systems and balloons are not permitted at the course.

### **ROSTERS, PAIRINGS, FORMAT**

### **POSTSEASON ROSTERS**

Schools have previously logged into the KHSAA website and designated the postseason roster, which is separate from the regular-season varsity roster.

Roster revisions had to be made before the first date of the postseason when online rosters were closed and considered final.

Only players appearing on the school's postseason roster as of the first date of the postseason are eligible to participate in any round.



This postseason roster serves as the required eligibility listing for the team in the event of a permitted substitution.

This roster information is also used for advance preparations for state qualifying teams or individuals.

### **SUBSTITUTIONS**

Any golfer listed on the postseason roster may be a substitute on a qualifying team prior to the start of the first round of the state tournament, provided they meet all participation requirements.

There will be no substitutes for individual qualifiers.

If an individual withdraws, the golfer with the next lowest regional score not on the winning team may be substituted prior to the first-round pairings being set, a change that must be made and verified by the respective Region Manager.

Once first-round pairings are set, no further entry revisions may be made.

Schools must contact KHSAA Communications and Social Media Director Dan White (dwhite@khsaa.org) if there are any substitutions, which must all comply with the Competition Rules.

### **PAIRINGS**

For the first round, golfers will be grouped in threesomes based on their regional team/individual scores.

Second-round pairings will be in foursomes and will be made at the close of the first 18 holes of tournament play based upon first round scores.

A link to the pairings templates for both rounds is included at the end of these instructions.

### **FORMAT**

The championships utilize stroke play and are made up of 36 total holes with 18 played each day.

Team scores will be determined by taking the lowest four (4) scores of the five-player team for each round.

In the event of inclement weather, the format may be shortened to 18 holes by the Association.

### CUT

All qualifying teams will participate in both rounds.

For individual participants, there will be a cut after the first round of each championship.

The lowest 42 individual participants not on a qualifying team, including ties, will advance to the second day.

### **TIEBREAKER**

The procedure for breaking ties in both team and individual competition is outlined in the Competition Rules which are included as a link at the end of these instructions.

### **RULES POINTS OF EMPHASIS/CLARIFICATIONS**

### **GOLF GENIUS SCORE REPORTING**

Players are required to utilize the Golf Genius scoring application for posting hole by hole scores during each competition round. One player will be designated to digitally post all players' scores in their pairing group.

In the event that hole-by-hole scores are not being posted on Golf Genius, the designated player will receive one warning, followed by one-stroke penalties for each additional infraction.

### **REQUIRED BALL**

Option condition, as prescribed in Appendix I of the Hard Card, shall be in effect.

### **COURSE SPECIFICATIONS**

The course must be set up for boys at no less than 6,200 yards and no greater than 6,800 yards.

The course must be set up for girls at no less than 5,000 yards and no greater than 5,700 yards.

Golf carts will be permitted for rules and tournament officials only.

Spectator carts shall be limited to only those with verified mobility impairments during competition days.





No personal coolers will be allowed on the course, including having coolers on golf carts that may be issued to handicapped spectators.

No pets will be allowed on the course.

### **PLAYING RULES**

USGA Rules, with possible KHSAA modifications, will govern the competition.

The Tournament Committee will determine the conditions under which play will be held and any modifications will be discussed at the rules meetings.

### **PACE OF PLAY**

A pace of play video series and tee time/pace of play charts have been published on the KHSAA website and are included as links at end of these instructions.

Rules officials will assess penalties accordingly for failure to adhere to the guidelines.

### **HARD CARD**

Review the KHSAA Hard Card which is provided as a link at the end of these instructions.

The card contains the coaching advice rule, rules for distance measuring devices and restrictions in regard to communication devices, among other key items.

### **APPROPRIATE DRESS**

Participants and coaches MUST be appropriately dressed during the practice and tournament rounds per American Junior Golf Association guidelines.

### **CARRY/CART RULE**

Each golfer shall carry his/her own clubs or pull a cart.

### STATE EVENT OFFICIALS

KGA Rules Officials will mark the course and be responsible for all rulings.

### **COURSE ADMINISTRATORS**

Administrators attending the championships are encouraged to assist in assuring that their fans and spectators adhere to the 30-yard rule.

Should an issue arise, contact a member of the KHSAA staff or member of the KGA rules staff.

### **HEALTH INFORMATION**

### ATHLETIC TRAINERS

The Association will use the services of UK Healthcare to provide trainers for the state golf championships.

Athletic training staff will be available beginning 30 minutes prior to the event in their tent near the clubhouse.

### PHYSICAL EXAM FORM

Schools are reminded that they are responsible for ensuring parental permission to seek medical treatment is authorized for each participant.

- The Principal, Athletic Director or Head Coach can use a copy of KHSAA Form GE04 (Physical Exam Form) for this purpose.
- The form contains appropriate emergency treatment permission and should be brought for each athlete at the competition.

### **VENUE SAFETY**

Persons who attend KHSAA events may be injured as a result of the risks inherent in being a spectator at such events.

Please advise KHSAA or venue personnel of any situation you encounter which you or a team member feels should be addressed to minimize risk to all involved.

Any crowd control problems or acts of violence should be brought to the attention of the event staff, which will contact the



appropriate authorities.

Attendance at events is a vital family and community based activity which is encouraged.

### **EMERGENCY ACTION PLAN**

KHSAA staff will, in consultation with the athletic training staff and venue personnel, develop an Emergency Action Plan (EAP) for this event and the plan will be available upon arrival from the athletic training staff.

If an athlete or fan is in need of emergency medical attention, contact the nearest KHSAA staff member, official, UK Healthcare trainer or venue staff so emergency medical services can be reached.

An AED will be located at the KHSAA headquarters.

### **INCLEMENT WEATHER PROCEDURES**

In the event of inclement weather, it is the duty of the KHSAA, in consultation with the Bowling Green Country Club and KGA Rules Official, to make decisions in regard to postponement, rescheduling or cancelation, including getting proper notification to all teams, media outlets and schools.

Competition must be delayed at the first sight of lightning or sound of thunder and the site should be cleared of all persons immediately by event administration.

In the event the course is cleared, participants and spectators are advised to return to their vehicles due to social distancing concerns.

If it is anticipated that the storm will pass, the competition may be resumed no sooner than 30 minutes after the last sight of lightning or the last sound of thunder.

The Heat Index Program, as posted on the KHSAA website, will be followed by officials as well in conjunction with the certified athletic trainer hired to work the event in monitoring of the Heat Index.

Staff will utilize the KHSAA website and Twitter to provide updates as well as an emergency text notification system.

The safety of the public and participants will be the most important factor in any decision.

### **SPORTSMANSHIP**

The KHSAA requires officials to enforce sportsmanship rules.

High school athletics emphasize positive values and all parties have worked hard to create a sense of teamwork, respect, responsibility and perspective. We encourage and appreciate your help in letting this competition reflect mutual respect among all participants and officials.

Unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated. This includes abusive language, profanity, taunting, club throwing or misuse of club facilities. There shall be no consumption of alcohol, illicit drug use, smoking (including e-cigarettes) or other use of tobacco products, gambling, or conduct deemed unsportsmanlike by the tournament officials. Golfers and/or coaches are subject to disqualification or multiple stroke penalties for conduct violations.

### MEDIA AND INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

### **GENERAL MEDIA RIGHTS**

At all levels of competition during postseason play, control of media access and location at those contests is with the KHSAA, and as such, there are necessary policies and restrictions concerning this event and these provisions will be vigorously enforced.

The intellectual property, corporate, broadcasting and media rights to all postseason rounds belong exclusively to the KHSAA, including titling agreements and sponsorships.

Control of media access and location at all levels of postseason play is with the KHSAA.

At all levels of KHSAA sponsored postseason events, including district, regional, semi-state, guarterfinal and state competition, allowances shall be made for television media to record video of the contests, without play by play, at no charge as long as the sole purpose is for newscast highlights.

At all levels of KHSAA sponsored postseason events, including district, regional, semi-state, quarterfinal and state competition, allowances shall be made for other media outlets to be admitted to the contests as long as the sole purpose is for reporting of the actions taking place at the contest and promoting the event.



Participating teams in KHSAA events shall be allowed to record the contest, for coaching purposes only, if space is available with such availability at the discretion of the KHSAA and may be required to sign a waiver indicating that the KHSAA shall be held blameless for any and all liability to those parties involved in the video recording.

Any video recording must not violate existing, acknowledged, written copyright protection or intellectual property agreements and cannot be broadcast in any form, including internet and social media.

If space is deemed available, the KHSAA has the right to designate a specific area for video recording and no video recording will be allowed outside of that area.

The determination of space availability is solely with the KHSAA and shall be equitable for all teams.

A freelance/commercial photographer is any person, including a school employee, not representing an established media outlet or a person who will capture images from the event and re-sell them to anyone, including team members, the families or the general public.

### **COVID-19 MEDIA RESTRICTIONS AND CONSIDERATIONS**

Media access may be limited, especially if there are capacity limits.

Interview opportunities may be limited during the week.

Disseminate as much information online as possible (limit handouts).

Incorporate easily identifiable credentials to ensure only authorized personnel are in restricted areas.

Interviews should only be conducted if social distancing protocols can be followed.

### **SCHOOL MEDIA CREDENTIALS**

Each school is permitted one (1) school media pass at KHSAA State Championship events, valid only for a student or full-time school employee, for the sole purpose of reporting the events for school internal publications.

Outside entities such as professional photographers, videographers or parents may not utilize the school media pass.

The school media pass may not be used for taking pictures that will later be sold as these individuals need to apply for a freelance/commercial photographer pass and pay the requisite fee.

This pass must be requested in advance of the start of the event through the online system using Form SI103 which is included as a link at the end of these instructions.

### TRADITIONAL MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Traditional media members (print, TV, radio, online) interested in covering KHSAA State Championship events should apply for credentials through the KHSAA's online system. A link to the credential application is included at the end of these instructions.

The deadline to apply is Friday, Oct. 1 at 5 p.m. ET.

Applications should be submitted by the editor or director at each organization.

Complete information should be submitted for all attendees (including unique email addresses and cell phone numbers), as the KHSAA will use these methods to communicate information surrounding the event.

### Media outlets may be limited during this event.

Freelance/commercial photographers, as defined herein, will not be granted access to KHSAA events unless the requisite media rights fee is paid.

### TEAM BROADCASTS

By paying the requisite fee, each school qualifying for a KHSAA State Championship event may designate one (1) radio station or website to originate an AUDIO-only broadcast of each match its affiliated school participates in.

An official representative of the participating school shall designate to the KHSAA which station/website will be permitted to broadcast its game using SI113 (School Audio Broadcast Designation Form).

The radio station/website shall then apply for championship credentials through the KHSAA's online credentialing system.

Originating stations/websites will be subject to a media rights fee, which will be outlined through the online credentialing system.



### **MEDIA RIGHTS FEE**

Freelance/commercial photographers as defined in these instructions and radio stations interested in originating a broadcast of a KHSAA State Championship event are subject to a media rights fee.

Information regarding the fee for each event is available through the online credentialing system.

### TELECAST/WEBCAST INCLUDING NFHS NETWORK RESTRICTIONS

The KHSAA is a full member of the NFHS Network and as such, restrictions exist on all postseason levels.

A telecast, as used in these instructions, is a video, live or delayed account, including play by play, of any contest over the air.

A webcast, as used in these instructions, is a video, live or delayed account, including play by play, of any contest distributed using the internet.

The KHSAA is the only entity permitted to produce live or delayed video from state championship events including semi-state, quarterfinal and state rounds, and is the sole authority for approval of any other.

No entity, unless given prior approval by the KHSAA shall be permitted to produce video telecasts or broadcasts, with the exception of approved media outlets solely recording highlights for news use.

No entity, including media members, may stream live video content during postseason events including the use of social media products such as Facebook® Live.

The mandated minimum fee schedule will be published annually by the Commissioner's office on the KHSAA website.

For all postseason play, all questions regarding live or delayed broadcast or telecast policies, including requests for approval shall be referred to the Communications Director for approval by the Commissioner.

### **MUSIC COPYRIGHT**

KHSAA schools are reminded to adhere to all music copyright laws.

### **FILMING**

External power sources may not be used by patrons.

Spectators may film with a hand-held camera from the spectator area, but may not in any manner transmit live video through any resource, including personal social media accounts.

Violators are subject to removal.

### **EVENT MERCHANDISE**

KHSAA State Championship apparel will be available for sale at the event and online post event.

TeamIP is the exclusive vendor of championship apparel, please look for their display at the competition to purchase memorabilia.

No outside merchandise representative of the event may be produced by any other entity and sold or distributed at the championship venue.
