SECRETARY'S REPORT

To Members of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association for the year 1930-31:

To correct the error in the 1930-31 booklet, it should be stated that the Heath High School was the State Champion for boys' basket ball in the State for the year 1929.

Our membership for this year is 519, which includes the following: 35 new members, and 484 old members, 102 of which paid reinstatement fee, 84 on last year's list and 14 reinstated from previous years. 18 members on last year's list did not renew their membership. Eight approved schools made inquiries about membership and fees, but for various reasons did not come in; two schools that applied were rejected because they were not approved by the Department of Education. Two of the three schools that were suspended last year were reinstated by special agreement last fall. Two schools were suspended this year (Bardstown and Taylorsville).

The district alignments which were readjusted last year seem to have been satisfactory; however, there is still one change that should be made as soon as road conditions will permit: Clay County into the 26th district, if agreeable, when roads in Laurel County permit.

The books for 1929-30 were audited and the accounts were verified, found to be in good order, as shown in the annual report that was sent out last October.

We had hoped to send the state tournament checks before the annual meeting, but as usual there were one or two schools that failed to send in reports until the last moment, and no settlement could be made until all reports were in. We have just made settlement with Daddy Boles; the state tournament lacked \$693.95 of having enough to pay all expenses. The amounts paid will be 74.7 per cent of the claims submitted and allowed by Mr. Boles. Checks will be mailed this week. As has been done in the past, we will send out soon after the annual meeting, minutes, treasurer's report, secretary's report, tournament financial reports, and the report of the various tournaments, listing the winners in the districts and regions.

For the first time in the history of the association a school that had incurred a penalty refused to accept it. This school obtained a temporary injunction in the Franklin Circuit Court restraining the Board of Control from suspending it. The suspension had been ordered by the Board of Control on the ground that a man had been allowed to continue playing in three football games after the question of his age had been raised and it did not appear that the principal had exercised reasonable diligence in investigating the records, which were easily accessible, and which plainly showed the boy to be ineligible. The case was carried by the Board of Control to the Court of Appeals, which reversed the lower court, and held that decisions of the Board of Control, so long as they follow the rules of the association, can not be set aside by the courts. This decision firmly establishes the association, whereas, if the decision had been adverse, the association would have been compelled to disband, since it could not have enforced its rules.

There have been five meetings of the Board of Control this year; two meetings were called, and the remaining three were arranged by the members of the Board at times when other business matters brought them within range of each other, so as to save extra expense for the Kentucky High School Athletic Association. Minutes of these meetings have been sent out at various times.

The rulings and interpretations sent out by the president in September and October will be placed in the 1931-32 booklet.
