I am honored to have been asked to write a letter of recommendation for Mr. William (Bill) Fannin to be considered for the KHSAA Hall of Fame. I have known Bill, or known about Bill, for approximately 50 years. From his high school playing days at Carr Creek, to his college exploits at Cumberland College, to his local independent league playing days as a young man, and finally to his coaching days at Hazard High School. Bill was a terrific high school basketball player and went on to be an absolute star at Cumberland College. His statistics and records as a player at all levels were outstanding. His reputation as a basketball player rivaled any player in the area, he was a legend with most basketball people.

I have been involved with high school athletics for 40 years as a coach, and came to know Bill better in that capacity. During that time I competed against Bill's teams in volleyball, softball, and girls' basketball. We battled for region championships in all three sports and remained friends through it all, and remain friends after his retirement. I have tremendous respect for Bill and what he has accomplished as a high school coach in these three sports. I do not know the numbers of wins and losses during his career, but I always knew his teams would be prepared, they would compete, and they would be respectful and humble regardless of the outcome of the contest. I do know he coached several girls' basketball teams to state titles. His teams were a direct reflection of Bill and his philosophies about high school athletics and competition. He was humble in victory and gracious in defeat, always giving the credit to others when they won.

I don't know all the requirements for being chosen to be in the Hall of Fame, but it's hard for me to imagine that Bill's accomplishments would not meet, and exceed, those requirements. I know there are lots of deserving candidates that apply for this honor each year, but I only know about Bill and what he has done for high school athletics in our area. For that I am proud and honored to recommend William (Bill) Fannin for this honor. I would offer to do anything else necessary to further his consideration to the Hall of Fame.

I am writing a letter of recommendation for William "Bill" Fannin to be inducted into the Dawahares KHSAA Hall of Fame. I have personally known Coach Fannin for many years, he coached when I played at M.C. Napier and now that I am a licensed official, I have officiated many of his games. Coach Fannin has been a wonderful asset to his school, as well as his community.

He coached basketball for 27 years, both boys and girls in this time period, and won a state championship in 1997 with the Hazard Lady Bulldogs. In that same year, he also won an All A State Championship with the same team, in which is almost unheard of. In the following year, 1998, he also won an All A State Championship. Coach Fannin has won several district titles, as well as regional titles in his years of coaching basketball.

Not only was he successful in basketball, Fannin tried his hand at volleyball and softball. He won a regional title in 1995 with the hazard lady bulldogs. In volleyball, he was in the title game several times and won an ALL A Region once as he coached. To do multiple sports in one high school, is very strenuous on one's career, but to be as successful as Coach Fannin was in all sports he coached, is an accomplishment that not many coaches in the state of Kentucky can say they have been involved in.

To date, Coach Fannin has retired from coaching basketball and volleyball, but continues to coach softball with his daughter Candi. I loved playing against Coach Fannin; he was one of the classiest guys I have ever encountered. As well as being one of the most competitive. I have officiated many of his games in all of the sports over the years and I can say that his demeanor on the court, speaks volumes for him and the success he has had coaching.

I think he deserves to be inducted into the Hall of Fame, as successful as he has been in all sports and as successful as his players have been in high school and college, to leave him out of the induction would be a travesty. Even when he does completely retire, his legend of his character and his coaching abilities will live on in the state of Kentucky.

Some other accomplishments that Coach Fannin added to his resume are that in 1995 he was head coach of the Hazard Fastpitch softball team, who won the 14th Region Fastpitch softball tournament and advanced to the state tournament in Hopkinsville. Beginning in 1985 – 2011 , he was head coach of the Hazard Girls' Basketball team, which won three 14th Region championships, a number of All A 14th Region championships, as well as a 1997 State Championship and 1997, 1998 Class A State Championship. In 2001 – Coach Fannin was named head coach of the Hazard Boys' Basketball Team and coached them to a 14th Region Championship, which advanced to play in the Sweet 16 at Rupp Arena. In 2009 – Coach Fannin was head volleyball coach at Hazard and led the volleyball team to their first tournament appearance by winning the first ever All A 14th Regional tournament and advancing to state competition.

Coach Fannin has coached 27 consecutive years at Hazard High School, all which includes 23 years with the girls' basketball program, 4 years with the boys' basketball program, 10 years with the girls' volleyball program, (since its establishment), and 27 years with the softball program. Over the past 27 years, he has started and continued a winning tradition with girls' athletics here at Hazard High School.


I feel that Coach Fannin has continually portrayed professionalism in coaching, as well as been a positive role model for the student-athletes who have played during this time. I have also been associated with Hazard girls' athletics for many years; first as a player and now as an assistant coach to Coach Fannin. When asking anyone who has been associated with Coach Fannin, other coaches, officials and players will agree that he has made a huge impact on the girls' athletic programs at Hazard High School. In doing so, he has done it all with a positive attitude, whether it be practicing, fundraising, teaching or coaching itself. During this time period, Coach Fannin has accumulated many personal awards, as well as team awards and trophies for the programs at Hazard. Since the start of his coaching career, the girls' basketball team has won 3- 14th Regional Championships, 6 Class "A" Regional Championships, 1 Sweet 16 State Championship and 2 Class "A" State Championships. He is only one of two coaches to have won both the State Championship and Class "A" State Championship in the same year, 1997. These awards do not include his personal coaching awards such as 14th Region Coach of the Year and the induction into the Coaches Court of Honor in 2009 by the Kentucky Coaches Association and the accumulation of over 500 career wins.

Aside from girls' basketball, Coach Fannin has also won a KHSAA 14th regional title with the boys' basketball program and a 14th Regional title with the girls' fastpitch softball program. Including the Class "A" volleyball state tournament just last season in 2008, this makes four different sport teams that Coach Fannin has coached into a Kentucky state tournament, something that I am sure he, our school, city and girls' are proud of.

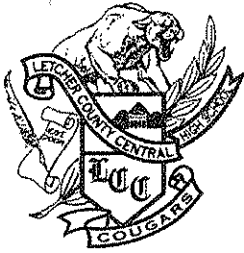

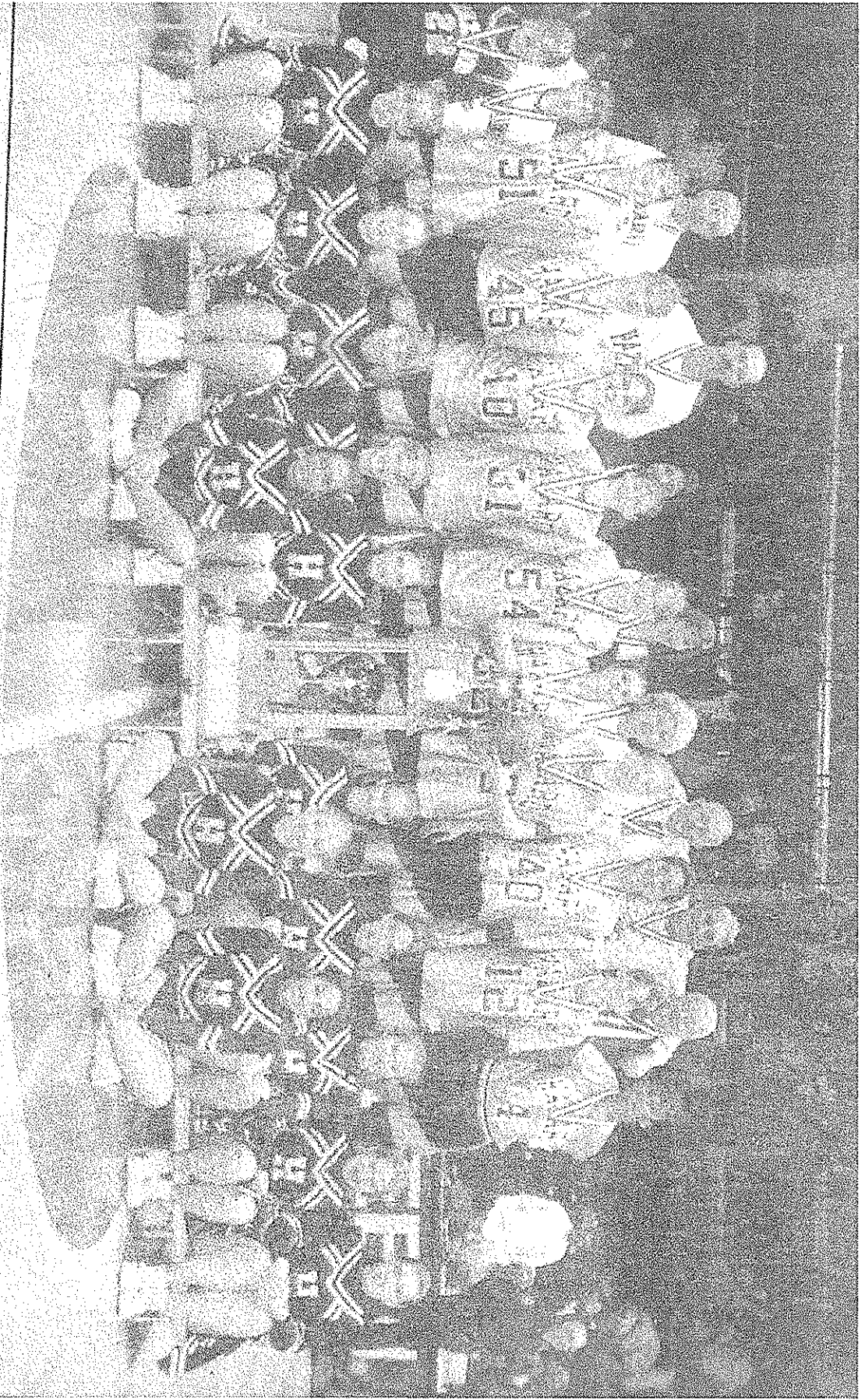

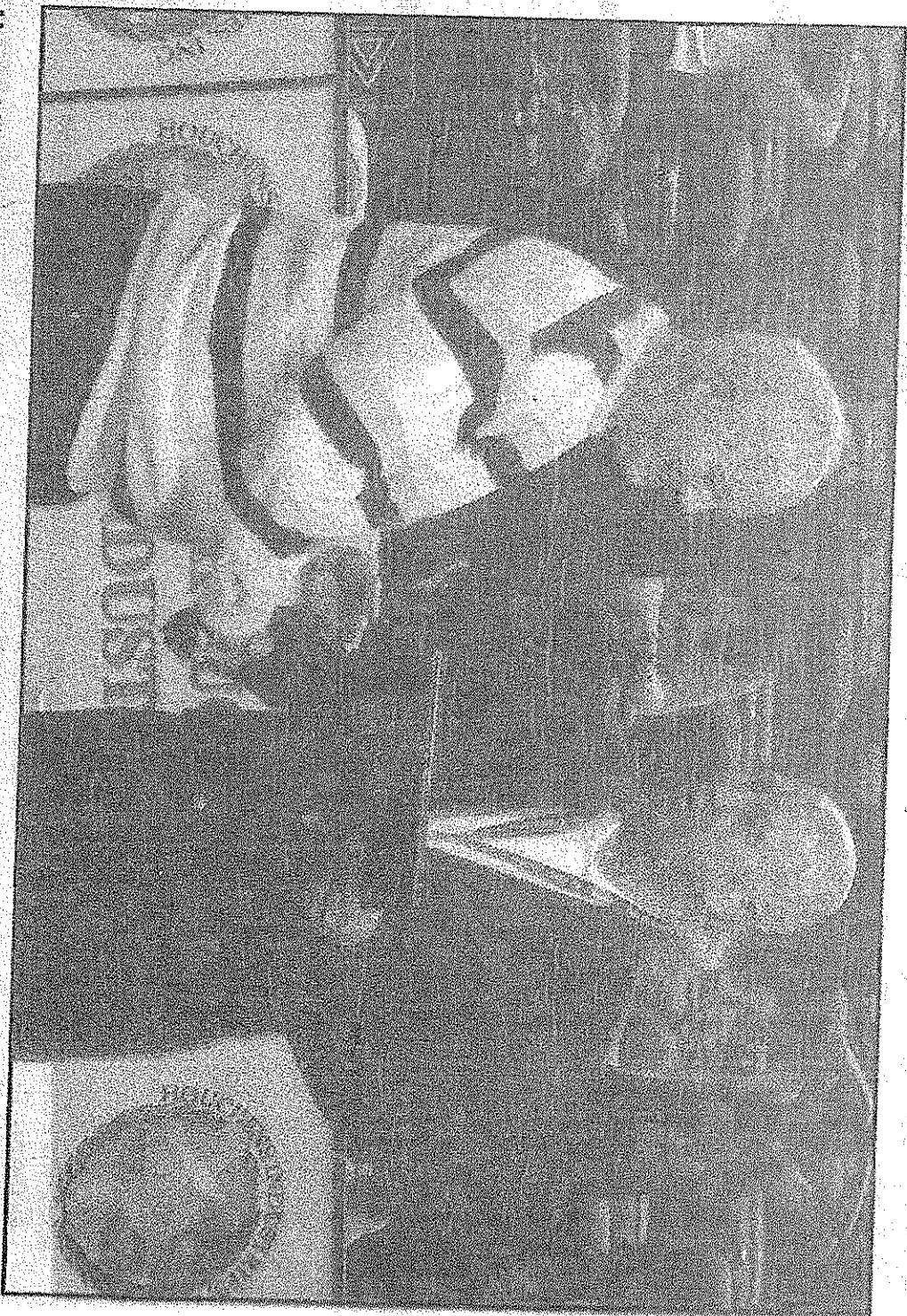
