Ed is currently the Wayne H. Lewis professor of orthopaedic and shoulder surgery, vice chairman and director of adult orthopaedics in the Dept. of Orthopaedic Surgery, and co-director of the Division of Shoulder Surgery at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine in Baltimore, MD.

He also serves as the clinical director of orthopaedic services at Johns Hopkins University at Green Spring Station in Lutherville, MD. He is a consulting team physician for the Baltimore Orioles Major League Baseball Team, and serves as the team physician for the dept. of athletics at Johns Hopkins University.

He was recently named president of the prestigious Association of Bone and Joint Surgery. The group represents leading orthopaedic surgeons in the United States interested in clinical care, research and education. His work in sports medicine research has benefitted sports men and women throughout the U.S., including all of the athletes in Kentucky high school athletics.

In a coaching career of nearly forty years, Ed McFarland is perhaps the most remarkable person I have ever known. In high school, he was an extraordinary student, an exemplary person, a dynamic leader, a fearless competitor, and a truly marvelous football player. He was a winner in everything he did, and his commitment to excellence resonated throughout his teammates and fellow students. At a high school with a storied tradition of great football players, he is among the best to ever play for the Blue Tornado.


He has become a world class orthopaedic surgeon, a leading medical research physician, a humanitarian, and a loving husband and father. I can think of no other person with such depth of talent, good will, genuine humility, and dedication to service.

He has written over 160 peer review articles, 30 non-peer review articles, 20 book chapters in various medical texts, and is the author of a leading medical textbook entitled Examination of the Shoulder - the Complete Guide (2006 Thieme Medical Publisher, NY).
