Rex Robinson

1935-1995

ex Robinson, a fixture around DeSales High School for the past 35 years, lost his 18month battle with cancer and died at his home on Monday, July 17.

Robinson's funeral was held in DeSales' Dodge Gymnasium. Hundreds of former students, colleagues, cheerleaders, players, coaches and friends gathered to honor a man simply known as "Coach."

In honor of his contributions, current members of the various sports teams wore their jerseys and formed an honor guard. Carmelite Fr. Kyrin Caggiano, current DeSales football coach Harold Joyce and Jim Watkins '63 all shared memories of Mr. Robinson. A common theme in describing perhaps the biggest Alabama fan in this part of the country was: his love for his family and for his second family -- DeSales High School.

Rex was described as a "big teddy bear who had a heart even bigger than his physical size."

Perhaps a side of Rex that was seldom seen in public was his gentle and caring nature. "He was like a father to me," said Joe Gries '67.

A former athlete himself, Robinson came to Louisville in 1954 on a football scholarship he earned to the University of Louisville. He played tackle for Coach Frank Camp for four years and was on the school's 1957 Sun Bowl team.


Rex, a native of Huntsville, Alabama, joined DeSales in 1960 as a teacher and assistant football coach. He was the Colts' head football coach for three seasons, beginning in 1969. In 1971 Robinson was named athletic director, a position he held until 1994. Despite his illness, he assisted in the athletic office and was a substitute teacher at DeSales until May.



Robinson helped more than he ever knew

he big man walked uninhibited down the halls, a trail of sweet-smelling smoke usually following. His gait—a slow and steady lope—a menacing stare and that ever-present pipe, made Rex Elmond Robinson more myth than reality to the many freshmen entering DeSales on an annual basis.

Our brothers had painted the pictures: "Rex picked a freshman up by the ears!" Or, "I saw Rex bench press 500 pounds, I swear!" Each year the legend grew bigger and better. Mr. Robinson, as we trepidly called him, soon became a part of world history. He was a Viking, or even one of King Arthur's shining knights.

He intimidated many, including the author, in the early days before any kind of relationship could be struck. It was only natural. Here he was, a man who blocked the sun, and here we were, scared and unproven freshmen worried about making it through the day.

But then, as they say, you can't judge a book by its cover, especially in Rex Robinson's case. He was, and still is, a credit to himself, his family, his children and the school he dearly loved, DeSales.

The odd thing about it all was the fact that Mr. Robinson was more lamb than lion. If his hard stare was captivating, his smile and his laugh were even more so.

Like most who pass through the doors of DeSales, graduate and then move on to college or work, several years passed before Mr. Robinson reemerged in my life.

It was at a football game. He pulled into the stadium, he and his truck, one as big as the other. It was cold, and he was wearing an overcoat and one of those houndstooth hats Bear Bryant, his hero, made famous.

Even after my marriage, three kids, two cats and a dog I noticed Mr. Robinson still commanded respect from everyone who crossed his path. Nothing had changed, even after 15 years. The security guards, ushers and ticket-takers either waved, shook his hand or smiled in his direction. Moses couldn't have been more well received.

He never saw me. High above, I stared through binoculars and watched as that big ferocious man helped two tiny school girls hoist a heavy box onto a table. They thanked him, went on and I could see him say, "You're welcome, ladies." How nice, I thought. Trivial as it may seem, I wish some of you could have seen it. It reminded me of the old saying that a man is biggest when he stoops to help a child, in this case, two girls.

Now that I look back, it wasn't Mr. Robinson's strength at work there. No, it was his heart. And it always was, despite the fictional stories big brother told of him grabbing students by the knot of their ties and holding them from second-story windows.

There were two reasons God gave him that great size: he needed it to carry that great big heart, and also to put a little fear in those DeSales boys who sometimes got out of line.

Rest in peace, Mr. Robinson. Your presence helped us more than you ever knew.
