

When you talk about Stan Steidel, you cover the whole picture of High School Sports. Stan, while spending 35 years at Dayton High School, has been a Coach, School Administrator, State Director in several areas, a promoter of sports, and most of all a kids person. As a head coach for over 30 years, Stan Steidel has led teams in football, basketball, and baseball. He has accumulated over 400 victories in his long career. His honors include the Region Class A Basketball Coach of the Year in 1978, 1980, and 1997, Basketball Coach of the Year in the Northern Kentucky Athletic Conference in 1980, Kentucky Post Basketball Coach of the Year in 1980, Inductee Northern Kentucky High School Hall of Fame in 1988, Outstanding Achievement Award Kentucky High School Coaches Association in 1984, and the Greater Cincinnati Basketball Hall of Fame in 2001.

As a High School Athletic Director for over 30 years, Stan Steidel has been selected two times as the Athletic Director of the year in 1985 and 1992, Athletic Director of the Year Southern Region (12 states) presented at the National Conference of Secondary Schools in 1993, 9th Region Athletic Director of the Year in 1985, 1986, 1988, 1991 and 1992, State Award of Merit, National Interscholastic-Athletic Administrators Association in 1991, Distinguished Award National Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association in 1996, National Federation Citation, National Federation of State High School Association in 1997, SGMA Hero's Award for the state of Kentucky presented by Sporting Goods Manufacturing Association in partnership with the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association in 1997.

In the area of state service, Stan has served as a board member at the Kentucky High School Athletic Directors Association for many years and served a term as President of the Association. Mr. Steidel currently is the chairman of the Associations Legislative Committee. He served as a Kentucky High School Athletic Association Board of Control member for 8 years. He was instrumental in solving some serious financial problems and helping the association get back on strong financial footing. Stan served as Vice President and President of the Board of Control during his tenure. Stan is one of the leaders of a group of educators who are the guiding force behind the Touchstone

Energy – All A Classic. He is quick to remind people that the organization is more than just a basketball tournament. The program includes opportunities for kids in cheerleading, academic team competition, art, music, Jr. ROTC competition and a competitive scholarship program. This year the All A added baseball and softball. The ALL A Classic has given Kentucky kids over \$500,000 in scholarships to attend Kentucky schools. This program helps fulfill the dreams of young student athletes. In 1993, Stan was named one of the 50 most powerful people in Kentucky Sports by (Herald Leader). Two times he has been named Administrator of the Year. Once by the Greater Northern Council of the International Reading Association and once by the Kentucky Council of the International Reading Association.

Stan, in his spare time, has spent over 20 years as a KHSAA Football Assigning Secretary in Northern Kentucky. He played basketball, baseball and ran track at Dayton High School in Dayton, Kentucky. Stan and his wife Louise have three daughters, Melanie, Jennifer, and Elizabeth, and two grandchildren, Paige and Steven.
