


Gordon Bocock has been involved with Track and Cross Country in Kentucky for over 48 years as a participant, coach, official and in an executive capacity. While attending Cumberland College, he **participated** track and cross country for 4 years - a record holder in several distance events. Upon graduation he was named as the Head Track and Cross Country coach at Cumberland College in 1967. Mr. Bocock's college **coaching career** is highlighted by a National Cross Country Championship team (1968), one Track All-American, twice named KIAC Coach of the Year in Track and Cross Country. In 1972, Gordon Bocock became the 1st Track and Cross Country Coach at Pulaski County High School. He is the only coach to win a State Championship on all 3 levels (A, AA, AAA). His teams won 5 state championships in Cross Country, 1 in Track and 3 State Runner-ups in Cross Country. Also, Forty-two (42) Athletes signed for a college scholarship. Gordon Bocock was named Coach of the Year 9 times in Cross Country, 2 times in track, and 1 time in the Fellowship of Christian Athletes organization during his high school coaching career. Mr. Bocock has extended his commitment beyond his retirement from teaching, coaching, and as an Athletic Director to his involvement in the Kentucky Track and Cross Country Coaches Association (**KTCCCA**), Kentucky High School Athletic Association (**KHSAA**), **NCAA** and nationally with the **USATF** organizations. As a track inspector for the KHSAA, Mr. Bocock has been influential in the construction of numerous new track facilities and the improvement of many existing facilities in the state. He has been the Meet Director for the Kentucky State Cross Country and Track State Championship meets (30 years), Assigning Secretary for Officials (16 years) National Federation Track and Cross Country Rules Interpreter and Clinician (12 years), Chief or Assistant Chief Umpire for 70 plus National Track and Field Championship meets, and serves on the **Executive Boards** in various leadership capacities for the KHSAA, KTCCCA, USATF organizations and the 2005-present Olympiad. Gordon Bocock is one of 5 Kentucky Track officials to receive a "USATF National Award for Excellence in Track and Field Officiating" (2005 & 2010). Because of his outstanding work, Mr. Gordon Bocock has been inducted into the Cumberland College Alumni Hall of Fame (2006), KTCCCA Hall of Fame (1989), KHSAA Hall of Fame (2005), and the USATF Hall of Fame (2007). It is only fitting for Gordon Bocock to be inducted into the National High School Athletic Coaches Association (**NHSACA**) Hall of Fame.

I recommend consideration for Gordon Bocock to be inducted into the National High School Athletic Coaches Association Hall of Fame.



1944 –2011**

1944 – September 23 Gordon L. and Alma M. Bocock welcomed a son Gordon Dale at the Milan Hospital in Milan, Indiana.

He spent his pre-school and elementary year growing up in the Southeastern Indiana towns of Dillsboro, Lawrenceburg and Milan. Moved to New Albany, Indiana as a 6th Grader and stayed in the Ohio River town till graduation from New Albany High School in spring of 1963.

1963 – He entered Cumberland College on a Track and Cross Country scholarship from Coach John P. Duke. Later to be coached by Henry Morgan.


