For me, what's even more remarkable is that his teams' accomplishments were achieved in a relatively short coaching career -- 11 years.

Mr. Campbell was held in high regard by his fellow coaches, and his affable personality was one of his best traits.

Adolph Rupp once made the statement, "He keeps his cool on the bench, better than any young coach, I've ever seen."

I trust the committee will give Mr. Campbell every consideration for the honor he so richly deserves.
