### 1984 University of Kentucky Football Season in Review

The 1984 University of Kentucky football team opened with five consecutive victories, faltered against Southeastern Conference powerhouses LSU and Georgia, won three of last four games for an 8-3 record, and upset Wisconsin in the Hall of Fame Bowl while recording the following:

First back-to-back winning seasons since 1976-77.

Second consecutive Hall of Fame bowl bid for first consecutive post-season bids since Paul "Bear" Bryant's Wildcats went to four straight bowls from 1949 to 1952.

First sweep of "away" games since 1912.

Best record since the 1977 team finished 10-1.

Defeated Tennessee in Knoxville for the first time since 1975 and for only the ninth time there in the 79-game series. Beat IU in Bloomington for first time since 1918.

Only six other teams in UK's 94-year football history have won more regular season games: 1904 (9-1), 1907 (9-1-1), 1909 (9-1), 1949 (9-3), 1950 (10-1) and 1977 (10-1). Posting similar 8-3 records were the 1949 and 1976 teams.

The most significant difference between the 1984 team and some other UK teams of the recent past was its refusal to fold in the closing minutes of a game. The '84 Cats were outscored 51-26 by their opponents in the first quarter, but held the edge in the second (75-66), third (75-55) and fourth quarters (72-51).

That was never more evident than in the season finale against Tennessee, when freshman Joe Worley kicked a 34-yard field goal with 2:09 remaining to give UK a 17-12 lead, which the Wildcats refused to relinquish.

A week earlier, a Wildcat rally against Top Ten team Florida fell short as a UK touchdown pass was nulified by a penalty (five men in the backfield) with 1:23 remaining and Florida leading 25-17.

Leading the Wildcats in a high-scoring start that included victories over Kent State (42-0), Indiana (48-14), Tulane (30-26), Rutgers (27-14) and Mississippi State (17-13) was senior tailback-fullback George Adams, who was on his way to becoming UK's all-time seasonal all-purpose runner (1,689 yards) and only the third player in UK history to rush for more than 1,000 yards in a season.

Adams rushed for 106 yards and three touchdowns in the opener, but shared offensive honors with sophomore quarterback Bill Ransdell, who hit 14 of 18 passes for 199 yards and a touchdown. The Wildcats had 477 yards total offense in that game.

Against Indiana, Adams carried the ball 29 times for 145 yards and a touchdown. Sophomore Mark Logan rushed for 104 yards and two touchdowns while freshman Mark Higgs rushed 14 times for 82 yards and a TD. Ransdell was 10 of 18 for 149 yards. However, the big play was furnished by punter/safety Paul Calhoun who ran 47 yards out of punt formation for a touchdown that gave the Wildcats a 38-8 lead midway of the third quarter.

Adams scored two touchdowns in the first half against Tulane, but the Wildcats trailed the Greenies, 17-14, and made it 17-17 with a 46-yard field goal by Jim Rider as the first half ended. Late in the third quarter, Matt Stein recovered a fumbled punt in the Tulane end zone for a touchdown that gave UK a 24-17 lead. Tulane scored just before the quarter ended, but missed the try for point. Tony Wood

kicked a 53-yard field goal for a 26-24 Tulane lead in the fourth quarter, but the Wildcats drove 80 yards in nine plays, with Adams diving over from the two for a 30-26 victory. Adams gained 143 yards and scored three TDs in that game.

Higgs rushed for 116 yards on four carries, including second half touchdowns of 29 and 76 yards, to lift UK to a thrilling 27-14 homecoming win over Rutgers before a Commonwealth Stadium record crowd of 58,010 fans. Adams gained 114 yards and scored a TD in that game.

The Wildcats rallied twice from second-half deficits to defeat Mississippi State, 17-13, at Starkille. A key play came early in the fourth quarter, with the Bulldogs leading 13-10 and UK facing a fourth-and-one in its own 26. Calhoun saw an opening and rushed 24 yards out of punt formation for a first down. That kept alive a drive that ended with George Adams carrying into the end zone for a UK win.

The Wildcats turned over the ball nine times as they suffered their first loss of the season to LSU 36-10. The Tigers broke the game open in the second half as Dalton Hilliard tallied four TDs to go with his game-high 164 yards rushing. Sophomore Kevin Dooley entered the game in the third quarter, leading the Wildcats to their only TD drive, which ended with a one-yard dive by Adams.

The Wildcat defense held Georgia's high-scoring offense in check for the first 25 minutes of the game, trailing only 3-0 with 1:31 remaining before intermission. With the Buldogs on the UK 16, Kentucky forced a Georgia fumble, but the ball was picked up by Bulldog tight end Scott Williams and carried into the end zone. The Wildcats never recovered from that shock.

Kentucky was assured of its second winning season in a row after rolling over North Texas State, 31-7. Adams gained 144 yards and scored a TD while Ransdell passed for 196 yards and a TD. The Wildcat secondary held the Eagles to 106 aerial yards. Calhoun, Tony Mayes and Brian Williams each had an interception.

In what Coach Jerry Claiborne called one of his team's best performances, the Wildcats took a major step toward their second straight bowl bid by dominating offenseminded Vanderbilt, 27-18, on a rainy day in Commonwealth Stadium. Mark Higgs sprinted 84 yards on the opening play of the second half for a TD that gave the Wildcats a 21-13 lead that they never relinquished. Higgs carried 20 times for 128 yards. Adams rushed for only 60 yards, but he caught six passes for 62 yards. Ransdell passed for 195 yards and two TDs.

Florida held Adams to 60 yards rushing and the Wildcats to 71 yards rushing, but Ransdell hit 18 of 35 passes for 189 yards and two TDs. Bobby Raymond kicked six field goals for the Gators, tying a Southeastern Conference record.

Adams gained 110 yards and scored two touchdowns rushing against Tennessee to put him over the 1,000-yard mark (1,085) and give him a UK record 84 points in a season. With 13 TDs rushing, he also tied a UK record. Tennessee's great runner, Johnnie Jones, gained 128 yards rushing, but Adams caught two passes for 21 yards and returned two kickoffs 34 yards to win the all-purpose honors.

Later the following week. Adams treated his offensive linemen to a steak dinner.





**Dermontti Dawson** (born June 17, 1965 in Lexington, Kentucky) is a former American NFL center, who played his entire career with the Pittsburgh Steelers. He attended Bryan Station High School in Lexington, where he was a nationally-ranked track and field performer in the discus and shot put. During his junior year, he joined the football team as a favor to his friends, where he was successful as a center. Although he had still planned to attend college on a track scholarship, recruiters at the University of Kentucky convinced him to attend on a football scholarship.

Dawson was picked by the Steelers in the second round of the 1988 NFL draft, playing on the offensive line alongside Mike Webster, from whom he took over the role of starting center the next year. He soon became one of the most respected players among the Steelers, and one of the best at his position. His friendly demeanor earned him the nickname Ned Flanders, after the character from The Simpsons. He played in seven Pro Bowls. Dawson played 171 consecutive games, until severe hamstring injuries forced him to sit out in 1999

He might also be well known for a single bad play during Super Bowl XXX against the Dallas Cowboys. Dawson, who also played at long snapper, accidentally snapped the football over quarterback Neil O'Donnell's head, which led to a huge loss on that set of plays.

Now retired, Dawson lives in Lexington, and owns a chain of laundromats. He is married, with two children.



LEXINGTON, Ky. --- Dermontti Dawson, an All-Southeastern Conference guard at Kentucky and one of the greatest centers in the history of the National Football League, will have his number 57 UK jersey retired during the season-opening game vs. Louisville on Sept. 1. The announcement was made by Larry Ivy, UK Director of Athletics, at the annual UK Kickoff Luncheon held Friday at the Hyatt Regency Hotel.

Dawson's story is that of the hometown hero. He is a product of Lexington's Bryan Station High School, where he was an all-state lineman. He played guard and center at UK. He was a four-year letterman from 1984-87 and played for the '84 Hall of Fame Bowl championship team. He was named All-SEC following his senior season and was a second-round draft choice of the Pittsburgh Steelers.

Dawson achieved national acclaim during his 13-year pro career, all spent with the Steelers from 1988-2000. He was a seven-time Pro Bowl selection from 1992-98. His effectiveness was matched by his durability, as he played in 170 consecutive games, the secondlongest streak in Steelers' history. He played in 184 total games in his career, the fifth-highest mark in team history.

"This is a big honor and I'm very excited," Dawson said. "When I heard about it, I was really shocked, but very happy. This is one of those unexpected things that come along. Not a lot of players get their jerseys retired."

Dawson is happy to be back in Lexington on a more permanent basis. He has maintained an off-season home here with his wife Distracted watching football?

Regina (also a UK grad) and their two children.

"It's nice to be back. It's the first time since college that I've been in Lexington full-time," Dawson said. "I haven't been able to keep up with UK football in person and I'm looking forward to that."

When reflecting on his UK playing career, thoughts of one man come to the forefront of Dermontti's mind -- Coach Jerry Claiborne.

"I thank Coach Claiborne for what he did while I was at UK," Dawson said. "Coach Claiborne talked about two things all the time -- character and discipline. I've tried to carry those things with me. He inspired me to play my best and be the best person I could be."

Dawson becomes the 45<sup>th</sup> former Wildcat player or coach to have his jersey retired.
