

Kentucky's all-time leading scorer with 153.

Lowman, an attacking midfielder, received the maximum first-place votes by area coaches.

"I don't know what else I can say about her," said Ashland coach E. B. Lowman, who is Sarah's father. "She's without question the finest player I ever had the privilege to coach."

Sarah scored a state-record 53 goals as a junior. She led Ashland in scoring all four seasons.

Last week, Lowman finished fifth in voting by state coaches for the Miss Kentucky soccer award.

Lowman was a first-team All-State selection for the third consecutive year and led Ashland to the District 20 championship.

The All-Area team was started four years ago and Lowman is the first player to be chosen every year.

E.B. Lowman, who guided Ashland to the Region 8 Tournament, was selected by his peers as Coach of the Year for the third time in four years. Ashland went 11-9 this season against the toughest schedule in school history.

"I've been fortunate to have some great teams and great players," he said. "I really feel blessed."

Ashland, Russell and Rowan County each landed four players on the All-Area team.

Lowman was joined by teammates Abby Mueller, Hilary Vance and Colleen Mahan — all seniors.

Mueller, named to the All-State second team, is a two-time All-Area selection. She started four years including the last two as a midfielder.

"Abby has one of the best work ethics of any player I've coached," E.B. Lowman said. "She's a tough competitor. The more physical the other team would become, the more she liked it."

Vance played several positions during her four years as a starter. She was hampered by a knee problem this season but went on to share the team's Best Defensive Player award with Mahan.

"Colleen was one of the best defenders, if not the best, in the district," her coach said.

Russell, district runner-up and a team of the future, placed three sophomores and a freshman on the All-Area team.

Freshman Sheena Ferguson tied a school record with 22 goals this season.

"We put a lot of pressure on Sheena and she really came through," said first-year Russell coach Joe Grizzle.

Sophomore goal keeper Alycen Jobe broke a Russell season record with 162 saves. She received second-team All-State honors.

"Without her back there, I don't know how the season would have gone," Grizzle said.

Sweeper Amanda Wilcox was also a mainstay on defense. Brittini Davis, another sophomore, had eight goals,

three assists and was an excellent marking defender.

Three-time All-Area selection Evangeline Iwu led the way for Rowan County. Iwu collected 19 goals and seven assists as a senior in garnering first-team All-State recognition for the second year in a row.

"We're really going to miss her," said Rowan County coach Rick Ochsner.

Goal keeper Anna Stokes, stopper Kally Kappes and sweeper Corrissa Madden also represent the Lady Vikings on the All-Area team.

Stokes, the team captain, overcame a back problem to earn All-Area honors for the second consecutive season. She was also named second team All-State.

"Anna was very instrumental in what we did this year," Ochsner said.

Rowan County also received strong defensive efforts from Kappes, a junior, and Madden, a sophomore.

Greenup County senior midfielder Karen Snoddy played well for a team that won three games.

# Two Lady Devils earn all state recognition

**FLATWOODS** -The future of Russell soccer appears to be on the rise as a pair of Lady Devil underclassmen received all state recognition.

Sophomore Alycen Jobe was named second team all-state, while freshman Sheena Ferguson received honorable mention.

Jobe's rise to all-state is a bit phenomenal. She started her soccer career only three years ago. As an eighth grader she joined the Russell Middle School team.

"This girl told me not to put her at goalie...she said she didn't want to play goalie," Coach Joe Grizzle said.

The coach said he noticed Jobe blocking every shot fired at her while the girls were just playing around and decided she was a natural.

She set a school record by stopping 162 games this season, easily beating Jennifer Best's old record of 134 saves. Her efforts in net also earned Jobe all-region for the second year and all-area for the 1999 season.

"Alycen will be a junior next year and we are expecting another great season from her," Grizzle said.

In contrast to Jobe, Ferguson has been a soccer junkie almost all her life. She started playing in the first grade and has been

scoring goals ever since.

"This girl has just always had the instinct to put the ball in the back of the net," Grizzle said.

Ferguson established herself as one of the rising offensive stars in the state as she scored 22 goals last season to match the school record previously held by former Lady Devil first team all-stater Brooke Walters.

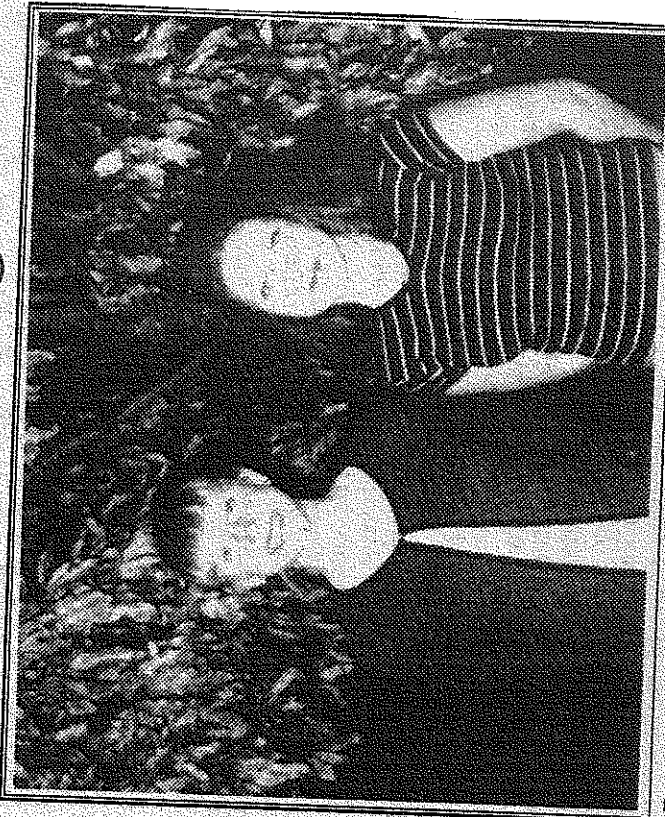
Ferguson established a school record for goals in a game. She found the net seven times against Boyd County, even though she saw limited action in the second half. Four other goals came in the opening 10 minutes. Walters held the former record with five.

In addition to honorable mention all-state, Ferguson was named all-district and all-area.

"Sheena will be a sophomore next year and we are expecting another great season from her as well," Grizzle said.

With only four seniors and no juniors on the 1999 team, things look bright for the Lady Devils, especially over the next two seasons.

"This young team of sophomores and freshmen should start shaping up into a pretty good team next season," Coach Grizzle said. "We also have some younger players coming up from middle school that will contribute."

Russell High School soccer standout Sheena Ferguson overcame an injury to repeat as a first team All-State selection.

Ferguson, a junior, missed four games and played through pain in several others due to a deep bone bruise about her knee.

Even so, Ferguson man-

aged to accumulate 33 goals and 10 assists in leading Russell to a 15-6 record and its second consecutive district championship.

"To me, that tells a whole lot about Sheena's character," said Russell coach Joe Grizzle. "She didn't want anybody to know she was hurt. She handled all that pain and played through it."

# Ferguson repeats as Player of Year

Russell junior Sheena Ferguson is difficult to stop on the soccer field.

And even harder to keep off it.

Ferguson overcame a painful knee injury to repeat as Player of the Year on *The Daily Independent's* All-Area Girls Soccer Team.

Ferguson had 33 goals, 10 assists and helped lead Russell to a district championship. All that despite a sprained knee ligament and deep bone bruise that hampered Ferguson through nine games and caused her to miss four others.

"It was really bad," Ferguson said. "I can say that now. It almost got to where I couldn't get out of bed."

Ferguson suffered the injury in Russell's fifth game of the season against Huntington High.

"I was shooting the ball and their goal keeper fell on it," Ferguson recalled. "At first, I thought I just hyper-extended it."

Russell coach Joe Grizzle said Ferguson played through pain that would have stopped most players.

"I finally had to make her go to the doctor," Grizzle said. "She's such a tough

competitor."

After a doctor's visit in Lexington, Ferguson showed up later that afternoon for Russell's game at East Jessamine.

"She was wearing her uniform under her sweats and tried to talk her way into the game," Grizzle said. "That's how much she loves to play."

Ferguson returned for post-season play and Russell rolled to the district title. The Red Devils finished 15-6.

"We had a good year until the end," Sheena said of a 1-0 loss to Rowan County in the regional tournament. "I think you get nervous when you're the defending champion."

Ferguson, who has 111 career goals at Russell, received first team All-State honors for the second year in a row. She was also named MVP for the East squad in the East-West All-Star Game.

Ferguson edged senior teammate Brittini Davis for the area Player of the Year award.

Davis had a terrific season with 19 goals and 26 assists. She was a second team All-State selection for the second consecutive year.

"Brittini worked really hard and had a great career," Ferguson said. "It's sad that we're losing so many seniors. After the last game, it showed how much the team cared about each other."

Davis was among four Russell seniors voted to the All-Area squad by area coaches. Grizzle repeated as Coach of the Year.

"It's a really nice honor," Grizzle said. "These girls have achieved a lot. It's difficult for me because we're losing 11 seniors and about eight of those I've coached since they were 9 or 10 years old."

Over the past two seasons, Russell racked up 36 victories and a regional championship to go with a pair of district titles.

Russell also landed Amanda Wilcox, Alycen Jobe and Erin Faulkner on the All-Area squad.

# Russell's Ferguson shines for East team

Sheena Ferguson, already recognized as a first team All-State soccer player this season, gave further evidence of her talent in the East-West All-Star Game Saturday.

Ferguson received Most Valuable Player honors for the East squad in a 2-0 defeat at Lexington Catholic High School.

"I'm extremely happy for Sheena," said Russell coach Joe Grizzle. "She's an outstanding player and works so hard."

South Oldham won its fourth consecutive state title.



# Ferguson takes aim at state record

Russell standout opens season with 27 goals in five games

**RUSSELL** — Russell senior Sheena Ferguson's bid to become the leading scorer in Kentucky girls' soccer history is in overdrive.

With an eye-popping 27 goals in the first five games this season, Ferguson needs only 15 to tie record-holder Sarah Lowman. The former Ashland standout, now playing at Transylvania University, finished her high school career with 153 goals. Ferguson and Russell both

shattered state single-game records last week. Ferguson scored 13 goals in 55 minutes as the Red Devils rolled to a 27-0 victory over West Carter, a first-year varsity program.

Russell surpassed the old state record by seven goals, while Ferguson broke the individual mark of 10 goals set by Lowman against Boyd County in 1999.

"Sheena was awesome," said teammate April Evans. "We didn't try to run the score up."

## Ahead

Russell's girls team will be previewed in Wednesday's edition.

Ferguson just happens to be one of the state's best finishers.

"Everybody passed the ball," she said. "Nobody on this team cares to give it up. I didn't go into the game thinking state record."

Ferguson played the first 20 minutes, then went to the bench with the rest of Russell's starters. She resumed her scoring spree in the second half.

"I didn't realize it until somebody on the bench said Sheena

had eight or nine goals," said Russell coach Joe Grizzle. "Somebody said they thought the record was 10. I thought it was 12. I had told Sheena she didn't need to shoot anymore. When we saw she was close, we told her to go ahead and break it."

West Carter even complimented Russell after the blowout.

"West Carter was real gracious," Grizzle said. "They had a coach come over after the game

and tell our girls it was the best sportsmanship of any team they had played. He said we were a class act. I have all the respect in the world for West Carter."

Ferguson's huge performance left her well within striking distance of Lowman's all-time record.

"With Sheena's work ethic, and what she's done for the program, she deserves to have a shot at it," Grizzle said. "The girl lives and breathes soccer."

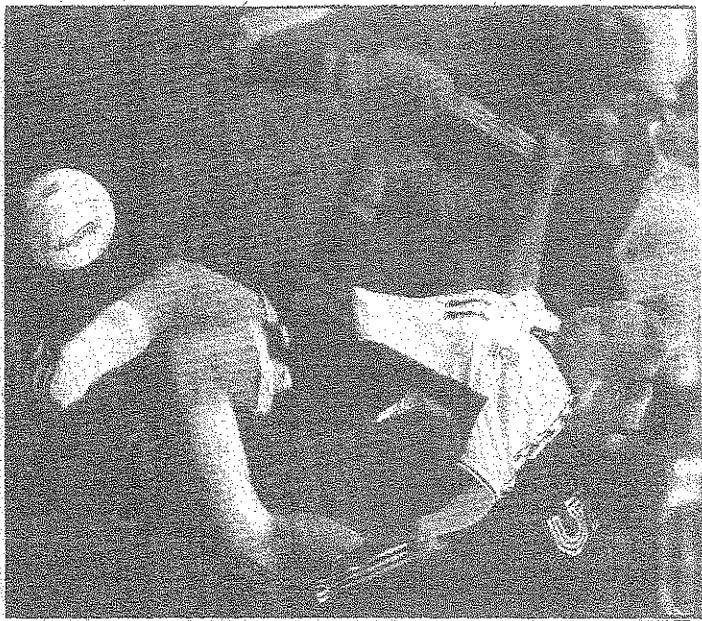
Grizzle called Ferguson a legitimate candidate for Kentucky's Miss Soccer award.

"Everyone we have played says she is the best player they have seen," Grizzle said.

Ferguson, a first-team All-State selection the past two years, is more excited about Russell's 4-1 start than her own success.

"It's cool," she said. "Nobody was expecting anything, but it's working out. We lost more than half our starters from last year, but we replaced them with good players. We're doing things we didn't even think we were capable of."

Russell returns to action Sept. 7 at home against Clark County.



# Ferguson sets mark for goals

Russell star breaks record held by role model at Ashland

CANNONSBURG — As a freshman at Russell, Sheena Ferguson found a role model in senior All-State soccer player Sarah Lowman of Ashland.

"At the time, I was into cheerleading and track, too, and I didn't really know what I wanted to do," said Ferguson, now a senior. "Sarah's an amazing soccer player. I made up my mind I wanted to be like her."

The rest is history.

Thursday night, Ferguson broke Lowman's state record of 153 goals to become Kentucky's all-time scoring queen.

"Sarah gave me something to go after," Ferguson said after a four-goal night against Boyd County boosted her career total to 156. "I'm happy to have it behind me."

More importantly to Ferguson, Russell rolled to a 13-1 victory and wrapped up first place in the Boyd County Invitational.

"It wouldn't mean half as much if we did-

"t win," Ferguson said. "I'm nobody out there by myself. We play as a team and that's what counts."

State-ranked Russell improved to 11-2. The Red Devils continue to put big numbers on the scoreboard despite losing seven starters from a year ago.

"These girls really stepped up to the challenge," Ferguson said. "It's almost good to have people double-team me because we have a lot of good shooters. The team works from the back to the front. We don't rely on one person to do everything."

In Ferguson, however, Russell has a terrific finisher.

She wasted no time Thursday night, scoring on the game's opening possession. Ferguson took a nice angle pass and lobbed it over the goalkeeper's head to tie Lowman's state mark.

After Amelia Rayburn made it 2-0, Russell sophomore April Evans was fouled on the attacking end to give the Red Devils a penalty kick. Ferguson lined it up and then drilled a low, left-footed shot into the net for her historic goal.

"I chose a corner in my head and went for it," Ferguson said. "It was a great feeling. I've worked for this a long time. I saw Sarah play a couple of weeks ago at Transylvania. To be mentioned with her means so much."

The public address announcer acknowledged Ferguson's accomplishment to the applause of Russell's players and fans.

"I can't imagine a more-de-

serving individual than Sheena," said Russell coach Joe Grizzle. "She's an outstanding person and a 4.0 student. The pressure's been on her, but Sheena's real poised. As often as she's been double-teamed, it's amazing me can even get a shot off sometimes."

With 9:32 remaining in the half, Ferguson intercepted a goal kick and dribbled around two defenders to put in her third goal of the night. She sat out the last nine minutes of the opening period.

The Red Devils took turns scoring in the second half. Ferguson's final goal was a vintage shot. She turned away from a defender several yards outside the box, planted her right foot and sent a bullet into the net's upper left corner.

Ferguson, a tireless worker, now has 45 goals this season.

"The biggest thing about her is that the girls say that off the field, you wouldn't even know Sheena plays soccer," said her father, Russell assistant coach Mike Ferguson. "One quality I admire is that you never hear her brag."

Russell's big night also included a hat trick for Allison Kifer. Amelia Rayburn had two goals, while Ali Mitchell, Kala Faulkner, Annie Stephens and Sarah Hatcher also got into the scoring act.

Jennifer Smith contributed one of several assists for the Red Devils.

"Like I said earlier in the season, this team passes the ball better than any team I've ever had," Grizzle said. "Usually, our assists pretty much match our goals scored."

Monica Hay accounted for Boyd County's goal.

# Ferguson sets state scoring record in win over Boyd Co.

CANNONSBURG — Russell defeated Boyd County, 13-1, Thursday, Sept. 19, in a game in which Sheena Ferguson became the state's all time leading scorer.

The game was only 74 seconds old when Ferguson tied former Ashland player Sarah Lowman for career scoring with 153 goals. Allison Kifer assisted on the goal.

Ferguson took the record with a penalty kick at the 25:40 mark of the first half. She added two more goals for 156.

Kifer added a hat trick for the Lady Devils, which improved to 11-2 on the season.

The Boyd County defense shut down Russell's offense for over 20 minutes. When Amelia Rayburn scored with 22:50 gone, it ignited the Lady Devil offense. Jennifer Smith assisted on Rayburn's goal.

Ferguson scored her record less than three minutes later

and then extended her record with an unassisted goal at 27:19.

Kifer scored her first goal at 33:07 to complete the first half scoring.

Kifer opened the second half with two scores in the opening 90 seconds of the second half. She went high with her first goal of the half as it went off the goalie's fingertips.

Rayburn put a long corner kick to the far post where Kifer was waiting to put the ball in the net.

Ali Mitchell scored a minute later to push the lead to 8-0.

Rayburn scored her second goal with an assist from Ferguson at 50:21.

Kayla Faulkner scored an unassisted goal as the margin grew to 10-0.

Ferguson scored her fourth goal of the night with a bomb from about 35 yards out that sailed just under the cross bar.

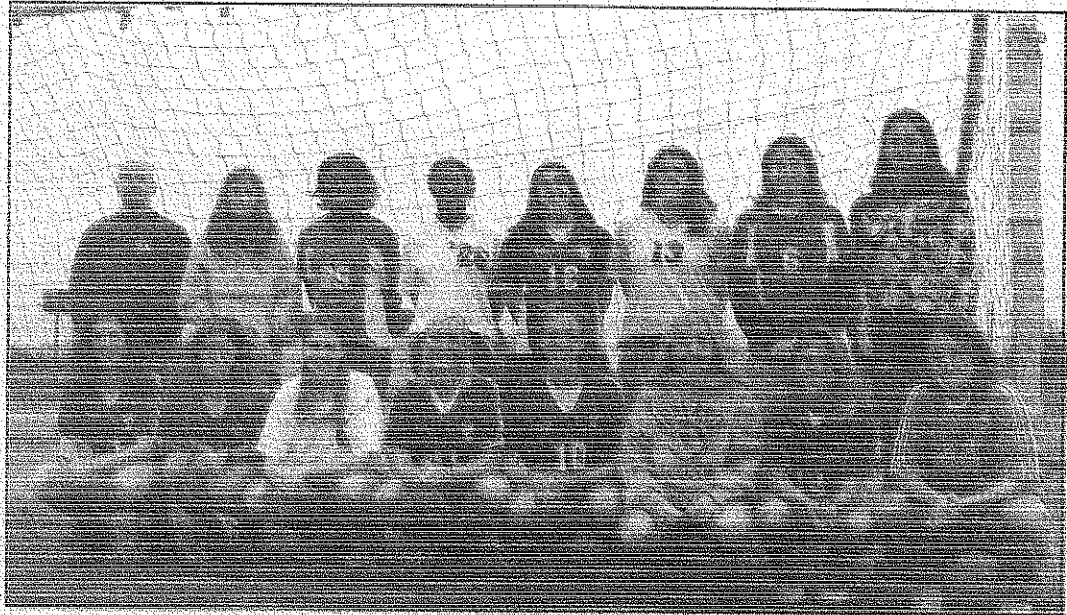
As Coach Grizzle went to his reserves, Annie Stephens scored at 56:02.

Boyd County's Monica Hay finally broke up the shutout.

With time running out, Sarah Hatcher got the ball in the midfield and then out ran two Boyd County defenders toward the goal. She beat the Boyd County goalie who came out to challenge her for the final score with 44 seconds left.

# Record-breaking Ferguson repeats as Player of Year

Russell's Sheena Ferguson accomplished practically everything a high school soccer player could imagine.

A relentless attacker, Ferguson shattered state scoring records of every kind, earned multiple All-State honors, took All-Star game MVP honors and led the Red Devils to district and regional championships.

Add one more achievement.

Ferguson is the first girls' soccer player to win three consecutive All-Area Player of the Year awards.

"This one means the most because it's my senior year," Ferguson said. "I've had so much fun.

I've really enjoyed high school soccer. I hate to see it go."

This season, Ferguson broke state records for goals in a game, season and career as the Red Devils captured their second regional title in three years.

After setting Kentucky's season mark with 56 goals as a junior, Ferguson blew it away with 78 in 2002. She also had 23 assists. Before the season, Ferguson told coach Joe Grizzle she was going to score 70 goals.

"When Sheena got 56 the year before, I thought that was fabulous," Grizzle said. "But I knew if anybody could do it, Sheena could. Seventy-eight is going to be hard for anybody to overtake."

overtake."

Ditto for Ferguson's career total of 189.

"Sheena's had a tremendous run," Grizzle said of the first team All-Stater. "I'd like to clone her. She's been so consistent. I couldn't ask for a better player or a better girl. I don't see anything else she could accomplish at the high-school level. Sheena will be an asset for whatever college she attends."

Grizzle, meanwhile, received his third consecutive All-Area Coach of the Year award after guiding the Red Devils to an 18-5 record and regional championship. Russell scored 173 goals this season, shattering the previous record of 122 set by Ballard.

"I'm only coach of the year because of the people around me," said Grizzle, whose coaching staff includes Mike Ferguson, Keith Davis and Gerry Lyons. "I've got the best group of assistants anybody could ask for, and you can't win districts and regionals without these good players."

Russell midfielders Allison Kifer, Amelia Rayburn and Kala Faulkner, along with stopper Ginny Grizzle, joined Ferguson on the All-Area squad in voting by area coaches.

Ashland and Rowan County each had four players picked.

Ashland forward Devon Reams and Rowan County players Emily Brown (stopper) and Loretta Iwu (midfielder) received first team All-State honors.

Reams collected 33 goals and 10 assists in leading Ashland to a 13-win season. This marks her third appearance on the All-Area team. Wrubel

is another repeater after scoring 21 goals as a senior. Senior forward Teresa Morris contributed 18 goals and eight assists, and junior midfielder Chisom Eze had eight goals.

Rowan County, 16-5 and district champion, was represented by Brown, Iwu, Twila Hall and Cassie Weigel.

Brown and Weigel were mainstays on a defense that posted 16 shutouts, the third-highest total in state history. Hall's 38 goals ranked second in the area behind only Ferguson, while Iwu's midfield play helped the Lady Vikings outscore opponents 78-11.

Other All-Area choices included Amy Crain of Boyd County, Sarah Queen of Rose Hill and Cayce Moore of Greenup County.

Crain, a sophomore striker, broke Boyd County's season scoring record with 23 goals.

Queen and Moore excelled for teams that finished below .500. Both seniors are previous All-Area selections.

## Russell's Ferguson going out in blaze of glory

Sheena Ferguson learned to shoot with either foot in the sixth grade, and there has been no stopping her on the soccer field since.

The Russell High School senior is the state record holder for career goals by a girl. She set the mark with four against Boyd County last Thursday.

"Everybody asks me about scoring goals, and I'm just as surprised as anybody to score that many," she said. "I think being able to shoot off both feet helps, because if somebody tries to stop me on a side, I can shoot off the other foot."

This season Ferguson has 45 goals, including a state-record 13 against West Carter last month. For her career, she has 156, eclipsing the mark of 153 Ashland Blazer's Sarah Lowman set from 1996-99.

The Red Devils (11-2) have outscored opponents 120-14 this season and are just two goals off the state record for most in one season with six regularseason games left.

"It's all amazing," Ferguson said. "It's my senior year, and everything is happening. It's my last chance to do anything. I really don't care about records, but I'm happy when I do succeed."

Russell coach Joe Grizzle said Ferguson, who had 14 goals in three wins during last week's Boyd County Tournament, simply is a player

who can finish shots.

"She's just always around the ball and in the right place," he said. "She has that field sense to know where she needs to be at all times."

Ferguson started playing soccer when she was 8.

"My dad is real into sports and helped me out a lot," she said. "I've just always practiced a lot. I guess having an athletic background has helped me out."

In the sixth grade the leftfooted Ferguson developed Osgood-Schlatter disease, one of the most common causes of knee pain in young athletes, in her left leg.

"It was so bad that I had to work with my right foot," she said. "Now, I shoot harder with my right foot and place better with my left."

Grizzle said it doesn't matter which foot she shoots with, Ferguson has been unstoppable. After scoring 17 goals as a freshman and 38 as a sophomore, she set a state-record with 56 last season.

"She's just always working hard to improve," Grizzle said. "She's one of those kids you wish that you had a half-dozen of. Her teammates know she's the person to go to."

But the coach is surprised by her numbers because other teams are marking her with several people.

"She's getting a double and triple-team every time out," he said.

Ferguson said the records are "an honor and something that reflect my work and everything," but she's more worried about the team winning. She's looking at Transylvania, Furman, Marshall, Kentucky and South Carolina.
