DAN HALEY

Dan Haley was born and raised in Pineville, Kentucky. He was a three-sport athlete at Pineville High School, participating in football, basketball, and track. He attended the University of Kentucky and participated in football under Coach Blanton Collier. He earned an AB degree in Education and a Masters in Teaching degree in Mathematics.

He held head football coaching positions at Bryan Station High School, Paducah Tilghman High School, and Bowling Green High School. There was also a year as Offensive Coordinator at Morehead State University, five years as head football coach at Cumberland College, and one year as tight ends coach at Western Kentucky University.

At the time of his retirement, he was the eighth winningest coach in Kentucky high school football history, and had been named Kentucky Coach of the Year in four different decades by the Lexington Herald-Leader, the Louisville Courier-Journal, the Associated Press, and the Kentucky High School Coaches Association.

His teams' playoffs achievements include the following:

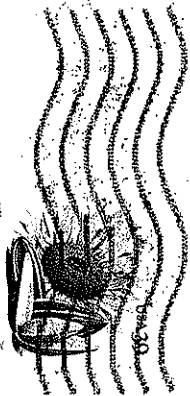
- 1969 - Bryan Station - AA State Runner-Up

- 1994 - Bowling Green - AAA State Runner-Up
- 1995 - Bowling Green - AAA State Champion

His overall record as a high school coach is 253-79-3 for twenty-seven years, including five undefeated untied regular seasons, fifteen district championships, and seven regional championships.
