

## KHSAA Hall of Fame Nomination for Coach Joe P. Hood

### Coaching Accomplishments/Honors:

- \*First football coach in KY history to win overall Courier-Journal Coach of the Year Award at two different schools (Butler, 1979; Warren Central, 1989; see page 9). The Courier-Journal statewide Coach of the Year Award was first awarded in 1944 marking the first time in the 45 year history of the award for the accomplishment (see page 9).
- \*At the time of his 2<sup>nd</sup> overall Courier-Journal Coach of the Year Award (1989) Hood was the first two-time winner of the award in 24 years (Fleming Thornton, 1965; see page 9).
- \*Head Coach of 1979 Class AAAA KY State Champions at Butler High School (see page 6)
- \*Head Coach of 1989 and 1990 Class AAAA State Runners-up at Warren Central High School (see page 14)
- \*Only coach in Kentucky history (any classification) to lead both a Jefferson County school and a school from outside of Jefferson County to a state final (see pages 12-14).

- \*One of only two coaches in KY history to lead a Jefferson County Public School to a Class AAAA State Championship (Bob Redman; see page 14). After Hood's Butler team won the 1979 AAAA State Final it would be 14 years before another Jefferson County Public School would win it again (Male, 1993; see page 14).
- \*One of only 9 coaches in KY history (any classification) to lead teams to a state final in three different decades (Joe Jagers, Ed Miracle, Sam Harp, Dan Haley, Tom Becherer, Mike Glaser, Garnis Martin, Bob Redman; see pages 12-14).
- \*Voted by peers as Head Coach of the Kentucky All-Star Football Team in 1992 (see page 27).
- \*Former President of the Kentucky High School Coaches Association (1997-98; see pages 10-11).
- \*Coached 1990 Kentucky Mr. Football, Damon Hood, at Warren Central High School (see page 27).
- \*Hood also held the position of Athletics Director while coaching at Warren Central High School.
- \*When the KHSAA mandated the coaching education requirement for all coaches in the mid-1990's Coach Hood was the course instructor for the Bowling Green area.

# Butler's the champ

## Kannapel's electrifying plays lead Bears to state title

His name is Dennis Kannapel, but just call him the Big Play Man.

He has been in that role for Butler High School's football team all season, and he was there again last night.

Playing before a crowd of 10,000 in Fairgrounds Stadium, Kannapel caught an electrifying 47-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Morris Manley to help Butler overcome Lexington Henry Clay 21-7 and win the

overall state Class 4-A championship.

The Manley-to-Kannapel bomb came with one minute and 43 seconds left in the third quarter and broke a 7-7 tie. Moments later, Kannapel intercepted a Henry Clay pass, paving the way to Butler's final touchdown with nine seconds left in the quarter.

The victory allowed Butler, coached by Tompkinsville native Joe

Hood, to finish as the state's only unbeaten team. Its 14-0 record gave the Shively school its second state football championship, its first coming in Class AAA in 1970.

Then, however, only Jefferson County schools were in AAA. Now the Jefferson County schools — as well as the largest (those with 1,000 or more students in the upper three grades) out in the state — are in 4-A.

"Henry Clay had some pretty aggressive players," Kannapel said after the game, "but we were flat

early — especially in the first quarter.

"After all those good teams we played, it took a lot out of us."

En route to the state title game, Butler had to dispose of defending state 4-A champion St. Xavier 16-0, Iroquois 14-7 and pre-season favorite Trinity 7-0. Iroquois and Trinity were not only unbeaten when Butler played them, but they each ranked No. 1 in The Courier-Journal's Litkenhous Ratings. Butler was ranked

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# UMW's Sam Church is a student of power

WASHINGTON — Jobs for teen-agers were not all that glamorous or plentiful in Appalachia, Va., in 1950. And so, when he was 14, Sam Church Jr., took a part-time job setting pins in the town's 10-lane bowling alley.

It was there that Church saw a very adult side of laboring life — a side he must confront again now that he is president of the 250,000-member United Workers of America.

The "lead pinsetter," Church recalled in an interview last week, "got 7 cents a game. The rest of us were getting a nickel. So we all struck and demanded 7 cents.

The guy who owned the place came

back behind the lanes. We told him we just wouldn't set any more pins."

"Finally, he said 'OK, you'll get your 7 cents.' And we did. But the next day he fired us all and found kids willing to work for a nickel a game."

The coal industry is a little more complex than a bowling alley, but it displays many of the same forces of profit, money and manpower.

At a slow but steady rate, the UMW and its 177,000 miners have lost their once all-powerful role as the indispensable foot soldiers of America's energy sector.

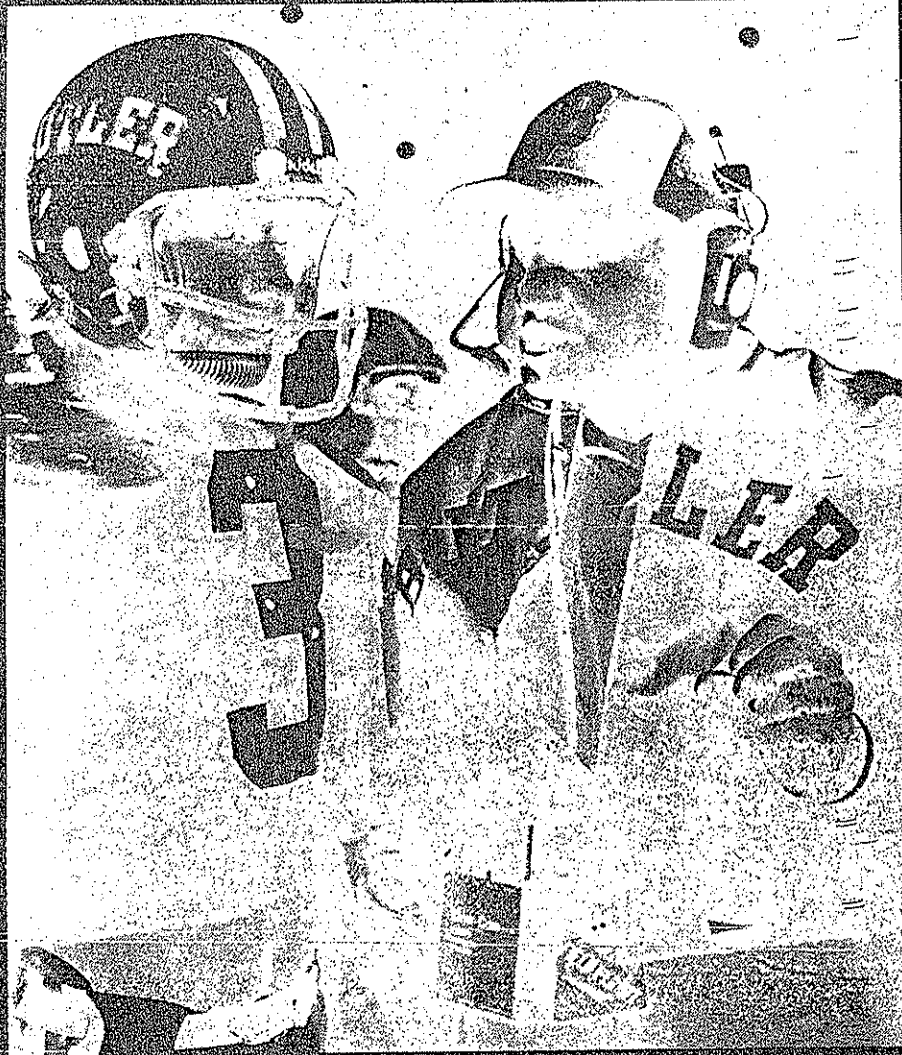

## Boston captures Mason-Dixon's

**RALEIGH, N.C.** — Alberto Salazar of the Greater Boston Track Club set a blazing pace of 4:09 in the first mile and then coasted to victory yesterday in the men's senior 10,000-meter race of the AAU National Cross Country Championships at North Carolina State University.

Salazar's Greater Boston club won the men's team competition with a total of 154.71 points.

The A squad of Louisville's Mason-Dixon Athletic Club, which won last year's meet in Seattle, finished fourth, its total of 160.84 points was less than a point behind the team runner-up, the sub-4 Track Club of California (160.07). The Oregon Track Club finished third with 160.44 points.

"Iaving won last year, it's a little hard to accept not winning," said Mason-Dixon coach Charlie Zippich. "But we were so close for second. Maybe one good run would have made a difference."

Western Kentucky University's Larry Cuzzort, a Mason-Dixon member who was scheduled to compete, failed to appear. A Veteran Mason-Dixon member, Nick Rose, reportedly was working in his native England.

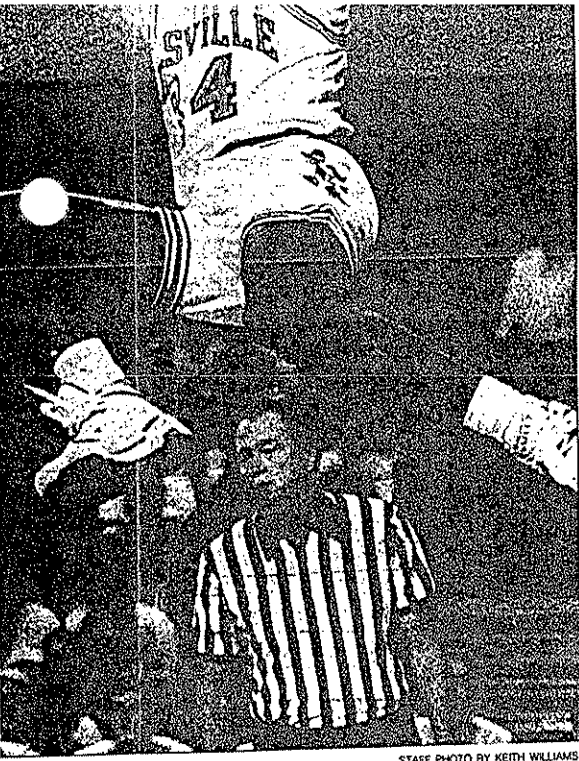

Myers, 27, was 7-4 with a 2.35 ERA and 24 saves, but he gave up five game-winning homers. In 1988 he was 7-3 with a 1.72 ERA and 28 saves. It will be three years before he can become a free agent.

The Reds also sent minor-league outfielder Don Brown to the Mets for pitcher Kip Gross, who was 4-4 with a 3.97 ERA at Tidewater of the International League.

**Warren Central's Hood wins Coach of Year in close vote**

In one of the closest races since The Courier-Journal established a statewide Coach of the Year award for high school football in 1944, Joe Hood of Warren Central has emerged as this year's winner.

Hood won in a photo finish. Only one vote kept him from falling into a five-way tie for first.

Hood, whose team lost to defending champion Trinity 28-14 in last Saturday's Class 4-A final and finished the year 13-2, got nine votes in balloting by the state's head coaches.

Tom Duffy of AAA titlist Fort Thomas Highlands, Sam Harp of AA champion Dan-

ville, Dennis Lampley of Trinity and Mike Lewis of East Hardin each got eight votes. "Why don't you make it a five-way tie?" Hood suggested after winning the award for the second time. "They're all deserving."

A total of 133 of the state's 202 head coaches participated in the voting, with 24 coaches getting at least one vote. After the four-way deadlock for second, there was an even bigger traffic jam for sixth place. Six coaches, including Dixie Jones of Class A runner-up Trigg County, got six votes.

The voting was completed before the four state championship games were played last weekend at Cardinal Stadium.

## Duran hopes rematch will bury talk of 'no mas'

Leonard, 33, has said, "I think I just frustrated him."

That is the generally accepted theory, Leonard, who had gone toe-to-toe with Duran at Montreal, used his speed and had Duran lunging and hunching in New Orleans. In the round before Duran quit, Leonard taunted and mocked the king of macho.

But it was a hollow victory for Leonard, whose pride has been fired by five world titles and his position as the premier fighter of the 1980s despite three retirements.

"I was never given credit for that," he said. "I beat him fair and square. He was the star. He got more play than I did. It was Duran's doing, not Ray's doing. That's what ticked me off."

"That (Duran's act) robbed me of my accomplishment."

There was no immediate rubber match because Leonard was afraid the publicity might view Duran's action as being calculated to set up a third fight.

Now that it's finally here, the rubber match — Leonard is the 2-1 favorite — is much bigger than it would have been had Leonard won a decision at New Orleans and if it had been held soon after that.

"If it wouldn't have been for that bizarre ending," Leonard said, "it wouldn't be this big."

The fight may rival the Leonard-Marvin Hagler bout as boxing's richest event ever. Promoters hope to gross more than \$70 million in ticket, television and ancillary sales, rivaling the \$76 million for the April 1987 Leonard-Hagler bout.

Leonard is guaranteed \$15 million and Duran \$7.5 million, but both have percentage deals. If the fight grosses \$70 million, Leonard likely would get another \$4.5 million and Duran another \$3 million.

Leonard has a 35-1-1 record, with 25 knockouts. Since beating Duran in 1980, he has fought only eight times, winning seven, six by knockouts, and getting a draw with Thomas Hearns in his last fight.

Duran has an 85-7 record, with 61 knockouts. Thirteen victories, four by knockouts, and five losses have come since the loss to Leonard.

Leonard's WBC super-middleweight title is at stake, but Duran's WBC middleweight title won't be.

Leonard has said he might not fight again after tonight, but there'll be no retirement announcement.

"Nobody would believe me anyway," he said.

"A lot of teams have much to be proud of this year," said Hood, who was Coach of the Year in 1979 after guiding Butler to a 14-0 record and the 4-A title.

Hood said he voted for Lamplsey, whose team completed a second straight 14-0 season and became the first team to repeat as 4-A champion since Trinity won in 1976 and 1977.

"Losing 41 seniors (as Trinity did) and winning back-to-back titles takes a lot of work and planning," Hood said. "They do an awfully good job over there."

Lamplsey has led Trinity to three 4-A titles since 1985, and Duffy has won three state crowns since 1984. His '84 Danville team won in AAA and his '87 Danville club grabbed the AA crown. In only his second year at Highlands, Duffy guided the Bluebirds to a 14-1 record and the school's first state title since 1982.

Duffy, whose team lost only to Paducah Tighman 25-24 in its second game, missed a perfect season by two points, but so did his successor at Danville, Harp. Danville went 13-1 in its second season under Harp, losing only to AAA power Bowling Green 8-7.

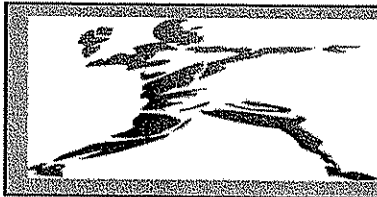

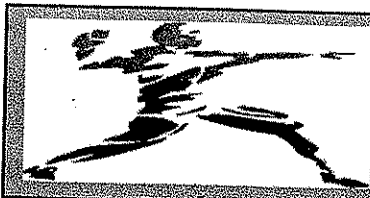


KHSAA Hall of Fame Committee:

I would like to second the nomination of former football coach Joe Hood to the Dawahares-KHSAA Hall of Fame. I believe Steve Stonebraker, head coach at Garrard County, has nominated Joe for this honor.

Joe was not only a successful football coach, but a real professional in everything he did while I knew him at Butler and Warren Central. Jefferson County had three outstanding teams in 1979 in Butler, Trinity and Iroquois, but Hood guided Butler to the state 4-A title.

He was voted The C-J's overall Coach of the Year that season and later won the award again in 1989 after guiding Warren Central to a runner-up place in the 4-A playoffs. His team finished second in '90, too.

His '79 team beat both perennial powers St. Xavier and Trinity in the playoffs, a feat not repeated until Clark County did it in 1991.

Joe was so highly respected by his peers that he was chosen head coach of the Kentucky All-Stars in 1992 and elected president of the Kentucky High School Coaches Association for the 1997-98 school year.

He also served Warren Central as athletic director and has had the school's football field renamed after him since his retirement after the 1998 season. That shows how much respect and love the people in Bowling Green had for him.

Joe's overall coaching record was 165-116, including 27-11 at Butler and 131-91 at Warren Central.

Butch, thanks for considering the nomination of Joe Hood for this prestigious honor. He is certainly deserving of it in my opinion.


As you have seen by looking through these materials Joe P. Hood was both a quality and well-respected educator in Kentucky. As a former player for Coach Hood while at Warren Central High School, I can tell you that he was someone who was revered by his players. Coach Hood always taught us the correct way to compete. We always played classy and with great sportsmanship and respect for our opponents. He taught us to face great challenges head on and never to create excuses for failures. I was fortunate enough to play for Coach Hood at a time when we were competing for state championships. We played some of the toughest schedules in state history as Coach Hood would not let us back down from anyone. During my four years as a player we played national powerhouses Evansville (Ind.) Memorial, Montgomery Bell Academy (Nashville), and opened our 1992 season against defending AP/ESPN National Champion Indianapolis Ben Davis.

In a historical context you must look at Coach Hood's achievements against those he competed against and those are already in the Hall of Fame or those who many think will be voted in 'easily.' 4-A Public Schools in Jefferson County have never had much success in terms of winning championships. When people think of public school football in Jefferson County Bob Redman is the first name to come to mind. I have heard numerous people make the comment that Redman will be a 'shoe-in' for the Dawahares/KHSAA Hall of Fame. If you look at Coach Hood's accomplishments on page 5 of this packet you will see that the only other public school coach who has accomplished anything similar to Redman is Coach Hood. When you couple that with the what he did at Warren Central in turning that program around you have a very legitimate candidate from the viewpoint of 'on field success.' As is also stated on page 5 Coach Hood is also one of only nine coaches in state history to coach in a state title game in three different decades. Of those other coaches Joe Jagers, Ed Miracle, and Garnis Martin are already in the Hall of Fame and Redman, Sam Harp, and Mike Glaser are considered by many to be shoe-ins for the Dawahares/KHSAA Hall of Fame.

Also, the fact that Coach Hood was the first coach in state history to win the Courier-Journal State Coach of the Year Award at two different schools should speak for itself. Also, he was the first repeat winner in almost a quarter of a century since Dawahares/KHSAA Hall of Fame member Fleming Thornton. I feel it would be disrespectful and unsportsmanlike to point out football coaches who have been elected to the Dawahares/KHSAA Hall of Fame and point out particular facts and state that Coach Hood deserves to be elected over some who have deservingly been voted in. However, I do think that I could make an argument that Coach Hood's accomplishments both on and off the field make him worthy of election into the Dawahares/KHSAA Hall of Fame based on previous selections. It is only prudent that Coach Hood gain his rightful place in the history of Kentucky High School sports next to those who have also accomplished great things and achieved them with class and dignity.

During my playing time at Warren Central the two schools who were our biggest rivals were Bowling Green and Shelby County. I have written recommendations from the coaches who competed against Coach Hood, at that time, in Dan Haley and Tom Becherer. Dawahares/KHSAA Hall of Fame member Bob White, who covered Coach Hood at Louisville Butler and at Warren Central also has provided his perspective on why Coach Hood should be elected. We lost two 4-A state title game to Louisville Trinity who was coached by Dawahares/KHSAA Hall of Fame member Dennis Lampley who sent his recommendation for Coach Hood to KHSAA SID Butch Cope. These views of Coach Hood come from those who were considered a nemesis and one who has a unique perspective as a writer and historian of Kentucky High School Football. Due to the overwhelming amount of information in his favor I vehemently promote Coach Joe P. Hood for selection into the prestigious Dawahares/KHSAA Hall of Fame.
