
This letter is written in support of **Mr. Alvis Johnson's** nomination to the Dawahares/KHSAA Hall of Fame.

Alvis Johnson

Biography

He began his coaching career in 1970 at Christian County High School in Hopkinsville, Kentucky. He served as the freshman football coach, assistant track coach and assistant wrestling coach. His 1st freshman football team went undefeated and unscored upon. In 1973, he moved to Harrodsburg, Kentucky where he continued his coaching career at Harrodsburg High School. It would be at the same school where he later finished his career after serving 25 years. For the first two years at Harrodsburg High School he served as Athletics Director, Assistant football coach and head men's and women's track coach. In 1975, he was chosen to become the head football coach along with continuing his other duties of Athletics Director and head men's and women's track coach. In 1980, he added to his responsibilities the task of Assistant Principal.

He continued in these capacities for the next 23 years, except for a two-year stint where he turned the track job over to an assistant. During his career, his track teams won five state championships, had two state runner-ups, 20 regional titles, six sectional titles, and 11 conference championships.

His football team won 194 games appearing in three state championship games. He won 7 regional titles, 12 district championships and was ranked 1st in the state of Kentucky numerous times by coaches and news media.

Under his tutelage over 40 athletes went on to receive scholarships to a Division 1A or 1AA school. In addition, they earned scholarship dollars totaling over 1.7 million dollars.

His track athletes won more than 50 individual state titles as well as garnering several All-American awards. His football athletes won numerous All-State honors to count as well as several All-American honors.

Coach Johnson was blessed to win many individual coaching honors as well. Eight times he was voted Kentucky's Track Coach of the year. Six times he was voted Conference Track Coach of the Year. In 1977, he was voted the Kellogg Corporation National Track Coach of the Year. He was again nominated for the National Track Coach of the Year in 1987 and 1992.

Coach Johnson was voted the Football Coach of the Year by the Associated Press in 1991 and 1996. In addition, he was voted Coach of the year by his fellow peers in 1994 and 1996.

1996 represented the first year in the history of Kentucky Football where a father and two sons were selected 1st team Associated Press and the Dad was selected as Coach of the Year.

For his work in Athletics Administration, Coach Johnson was awarded the HUFF Corporation Certificate of merit in 1982. In 1993, he was awarded the Kentucky Athletic

Director Distinguished Service Awards. In 1994, he received the National Football Hall of Fame Distinguished Service award for service to amateur football.

In 1979, he was elected to Who's Who in American Communities and again in 1997. In 1988, he was elected to the Kentucky High School Athletic Association Board of Control where he served until 1995. In 1991, he was elected president of the KHSSA Board of Control. In 1992, he was elected to serve on the National Federation of State High School Associations Board of Directors. In 1994, he was elected President of the National Federation Board of Directors. In 1996, he served on the NCAA Citizenship and sports alliance committee. In 1997, he served on the National Federation NCAA School Relations Committee.

Perhaps his crowning achievement in education was being selected as the runner-up for the Walt Disney National Teacher of the Year award program in 1996.

He has two children – Derrick Johnson and Dennis Johnson – and is married to Rosetta Cooke, his wife of 30 years.
