In 1965, Joan Johnston was teaching Health and Physical Education at Franklin County High School. She was approached by a parent about starting a golf program for girls and developing a competitive team. After deciding to accept this challenge, she soon learned the task would be formidable. Joan had only recently begun playing the game and knew very little about coaching golf. She also discovered the difficulty in getting willing participants, as a team needed a minimum of four (4) players to play in team events or matches. The 1st couple of years were a real struggle, but in 1967, two of her girls were individual qualifiers for the state tournament. Joan soon discovered the secret to a successful golf program was getting girls interested in the 4th, 5th, or 6th grades. Once the program was established, getting girls to participate was no longer a problem. In most years there were 12 to 18 girls playing and practicing the game, learning rules, and exhibiting proper etiquette on the golf course.

Over the years, the achievements grew as Joan learned and developed the coaching techniques necessary for success. Her teams won 12 regional titles, 2 state championships and had many top 5 finishes in the state tournament. There were also many individual awards with one (1) state champion as well as many medallist honors in regional tournaments and area or regional invitational tournaments. In 1997 the Franklin County Girls Golf Team had amassed a record of 127-0 in team matches with other schools. Shortly thereafter, she was selected as National Golf Coach of the Year by the National Federation of Coaches.

The most important achievements to Joan don't involve titles or personal awards. She is most proud of the many wonderful girls who played on her teams, their personal successes in life, and the lasting relationships and friendships which have endured.
