I have known St. Xavier High School tennis coach Joe Kroh for approximately 17 years. Having witnessed his performance as a Kentucky high school tennis coach during this time, I would like to nominate him for induction to the Dawahares/KHSAA Hall of Fame. I will be brief in this nomination letter because I can say with total confidence that his credentials for this honor are <u>absolutely overwhelming</u>.

Joe has coached for 27 years compiling an astounding 409-46 record in dual matches. This record is against many of the top high school tennis programs in the eastern half of the United States. His teams have won an unprecedented 16 state titles and have finished runner-up 8 times. Coach Kroh has twice been named the National High School Tennis Coach of the Year by the National Federation of Interscholastic Coaches Association. He has developed numerous college and professional tennis players, and several of his former players have themselves been inspired to go on to become tennis coaches and teaching professionals.

Every year his program is looked to as **the** model of what every tennis coach in Kentucky would like their program to rise to and be. A team coached by Joe is easy to spot. They are a direct reflection of Joe himself. They are always among the most skilled but are often a cut above the rest. They are not only skilled but also disciplined, focused, and quite frankly work harder than almost every opponent they face. Make no mistake, they certainly carry themselves with an air of total confidence, however they never display an attitude of arrogance or treat weaker opponents in a condescending manner. They simply exude class and closely adhere to the tennis code of conduct.

Coach Kroh is a brilliant teacher of the game, a great tactician, and has also proven to be very skilled in delegation of duties to his assistants. What first impressed me with Coach Kroh was his willingness to take on any team, great or small, no matter what was at stake. He regularly schedules matches against the strongest competition he can find, sometimes traveling hundreds of miles or hosting teams from neighboring states or even farther. Amazingly though, he somehow also finds a way to schedule lesser programs giving these teams a shot at the premier team in Kentucky.

Coach Kroh also faithfully and skillfully served the KHSAA by managing the boy's state tournament for approximately 20 years, a regional tournament for more than 25 years, and he also serves on the tennis advisory committee. I believe that he is the single most knowledgeable source of information in the realm of high school tennis in the Commonwealth of Kentucky. Our Hall of Fame would be honored should Joe Kroh become a member.

Joseph Kroh's association with St. Xavier High School athletics has crossed a half-century. He came to St. X as a basketball player in 1957 and played on the freshman team's City Championship squad, but was encouraged by Hall of Fame football and track coach John Meihaus to come out for track. Kroh twice ran under the school record for the mile and became the first Kentucky prep runner to break 10:00 for two miles at an AAU event in 1961. He led St. X to its first two KHSAA team state championships in cross-country in 1959 and 1960 and had three individual top five finishes, winning the individual title in 1959 and setting a new state record. Receiving a full athletic scholarship to Seton Hall University, he ran on three conference winning cross-country teams and one track team and ran in four national championships in crosscountry, including three IC4As and the National AAU Championships. Kroh returned to St. X in 1967 to coach track and cross-country and was a coach on the 1974 St. X staff when the school won the state championship in track. He turned to tennis in 1975, becaming St. X's head tennis coach. In a thirty-two year career, he guided the Tigers to 17 KHSAA state tennis team titles and 10 runners-up finishes, 27 consecutive regional championships (a KHSAA record for any sport) and a record of 441-52, including 10 undefeated seasons. From 1997-2007, St. X was undefeated head to head against any Kentucky team. His teams set new records for most state and regional championships, most points scored in the state tournament and largest winning margin. Kroh served as KHSAA State Tennis Tournament manager for 20 years and as a member of the KHSAA tennis committee for more than 30 years. He retired as head coach in 2007, remaining at St. X as an assistant coach, member of the state tennis committee and codirector of Tiger Tennis Training, a summer development program for Louisville area junior players.
