Carole Shepherd Liedtke 2006 KHSAA Hall of Fame

Carole was a successful gymnast at Pleasure Ridge Park in Louisville starting in 1960. With no other Ky. Schools the team traveled as far as Michigan and Canada and she still won many trophies and medals. The team was begun by the P.E. teachers Nick Wiese (an ex-gymnast), Pat Caswell and Margie Stafford making homemade equipment. Her senior year she won the Jefferson County High School Competition which included two schools. Carole also swam competitively at a local club and was the first local high school girl to enter the Mason Dixon Track Games, being an alternate. She competed in Physical Fitness meets and the Kentucky High School Track Meet, winning the standing broad jump. Since age 3 she had been a dancer and acrobat, performing with a USO type troupe all over the country and on bases in the Carabean and Cuba. She continued to compete in gymnastics representing Turners, YMCA, Louisville Gymnastic Club and then the University of Louisville placing in many regional and national meets until 1970. In 1968 she began teaching as a high school Health and P.E. teacher and coaching track and gymnastics at Doss High School in Louisville. Then moving to Moore High School in Louisville she coached a successful gymnastic team, winning state in 1972, 73, and 74. She then went on to coach gymnastics at the University of Louisville where the team won State 76-82, Regionals 76-81, and went to the AIAW Nationals 76-81 with a highest placement of 8th. For these accomplishments she was named to the U. of L. Athletic Hall of Fame in 1988. Carole has also judged gymnastics since 1965 and has a FIG Brevet rating, having judged in many international and national competitions, was an official at the Atlanta 1996 Olympics, and continues to mentor at clinics, doing critiques for many clubs and still judges. She volunteers as the Regional Gymnastic Judging Director for five states, and at many functions for the Oldham County YMCA. During all her busy activities she raised three children Tiffany, a teacher, Eric a banker, and Travis, currently a student getting his Business Degree. She followed all three in competitive sports in their high school and college careers as well as her husband Joseph (married in 1967) while he played basketball at the University of Louisville, coached and refereed. Carole enjoys traveling, reading, doing crafts, ballroom dancing and playing golf. "Thank you so much to my family for their support while I was away and spending time teaching, coaching and judging. I hope I have been a positive influence on the many people I have contacted in sports."

James Mabe was first and Chris Evola second in all-around performance for Pleasure Ridge Park's winning boys' team, which also included Terry Harvey.

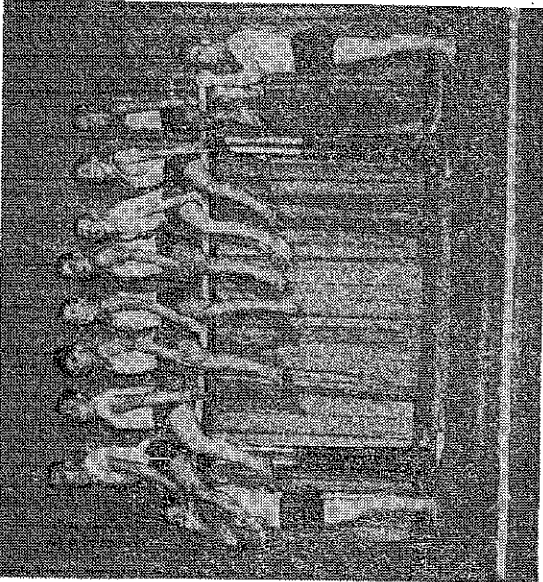
The gymnastics meet is planned as an annual affair involving elementary school and junior and senior high competitors.

PRP Has Kentucky's Only High School Gymnastic Teams



Clarksville, Ind., Turners Are Rivals; Equipment Needed

P.R.P.'s gymnastic team is one of only two in the entire state of Kentucky, the other being Turners which is not a high school team.

Originating January of 1958 with the arrival of Mr. Nicholas Wiese, the boys' gymnastic team, composed of ten boys, started with a high bar and a few mats as their only equipment.

In their second year of competition with Turners and Clarksville High School, the team won five ribbons and added the rings and parallel bars to their equipment.

In competition with the more experienced Clarksville team, hard-working members of the P.R.P. group placed first two different times.

With radical improvement, the boys moved on into the term 1960-61, their third year, winning eight times as many ribbons as were won in the past year's competition.

To go along with their rapid growth and experience, the team needs an increasing amount of equipment, which includes a side horse, trampoline, and six mats.

Despite inadequate equipment, Mr. Wiese has developed a team to match Clarksville and Turners in the Junior division.

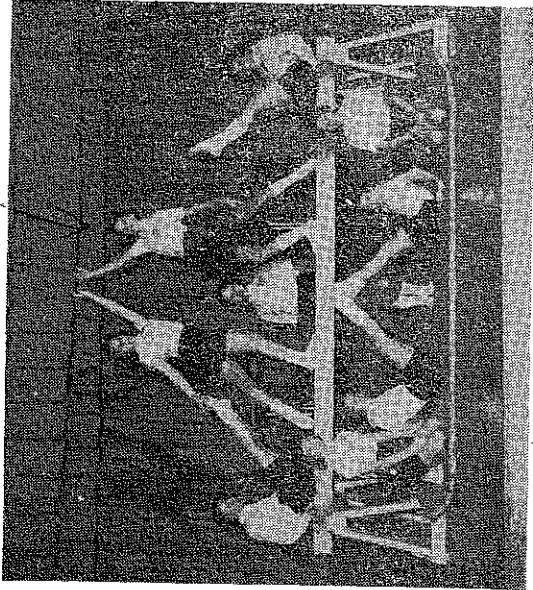
Walter Seward, captain of the gymnastic team at Pleasure Ridge Park, has placed first and second as an all-around gymnast, which is an especially great honor.

To illustrate the team's progress this year, at each of the four meets their awards were doubled. At their first meet they received two awards. At the second meet four awards were presented to them. Then they progressed on to win seventeen awards at the fourth meet.

Girls

The Girl's Athletic Association has added the Gymnastic branch to their organization this year.

Coached by Miss Margie Stafford and Miss Pat Caswell, the girls have done extremely well. Winning eleven ribbons in their first meet, they doubled this by achieving twenty-two ribbons. P.R.P.'s girl's gymnastic team, exclusive in Kentucky, occupied first place in all-around for both girl's divisions, which is quite an

In the boys' senior division Wayne Woodard took 1st place in all-around competition. Also placing in the all-around were Carl Minion, 4th place, and Walter Seward, 5th place. All-around competition for boys includes performances on the high bar, parallel bars and the rings. In all, the boys captured 21 ribbons.

Pleasure Ridge's Carol Shepp-berg led the girls in the senior division by capturing 1st place in the all-around competition. Angie Murray came in 4th and Kathy Kavich 6th in the all-around. Girls competed on the balance beam, uneven parallel bars, and in vaulting and free exercise. The girls also took 21 ribbons for the entire meet.

The boys are coached by Mr. Wiese; the girls, by Miss Stafford and Miss Caswell.
