



Marvin Meredith

A graduate of Catlettsburg High School, Marvin Meredith's accolades include earning All-State honors in football, setting a school scoring record in basketball and capturing the state championship in the 100-yard dash in track. In addition, he competed on the baseball diamond during his prep career. Meredith began his head coaching career at Russell High School in 1955. During a career spanning 32 years, Meredith compiled a 677-205 career coaching record. His teams won 20-plus games 23 times and advanced to the regional championship seven times, including three Sweet 16® State Basketball Tournament appearances. In their third trip to the State Tournament under Meredith, the Red Devils advanced to the quarterfinals in 1972. Meredith coached the Kentucky All-Stars in their annual battle with Indiana in 1987. He also coached track 15 years and golf 18 years at Russell, during which time his track teams won eight conference championships, including a 126-22 record. On the links, Meredith's teams advanced to the State Tournament 13 times, compiling a 520-84 record.
