BIO  
DON MORRIS

Don Morris began his teaching and coaching career after graduation from Western Kentucky University in 1960. He became the head coach of the Breckinridge County High School basketball team in 1961 after serving as an assistant for one year. While coaching at Breckinridge County the teams captured the 13<sup>th</sup> District Championship in 1963, 1964 and 1965. They were the winners of the 4<sup>th</sup> Regional Finals in 1964 and 1965. During the 1964 season, Coach Morris's Breckinridge County team became the KHSAA Tournament Runner-up team and then became the Champions in 1965.

During the period of 1961-68 his coaching record was 151 wins versus 52 losses for a 74.38% win rate. While serving as Head Coach at East Hardin he had a 154-116 record and won the 17<sup>th</sup> District Championship in 1971. His combined won-loss record was 305 wins and 168 losses for 64.4%. He finished his coaching career establishing a new basketball program at Central Hardin.

Coach Morris was selected as assistant coach for the annual Kentucky-Indiana All-Star Teams for two years in 1965 and 1966 and head coach in 1967. He coached the West team for the Kentucky East-West All-Star Teams in 1965. Morris served as the president of the Kentucky High School Coaches Association in 1968-69.

Morris shared his knowledge of basketball by participating as a speaker for coaching clinics and banquets throughout Kentucky including the Clinic of Champions in Kansas City, Kansas. He served on a panel of coaches which included John Wooden of UCLA. Morris is author of the book, "Kentucky High School Basketball." He wrote articles for the "Coaching Clinic" as well as other coaching magazines. He contributed drills for the book, "Coaching Clinic." Some of the awards received include: Outstanding Young Man of America (1965), Coach of the Year by Sunday Courier & Press, Evansville, Indiana (1965), Coach of the Year by News Enterprise, Elizabethtown, KY (1978), Breckinridge County Athletic Hall of Fame (1978). His most recent award was the 2003 Coaches Court of Honor given by the Kentucky Association of Basketball Coaches.

As an educator Morris served as a teacher, department chairperson, athletic director, and in school administrator as an assistant principal. During his career, he also coached track and baseball winning the 13<sup>th</sup> District Baseball Tournament. At the time of his induction, he continues to coach an Upward Basketball team which consists of boys 8 and 9 years of age.

He and his wife, Laura Jane, have one child, Steve, and two grandchildren, Gavin and Savannah.
